

CAPITAL BUDGET PROJECT ITEMIZATION ACT OF 2005-2006

Act of Jul. 7, 2006, P.L. 390, No. 83

AN ACT

Providing for the capital budget for the fiscal year 2005-2006; itemizing public improvement projects, furniture and equipment projects, transportation assistance projects, redevelopment assistance capital projects, flood control projects, Keystone Recreation, Park and Conservation Fund projects, Environmental Stewardship Fund projects, Motor License Fund projects, State forestry bridge projects, Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission projects, Manufacturing Fund projects and federally funded projects to be constructed or acquired or assisted by the Department of General Services, the Department of Community and Economic Development, the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, the Department of Environmental Protection, the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission, the Pennsylvania Game Commission and the Department of Transportation, together with their estimated financial costs; authorizing the incurring of debt without the approval of the electors for the purpose of financing the projects to be constructed, acquired or assisted by the Department of General Services, the Department of Community and Economic Development, the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, the Department of Environmental Protection, the Department of Transportation, the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission or the Pennsylvania Game Commission; stating the estimated useful life of the projects; providing an exemption; providing for limitation on certain capital projects and for special provisions for certain redevelopment assistance capital projects; and making appropriations.

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Section 21. Effective date.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Short title.

This act shall be known and may be cited as the Capital Budget Project Itemization Act of 2005-2006.

Section 2. Total authorizations.

(a) Public improvements.--The total authorization for the additional capital projects in the category of public improvement projects itemized in section 3 and to be acquired or constructed by the Department of General Services, its successors or assigns and to be financed by the incurring of debt shall be \$3,262,281,000.

(b) Furniture and equipment.--The total authorization for the additional capital projects in the category of public improvement projects consisting of the acquisition of original movable furniture and equipment to complete public improvement projects itemized in section 4 and to be acquired by the Department of General Services, its successors or assigns and to be financed by the incurring of debt shall be \$138,088,000.

(c) Transportation assistance.--The total authorization for the capital projects in the category of transportation assistance projects itemized in section 5 with respect to which an interest is to be acquired in or constructed by the Department of Transportation, its successors or assigns and to be financed by the incurring of debt shall be \$1,238,624,000.

(d) Redevelopment assistance.--The total authorization for the additional capital projects in the category of redevelopment assistance and redevelopment assistance capital projects itemized in section 6 for capital grants by the Department of Community and Economic Development, its successors or assigns and to be financed by the incurring of debt shall be \$5,533,652,000.

(e) Flood control.--The total authorization for the capital projects in the category of flood control projects itemized in section 7 and to be constructed by the Department of Environmental Protection, its successors or assigns and to be financed by the incurring of debt shall be \$57,840,000.

(f) Keystone Recreation, Park and Conservation Fund.--The total authorization for the capital projects in the category of public improvement projects itemized in section 8 and to be constructed by the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, its successors or assigns and to be financed from current revenues in the Keystone Recreation, Park and Conservation Fund shall be \$68,370,000.

(g) Environmental Stewardship Fund projects.--The total authorization for the capital projects in the category of public improvement projects itemized in section 9 and to be constructed by the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, its successors or assigns and to be financed from current revenues in the Environmental Stewardship Fund shall be \$165,952,000.

(h) Motor License Fund projects.--The total authorization for the capital projects in the category of public improvement projects itemized in section 10 and to be developed by the Department of General Services, its successors or assigns for the Department of Transportation and to be financed by the

incurring of debt or from current revenues in the Motor License Fund is \$66,125,000.

(i) State forestry bridge projects.--The total authorization for the capital projects itemized in section 11 to be constructed by the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, its successors or assigns and to be financed by oil company franchise tax revenues pursuant to 75 Pa.C.S. § 9502(a)(2)(iv) (relating to imposition of tax) shall be \$5,100,000.

(j) Fish and Boat Fund projects.--The total authorization for the capital projects in the category of public improvement projects itemized in section 11.1 to be acquired or developed by the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission and to be financed by the incurring of debt or by current revenues of the Fish Fund and the Boat Fund pursuant to executive authorization shall be \$166,233,000.

(k) Manufacturing Fund current revenue projects.--The total authorization for the capital projects in the category of public improvement projects itemized in section 11.2 and to be constructed by the Department of General Services, its successors or assigns and to be financed from current revenues in the Manufacturing Fund shall be \$16,500,000.

(l) Federally funded projects.--The total authorization for the capital projects in the category of public improvement projects itemized in section 11.3 to be acquired or constructed by the Department of General Services, its successors or assigns and to be financed from Federal funds shall be \$61,550,000. Section 3. Itemization of public improvement capital projects.

Section 12. Limited waiver of local requirements.

The limitation on Department of Transportation funding of capital projects under 74 Pa.C.S. § 1302(4) (relating to program authorizations) shall be totally waived for the capital projects in the category of transportation assistance projects for mass transit contained in section 5(a)(18)(ii), (iv), (vi), (x) and (xiii), (20)(iii), (iv), (x), (xi), (xii) and (xiii) and (23)(i).

Section 12.1. Other waivers.

(1) Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary, there shall be no local or private match-funding requirement for the "Advanced Manufacturing and Precision Fabrication of Large Steel Structures and Curved Beam Technology Program" described in section 5(b)(18)(ii) of this act.

(2) Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary, there shall be no local or private match-funding requirement for the "Construction of rail production facility and track, MAGLEV" program described in section 5(b)(18)(i) of this act.

(3) Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary, there shall be no local or private match-funding requirement for the "Establishment of high-speed Maglev between Greater Pittsburgh International Airport, the City of Pittsburgh and the City of Greensburg in Allegheny and Westmoreland Counties" program described in section 6(a)(9)(xx) of the act of June 22, 2000 (P.L.136, No.27), known as the Capital Budget Debt Authorization and Project Itemization Act of 2000-2001.

Section 13. Debt authorization.

(a) Public improvements.--The Governor, Auditor General and State Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to borrow from time to time in addition to any authorization heretofore or hereafter enacted, on the credit of the Commonwealth, subject to the limitations provided in the current capital budget, money not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of \$3,262,281,000 as may be found necessary to carry out the acquisition and construction of the public improvement projects specifically itemized in a capital budget.

(b) Furniture and equipment.--The Governor, Auditor General and State Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to borrow from time to time in addition to any authorization heretofore or hereafter enacted, on the credit of the Commonwealth, subject to the limitations provided in the current capital budget, money not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of \$138,088,000 as may be found necessary to carry out the public improvement projects consisting of the acquisition of original movable furniture and equipment specifically itemized in a capital budget.

(c) Transportation assistance.--The Governor, Auditor General and State Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to borrow from time to time in addition to any authorization heretofore or hereafter enacted, on the credit of the Commonwealth, subject to the limitations provided in the current capital budget, money not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of \$1,238,624,000 as may be found necessary to carry out the acquisition and construction of the transportation assistance projects specifically itemized in a capital budget.

(d) Redevelopment assistance.--Subject to the limitation in section 317(b) of the act of February 9, 1999 (P.L.1, No.1), known as the Capital Facilities Debt Enabling Act, the Governor, Auditor General and State Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to borrow from time to time in addition to any authorization heretofore or hereafter enacted, on the credit of the Commonwealth, subject to the limitations provided in the current capital budget, money not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of \$5,533,652,000 as may be found necessary to carry out the redevelopment assistance and the redevelopment assistance capital projects specifically itemized in a capital budget.

(e) Flood control.--The Governor, Auditor General and State Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to borrow from time to time in addition to any authorization heretofore or hereafter enacted, on the credit of the Commonwealth, subject to the limitations provided in the current capital budget, money not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of \$57,840,000 as may be found necessary to carry out the acquisition and construction of the flood control projects specifically itemized in a capital budget.

(f) Motor License Fund projects.--The Governor, Auditor General and State Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to borrow from time to time in addition to any authorization heretofore or hereafter enacted, on the credit of the Commonwealth, subject to the limitations provided in the current capital budget, money not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of \$66,125,000 as may be found necessary to carry out the acquisition and construction of the Motor License Fund projects specifically itemized in a capital budget.

(g) Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission projects.--The Governor, Auditor General and State Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to borrow from time to time in addition to any authorization heretofore or hereafter enacted, on the credit of the Commonwealth, subject to the limitations provided in the current capital budget, money not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of \$166,233,000 as may be found necessary to carry out the acquisition and construction of the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission projects specifically itemized in this capital budget.

Section 14. Issue of bonds.

The indebtedness authorized in this act shall be incurred from time to time and shall be evidenced by one or more series of general obligation bonds of the Commonwealth in such

aggregate principal amount for each series as the Governor, the Auditor General and the State Treasurer shall determine, but the latest stated maturity date shall not exceed the estimated useful life of the projects being financed as stated in section 13.

Section 15. Estimated useful life and term of debt.

(a) Estimated useful life.--The General Assembly states that the estimated useful life of the public improvement projects itemized in this act is as follows:

- (1) Public improvement projects, 30 years.
- (2) Furniture and equipment projects, 10 years.
- (3) Transportation assistance projects:
 - (i) Rolling stock, 15 years.
 - (ii) Passenger buses, 12 years.
 - (iii) Furniture and equipment, 10 years.
 - (iv) All others, 30 years.

(b) Term of debt.--The maximum term of the debt authorized to be incurred under this act is 30 years.

Section 16. Appropriations.

(a) Public improvements.--The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations authorized in this act are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of General Services in the maximum amount of \$3,262,281,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the public improvement projects specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expense of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of General Services the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.

(b) Furniture and equipment.--The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations authorized in this act are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of General Services in the maximum amount of \$138,088,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the public improvement projects consisting of the acquisition of original movable furniture and equipment specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expenses of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of General Services the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.

(c) Transportation assistance.--The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations authorized in this act are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of Transportation in the maximum amount of \$1,238,624,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the transportation assistance projects specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expense of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of Transportation the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.

(d) Redevelopment assistance.--The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations authorized in this act are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of Community and Economic Development in the maximum amount of \$5,533,652,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the redevelopment assistance and redevelopment assistance capital projects specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expenses of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of Community and Economic Development the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.

(e) Flood control.--The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations authorized in this act are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Department of Environmental Protection in the maximum amount of \$57,840,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the flood control projects specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expense of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of Environmental Protection the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.

(f) Motor License Fund projects.--The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations authorized in this act are hereby appropriated from the Motor License Fund to the Department of Transportation in the maximum amount of \$66,125,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the Motor License Fund projects specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expense of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Department of Transportation the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.

(g) Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission projects.--The net proceeds of the sale of the obligations authorized in this act are hereby appropriated from the Capital Facilities Fund to the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission in the maximum amount of \$166,233,000 to be used by it exclusively to defray the financial cost of the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission projects specifically itemized in a capital budget. After reserving or paying the expense of the sale of the obligation, the State Treasurer shall pay to the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission the moneys as required and certified by it to be legally due and payable.

Section 17. Federal funds.

(a) Projects itemized in this act.--In addition to those funds appropriated in section 15, all moneys received from the Federal Government for the projects specifically itemized in this act are also hereby appropriated for those projects.

(b) Projects not requiring itemization.--Construction projects which are totally federally funded but which are to be administered by the Department of General Services are hereby authorized.

Section 18. Delegation.

For the public improvement projects specifically itemized in section 3(16), the Department of General Services may delegate the authority to construct, improve, equip, furnish, maintain, acquire or operate such projects to the Philadelphia Regional Port Authority. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the Philadelphia Regional Port Authority, at its discretion and subsequent to the aforementioned delegation, may contract with one or more of the tenant companies leasing or operating port facilities at the Port of Philadelphia for the purpose of constructing, improving, equipping, furnishing, maintaining, acquiring or operating the public improvement projects specifically itemized in section 3(16). Any project itemized in section 3(16) delegated to the Philadelphia Regional Port Authority for which the authority contracts with a tenant company for the purpose of constructing, improving, equipping, furnishing, maintaining, acquiring or operating the project shall be exempt from the first paragraph of section 1 of the act of May 1, 1913 (P.L.155, No.104), entitled "An act regulating the letting of certain contracts for the erection, construction, and alteration of public buildings," and the provisions of the act of March 3, 1978 (P.L.6, No.3), known as

the Steel Products Procurement Act, and any provisions of law requiring the bidding of projects.

Section 19. Limitation on certain capital projects.

(1) For the capital project itemized in section 3(2)(i)(A), no project activity shall be initiated and no funds shall be disbursed without the written approval of the Chief Clerk of the Senate, the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives and the chairman of the Capitol Preservation Committee.

(2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, the projects itemized in sections 3(10) and 6(51) for the construction, infrastructure and other related costs to modernize a publicly owned natural gas utilities system in cities of the first class shall not be released for design or construction and the Commonwealth shall not execute a grant or delegation agreement for said project until such time as the General Assembly enacts specific legislation authorizing a publicly owned natural gas utility system in a city of the first class to undertake the project.

(3) The authorization and appropriation for the capital projects itemized in section 3(10), with an authorization of \$20,000,000 or more, shall be effective upon the release by the Governor's Budget Office, in conjunction with the Department of General Services, of the capital project itemized in section 3(8)(i)(F) of the act of June 22, 2004 (P.L.257, No.40), known as the Capital Budget Project Itemization Act of 2003-2004, for the design phase. The capital projects itemized in section 3(10), with an authorization of \$20,000,000 or more, shall not be released for design by the Department of General Services or the Office of the Budget until the project itemized in section 3(8)(i)(F) of the Capital Budget Project Itemization Act of 2003-2004 has been released for construction.

Section 19.1. Special provisions for redevelopment assistance capital projects.

For the redevelopment assistance capital projects itemized in section 6, the Office of the Budget may, notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, permit an entity other than the entity under which a project is specifically itemized to act as the project applicant as long as said entity is an eligible applicant as enumerated in the definition of "redevelopment assistance capital project" in section 302 of the act of February 9, 1999 (P.L.1, No.1), known as the Capital Facilities Debt Enabling Act, and is located in or headquartered in the same county as the county under which the project is itemized.

Section 19.2. Pennsylvania National Guard facilities.

Capital projects in the category of public improvement projects specifically itemized for the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs in section 11.3 are hereby authorized to be constructed, erected or acquired by the Department of General Services, its successors or assigns or the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs and its State Armory Board notwithstanding any zoning ordinance, land use ordinance, building code or other regulation adopted or enacted by a political subdivision under the authority of any statute or under the authority of any home rule charter authorized and adopted under any statute or the Constitution of Pennsylvania.

Section 20. Editorial changes.

In editing and preparing this act for printing following the final enactment, the Legislative Reference Bureau shall insert or revise letters or numbers for projects where the letters or

numbers are missing or require revision. The bureau shall also revise the total monetary amounts for the total authorization, debt authorization, appropriations and departmental totals as necessary to agree with the total monetary amounts of the projects.

Section 21. Effective date.

This act shall take effect immediately.
