

DAY OF THE DISABLED - DESIGNATION
Act of May 26, 1988, P.L. 413, No. 71
AN ACT

Designating January 30, Franklin Delano Roosevelt's birthday, as
"Pennsylvanians with Disabilities Day." (Title amended June
2, 1993, P.L.44, No.14)

WHEREAS, Over 1,000,000 citizens of this Commonwealth are
considered to be individuals with physical disabilities; and

WHEREAS, Through courage and determination, Pennsylvanians
with disabilities have conquered seemingly insurmountable
obstacles to lead successful lives; and

WHEREAS, Pennsylvanians with disabilities demonstrate unique
character and perseverance in pursuing and attaining their
desired goals; and

WHEREAS, These individuals have made noteworthy contributions
to their communities, this Commonwealth and the nation; and

WHEREAS, Pennsylvanians with disabilities deserve the
recognition of this Commonwealth and its citizens.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Pennsylvanians with Disabilities Day.

In honor of the birthday of one of America's most
distinguished individuals with a physical disability, Franklin
Delano Roosevelt, January 30 of each year is hereby designated
as "Pennsylvanians with Disabilities Day," in recognition and in
honor of the citizens of Pennsylvania who have disabilities.

Section 2. Effective date.
