## PENNSYLVANIA FISH AND BOAT COMMISSION CAPITAL BUDGET ACT FOR 2002-2003

Act of Dec. 9, 2002, P.L. 1599, No. 208 Cl. 86
AN ACT

Providing for the adoption of capital projects to be financed from the incurring of debt or from current revenue of the Fish Fund and the Boat Fund; and making a repeal.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Short title.

This act shall be known and may be cited as the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission Capital Budget Act for 2002-2003. Section 2. Total authorization.

The total authorization for the capital projects in the category of public improvement projects itemized in section 3 to be acquired or developed by the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission and to be financed by the incurring of debt or from current revenues of the Fish Fund and the Boat Fund pursuant to executive authorization shall be \$54,460,000.

Section 3. Itemization of Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission capital projects.

The individual capital projects in the category of public improvement projects to be acquired or developed by the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission and to be financed by the incurring of debt or by the current revenues of the Fish Fund and the Boat Fund pursuant to the executive authorizations are hereby itemized together with their respective estimated costs, as follows:

Section 4. Debt authorization.

The Governor, Auditor General and State Treasurer are hereby authorized to borrow from time to time in addition to any authorization heretofore or hereafter enacted, on the credit of the Commonwealth, subject to the limitations provided in the current capital budget, money not exceeding the aggregate sum of \$54,460,000 as may be found necessary to carry out the acquisition and construction of the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission projects specifically itemized in this capital budget.

Section 5. Issue of bonds.

The indebtedness authorized in this act shall be incurred from time to time and shall be evidenced by one or more series of general obligation bonds of the Commonwealth in such aggregate principal amount for each series as the Governor, the Auditor General and the State Treasurer shall determine, but the latest stated maturity date shall not exceed the estimated useful life of the projects being financed as stated in section 6.

Section 6. Estimated useful life and term of debt.

- (a) Estimated useful life. -- The General Assembly states that the estimated useful life of the public improvement projects itemized in this act is 30 years.
- (b) Term of debt.--The maximum term of the debt authorized to be incurred under this act is 30 years. Section 7. Appropriations.

The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations authorized in this act are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission in the maximum amount of \$54,460,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission projects specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expense of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.

Section 8. Expiration of authorization and appropriation (8 repealed June 22, 2004, P.L.257, No.40).

Section 9. Repeals.

The following acts and parts of acts are repealed:

Sections 2(h), 10, 18(f) and 22(f) of the act of October 30, 2002 (P.L.891, No.131), known as the Capital Budget Project Itemization Act of 2001-2002.

Section 10. Editorial changes.

In editing and preparing this act for printing following the final enactment, the Legislative Reference Bureau shall insert or revise letters or numbers for projects where the letters or numbers are missing or require revision. The bureau shall also revise the total monetary amounts for the total authorization, debt authorization, appropriations and departmental totals as necessary to agree with the total monetary amounts of the projects.

Section 11. Effective date.

This act shall take effect immediately.
