A SUPPLEMENT

To the act of July 11, 1983 (P.L.422, No.2A), entitled "An act providing for the capital budget for the fiscal year 1983-1984," itemizing public improvement projects, furniture and equipment projects, redevelopment assistance projects and transportation assistance projects to be constructed or acquired or assisted by the Department of General Services, the Department of Transportation, the Department of Community Affairs or the Pennsylvania Fish Commission, together with their estimated financial cost; authorizing the incurring of debt without the approval of the electors for the purpose of financing the projects to be constructed or acquired or assisted by the Department of General Services, the Department of Transportation or the Department of Community Affairs; stating the estimated useful life of the projects; authorizing issuing officials to undertake limited temporary borrowing through negotiated settlements; and making an appropriation.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Total authorizations.

- (a) The total authorization for the additional capital projects in the category of public improvement projects itemized in section 2 and to be acquired or constructed by the Department of General Services, its successors or assigns, and to be financed by the incurring of debt, shall be \$633,121,000.
- (b) The total authorization for the additional capital projects in the category of public improvement projects consisting of the acquisition of original movable furniture and equipment to complete public improvement projects itemized in section 3 and to be purchased by the Department of General Services, its successors or assigns, and to be financed by the incurring of debt, shall be \$15,587,000.
- (c) The total authorization for the capital project in the category of redevelopment assistance projects itemized in section 4 for capital grants by the Department of Community Affairs, its successors or assigns, and to be financed by the incurring of debt, shall be \$44,165,000.
- (d) The total authorization for the additional capital projects in the category of transportation assistance projects itemized in section 5 with respect to which an interest is to be acquired in or constructed by the Department of Transportation, its successors or assigns, and to be financed by the incurring of debt, shall be \$11,408,000.
- (e) The total authorization for the additional capital projects in the category of public improvement projects itemized in section 6 and to be acquired or constructed by the Pennsylvania Fish Commission, its successors or assigns and to be financed from the current revenues of the Fish Fund pursuant to executive authorization, shall be \$2,498,000.

Section 7. Heating systems.

- (a) Any heating system or heating unit installed as part of any of the public improvement projects itemized in section 2 shall be fueled by coal.
- (b) Any heating system or heating unit shall be exempt from the requirement of subsection (a) if the Department of General Services determines that the application of subsection (a) to that heating system or heating unit would violate existing or reasonably anticipated environmental laws or regulations or would not be cost effective. The Department of General Services shall report to the House and Senate Appropriations Committees the basis for any determination that a heating system or heating unit shall be exempt from the requirement of subsection (a).
- (c) This section shall not apply to the public improvement projects itemized in section 2 for cogeneration facilities at Indiana University of Pennsylvania and for the installation of an oil-fired boiler at the Main Campus of Pennsylvania State University and the boiler's conversion to operate on a mixture of coal and water. This section also shall not apply to any other public improvement project itemized in section 2 if the fuel to be used in that project is specified in section 2.
- (d) For the purposes of this section, "coal" includes coal, a synthetic derived in whole or in part from coal, or a mixture which includes coal or is derived in whole or in part from coal. Section 8. Transfer of prior authorization.
- (a) In addition to the amount authorized in section 2(2) (xi), an additional \$5,500,000 previously authorized for land acquisitions is also transferred to the construction authorization contained in section 2(2) (xi).

Section 9. Debt authorizations.

- (a) The Governor, Auditor General and State Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to borrow, from time to time, in addition to any authorization heretofore or hereafter enacted, on the credit of the Commonwealth, subject to the limitations provided in the current capital budget, money not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of \$632,521,000 as may be found necessary to carry out the acquisition and construction of the public improvement projects specifically itemized in a capital budget.
- The Governor, Auditor General and State Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to borrow, from time to time, in addition to any authorization heretofore or hereafter enacted, on the credit of the Commonwealth, subject to the limitations provided in the current capital budget, money not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of \$15,587,000 as may be found necessary to carry out the public improvement projects consisting of the acquisition of original movable furniture and equipment specifically itemized in a capital budget.
- The Governor, Auditor General and State Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to borrow, from time to time, in addition to any authorization heretofore or hereafter enacted, on the credit of the Commonwealth, subject to the limitations provided in the current capital budget, money not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of \$44,165,000 as may be found necessary to carry out the redevelopment assistance projects specifically itemized in a capital budget.
- (d) The Governor, Auditor General and State Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to borrow, from time to time, in addition to any authorization heretofore or hereafter enacted, on the credit of the Commonwealth, subject to the limitations provided in the current capital budget, money not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of \$11,408,000 as may be found necessary to carry out the acquisition and construction of the transportation assistance projects specifically itemized in a capital budget.

Section 10. Issue of bonds.

The indebtedness herein authorized shall be incurred from time to time and shall be evidenced by one or more series of general obligation bonds of the Commonwealth in such aggregate principal amount for each series as the Governor, Auditor General and State Treasurer shall determine, but the latest stated maturity date shall not exceed the estimated useful life of the projects being financed as stated in section 11. Section 11. Estimated useful life of projects.

The General Assembly states that the estimated useful life of the public improvement projects heretofore itemized is as follows:

Section 12. Appropriations.

- (a) The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations herein authorized are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of General Services in the maximum amount of \$632,521,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the public improvement projects specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expenses of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of General Services the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.
- (b) The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations herein authorized are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of General Services in the maximum amount of \$15,587,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the public improvement projects consisting of the acquisition of original movable furniture and equipment specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expenses of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of General Services the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.
- (c) The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations herein authorized are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of Community Affairs in the maximum amount of \$44,165,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the redevelopment assistance projects specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expenses of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of Community Affairs the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.
- (d) The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations herein authorized are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation in the maximum amount of \$11,408,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial costs of transportation assistance projects specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expenses of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay out to the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.

Section 13. Federal funds.

Notwithstanding any provision of this act or of the act of July 20, 1968 (P.L.550, No.217), known as the Capital Facilities Debt Enabling Act, issuing officials shall have the authority, under this act and any other capital budget act, to issue bonds or notes upon public or private sale or upon invitation at such prices and interest rates as the issuing authorities may in their discretion determine for a period or maturity not to exceed three months, in an amount not to exceed \$15,000,000. For issuance of these bonds or notes, the issuing officials do not have to comply with the provisions of section 9 of the

Capital Facilities Debt Enabling Act. The authority granted in this section shall expire four months from the effective date of the act providing for the capital budget for the fiscal year 1984-1985.

Section 15. Repeals.

Clause (8) of part VIII of section 2 of the act of August 14, 1963 (P.L.1032, No.451), entitled "An act amending the act of March 31, 1949 (P.L.372, No.34), entitled 'An act to promote the welfare of the people of the Commonwealth; creating The General State Authority as a body corporate and politic with power to construct, improve, equip, furnish, and operate projects, and to lease the same, and to fix fees, rentals, and charges for the use thereof; authorizing and regulating the issuance of bonds for said Authority, and providing for the payment of such bonds, and the rights of the holders thereof; and to enter into agreements with the Government of the United States or any Federal agency; and authorizing the Department of Property and Supplies to grant, assign, convey, or lease to the Authority lands of the Commonwealth and interests therein and to acquire lands therefor; granting the right of eminent domain; empowering The General State Authority to sell and convey projects and property to the Commonwealth; and providing that no debt of the Commonwealth shall be incurred in the exercise of any of the powers granted by this act,' increasing the powers and the borrowing capacity of the Authority, allocating the proceeds of such borrowing capacity, and regulating the leasing of projects constructed for State aided institutions," is hereby repealed. Any funds expended or encumbered under the authorization contained in the act of August 14, 1963, shall be transferred to the authorization in section 2(6)(B).

Project (49) of subdivision IX of clause A of section 2 of the act of November 27, 1970 (P.L.773, No.256), known as the Capital Budget Act for Fiscal Year 1969-1970, Public Improvement Project Itemization Supplement-General State Authority, is repealed.

Subproject (2) of project (k) of subclause III of clause B of section 1 of the act of December 18, 1980 (P.L.1252, No.228), entitled "A supplement to the act of October 6, 1980 (P.L.784, No.145), entitled 'An act providing for the capital budget for the fiscal year 1980-1981, itemizing public improvement and furniture and equipment projects, to be constructed by the Department of General Services and transportation assistance projects to be acquired or constructed by the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation together with their estimated financial cost; authorizing the incurring of debt without the approval of the electors for the purpose of financing the projects to be constructed by the Department of General Services or Department of Transportation, stating the estimated useful life of the projects; providing for the adoption of capital projects to be financed from current revenues of the Boating Fund and the Fish Fund and making an appropriation," is repealed.

Section 1.B.II(a)(1) and (2) of the act of December 6, 1982 (P.L.771, No.222), entitled "A supplement to the act of July 1, 1981 (P.L.142, No.47), entitled 'An act providing for the capital budget for the fiscal year 1981-1982,' itemizing public improvement and furniture and equipment projects to be constructed or acquired by the Department of General Services together with their estimated financial cost, authorizing the incurring of debt without the approval of the electors for the purpose of financing the projects to be constructed or acquired

by the Department of General Services, stating the estimated useful life of the projects, repealing projects and making appropriations," are repealed.

Section 204(1)(ii) and (vi)(B) of the act of July 28, 1983 (P.L.141, No.38), entitled "An act providing for the adoption of capital projects to be financed from current revenues of the Game Fund; itemizing transportation assistance projects and highway projects to be acquired or constructed by the Department of Transportation together with its estimated financial cost; authorizing the incurring of debt without the approval of the electors for the purpose of financing the projects; stating the estimated useful life of the projects; itemizing a public improvement project to be constructed with its estimated financial cost and stating the estimated useful life of the project; and making appropriations," are repealed. Section 16. Effective date.

This act shall take effect immediately.

VETOES

1984, MAY 18, P.L.263, NO.62

Act 62 was approved May 18, 1984, except as to the following: Section 12. Appropriations.

(a) The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations herein authorized are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of General Services in the maximum amount of \$632,521,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the public improvement projects specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expenses of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of General Services the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.

I approve this item in the amount of \$310,907,000.

(b) The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations herein authorized are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of General Services in the maximum amount of \$15,587,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the public improvement projects consisting of the acquisition of original movable furniture and equipment specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expenses of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of General Services the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.

I approve this item in the amount of \$10,356,000.

(c) The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations herein authorized are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of Community Affairs in the maximum amount of \$44,165,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the redevelopment assistance projects specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expenses of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of Community Affairs the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.

I approve this item in the amount of \$43,900,000.

I withhold my approval from the remainder of said appropriations and debt authorizations for the following reasons:

- (1) Certain projects cannot be undertaken by the Commonwealth under provisions of the Capital Facilities Debt Enabling Act. These projects do not fall within the definitions of the various categories of capital projects contained therein. Some of these are worthy projects which are being funded through other mechanisms.
- (2) Certain projects contained in the bill are maintenance or repair in nature. These projects are to preserve or restore existing assets rather than make an improvement or betterment, and as such cannot be bond funded.
- (3) Certain projects contained in the bill have been authorized in previous capital acts so funding is already available for these projects.
- (4) Certain projects are not of a sufficiently high priority to warrant the further indebtedness needed for their funding if we are to operate in a fiscally responsible manner. The unrestrained increase in the amount of bond funded authorizations could have a negative impact on the Commonwealth's bond rating thereby causing an increase in interest costs to the Commonwealth or limiting the availability of bond funds for high priority projects.
