

AUTHORIZING CITIES TO ENACT ANTI-SMOKING ORDINANCES

AN ACT

Authorizing cities to enact ordinances prohibiting smoking or the carrying of lighted cigarettes, cigars, pipes or matches or using matches or other fire producing devices in certain retail stores within such cities and to provide penalties therefor.

Compiler's Note: Section 4701 of Act 164 of 1951 provided that Act 63 is repealed insofar as it relates to third class cities.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. City councils in cities of the first, second or third class are hereby authorized and empowered to enact ordinances prohibiting the smoking or carrying of lighted cigarettes, cigars, pipes or matches, and the use of matches or fire producing devices in retail stores arranged to accommodate three hundred persons or more, or which employ twenty-five or more employes: Provided, That any such ordinance, passed under the provisions of this act, shall not prohibit smoking in any restaurant room, rest room, beauty parlor, executive office or any room designated for smoking in such store.

Such ordinances may also provide penalties for violation thereof.
