

SERGEANT CARL F. CURRAN II MEMORIAL BRIDGE - DESIGNATION
Act of Jul. 7, 2006, P.L. 604, No. 91

Designating the bridge to carry State Route 68 over the Allegheny River from East Brady Borough, Clarion County, to Brady's Bend Township, Armstrong County, as the Sergeant Carl F. Curran II Memorial Bridge.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Sergeant Carl F. Curran II Memorial Bridge.

(a) Legislative findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as follows:

(1) Army Sergeant Carl F. Curran II was assigned to Battery C, 1st Battalion, 107th Field Artillery Regiment, Army National Guard in Oil City, Pennsylvania. He was killed while serving his country on May 17, 2005, when his vehicle hit an improvised explosive device in Karmah, Iraq.

(2) Mr. Curran was a devoted and loving husband to his wife Dianna and father to his infant daughter Lillian. He served his community and was a member of the St. Patrick Roman Catholic Church in Sugarcreek Township, Armstrong County. He was also an active member of the American Legion Post 488.

(b) Designation.--The bridge currently under construction that will carry State Route 68 over the Allegheny River from East Brady, Clarion County, to Brady's Bend Township in Armstrong County is designated as the "Sergeant Carl F. Curran II Memorial Bridge."

(c) Signage.--The Department of Transportation shall be responsible for erecting and maintaining signs displaying the designation under subsection (b) at both ends of the bridge upon its completion.

Section 2. Effective date.

This act shall take effect in 60 days.
