## PRESCRIBING WHO MAY ADMINISTER OATH OF OFFICE TO GOVERNOR AND LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR

Act of Jan. 14, (1952) 1951, P.L. 2078, No. 582

Prescribing the persons who may administer the oath of office to the Governor and the Lieutenant-Governor.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. When the Governor elect and the Lieutenant-Governor elect are to be sworn into office, the oath or affirmation required by the Constitution shall be administered to each by one of the justices of the Supreme Court, or by a judge of a court of record learned in the law, or by any person authorized to administer oaths.

Section 2. The following parts of acts are hereby repealed to the extent hereinafter specified:

- (1) Section three of the act, approved the nineteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred four (Pamphlet Laws 330), entitled "An act to regulate the administering of certain oaths," absolutely.
- (2) Section two of the act, approved the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred seventy-four (Pamphlet Laws 48, No.7), entitled "An act providing for the election of lieutenant governor and fixing his salary," in so far as it provides for the administration of the oath of office to the Lieutenant-Governor elect.

All acts and parts of acts are hereby repealed in so far as they are inconsistent with the provisions of this act.
