AN ACT

Authorizing the recording and copying of documents, plats,
papers, and instruments of writing by photostatic,
photographic or other mechanical process; and relating to the
effect and use of such copies and records.

Section 1. Be it enacted, &c., That whenever any officer or
employe of the Commonwealth or of any county, city, borough,
town, township, school or poor district is required or
authorized by law, or otherwise, to record or copy any document,
plat, paper or instrument of writing, he may do such recording
or copying by any photostatic, photographic or other mechanical
process which produces a clear, accurate, and permanent copy or
reproduction of the original document, plat, paper or instrument
of writing.

Section 2. Copies and records thus produced shall have the
same effect, and be admissible in evidence in like manner and
under the same conditions as copies and records produced in
accordance with the law in effect immediately prior to the
passage of this act.

Section 3. This act shall become effective immediately upon
final enactment.
