SERGEANT JAMES R. MILLER MEMORIAL HIGHWAY - DESIGNATION Act of Nov. 1, 2007, P.L. 423, No. 61

AN ACT

Designating a portion of State Route 2024, known as Dreshertown Road, in Montgomery County, as the Sergeant James R. Miller Memorial Highway.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

- Section 1. Sergeant James R. Miller Memorial Highway.
- (a) Declaration of policy. -- The General Assembly finds and declares as follows:
 - (1) James R. Miller was a resident of Upper Dublin Township, Montgomery County, and served on the Upper Dublin Police Department for 28 years. He was a patrol sergeant for the last 21 years of his service on the force.
 - (2) Before joining the Upper Dublin Police Department, Sergeant Miller served with distinction in the United States Air Force.
 - (3) At age 55, Sergeant Miller died in an automobile accident while on duty, on the morning of Tuesday, April 20, 2004. He is survived by his wife, two children and two grandchildren.
- (b) Designation.--State Route 2024, known as Dreshertown Road, in Montgomery County, Upper Dublin Township, between Route 63, Welsh Road, and Route 152, North Limekiln Pike, is hereby designated as the Sergeant James R. Miller Memorial Highway.
- (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs to indicate the designation under subsection (b).
- Section 2. Effective date.

This act shall take effect in 60 days.
