

STATE POLICE SCHOOL, USE BY LOCAL POLICE
Act of Jul. 18, 1935, P.L. 1314, No. 411 ½
AN ACT

Authorizing the utilization of the Pennsylvania State Police Academy for training persons to act as policemen in the political subdivisions of the Commonwealth; prescribing the qualifications for admission of such persons to such school; providing for the payment of certain costs by such students; conferring certain powers upon the Pennsylvania State Police; and making an appropriation. (Title amended June 29, 1959, P.L.487, No.112)

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That the Pennsylvania State Police shall have the power, and its duty shall be, to conduct at the Pennsylvania State Police Academy courses of instruction for the proper training of persons to act as policemen for the several political subdivisions of this Commonwealth. Subject to the provisions of this act, the Commissioner of Pennsylvania State Police is hereby authorized to establish standards of proficiency, training and discipline for persons attending such school, and to issue certificates of qualification to graduates of the various courses of instruction. The Commissioner, with the approval of the Governor, shall employ such instructors and other employes as may be necessary for the purposes of this act.

Section 4. The sum of twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000), or as much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the Pennsylvania State Police for the two fiscal years beginning June first, one thousand nine hundred thirty-five, for payment of the salaries, wages or other compensation of such instructors or other employes as may be necessary for the proper conduct of the work of the Pennsylvania State Police under the provisions of this act.

Section 5. This act shall become effective on the first day of June, one thousand nine hundred thirty-five.
