

## AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL NO. 289

1 Amend Bill, page 1, line 3, by striking out "AND"

2 Amend Bill, page 1, line 7, by striking out the period after  
3 "BRIDGE" and inserting

4 ; designating the bridge, identified as Bridge Key 53825, on  
5 that portion of State Route 1011, also known as Castile Run  
6 Road, over the South Fork Tenmile Creek between Jefferson  
7 Township and Clarksville Borough, Greene County, as the PFC  
8 Brent A. McClellan Memorial Bridge; designating a bridge on  
9 that portion of U.S. Route 11 over the Susquehanna River  
10 between the City of Pittston and West Pittston Borough,  
11 Luzerne County, as the Specialist Dale J. Kridlo Memorial  
12 Bridge; designating a bridge at the junction of State Route  
13 150 and State Route 64 over Fishing Creek in Mill Hall  
14 Borough, Clinton County, as the U.S. Navy SOC David M.  
15 Collins Veterans Memorial Bridge; designating a bridge on  
16 that portion of State Route 2014 over Lycoming Creek, City of  
17 Williamsport, Lycoming County, as the Alexander M. McFadden  
18 Memorial Bridge; and designating a bridge on that portion of  
19 State Route 85 over the north branch of Plum Creek, Plumville  
20 Borough, Indiana County, as the Henry Lue Weaver Memorial  
21 Bridge.

22 Amend Bill, page 2, by inserting between lines 16 and 17

23 Section 3. PFC Brent A. McClellan Memorial Bridge.

24 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as  
25 follows:

26 (1) Private First Class Brent A. McClellan was born on  
27 March 18, 1944, to Mr. and Mrs. George McClellan, Jr., in  
28 Clarksville, Greene County.

29 (2) In 1963, PFC McClellan graduated from Jefferson-  
30 Morgan High School in Jefferson, Greene County.

31 (3) In May of 1965, PFC McClellan was drafted into the  
32 United States Army to undertake basic training and advanced  
33 infantry training.

34 (4) Upon the completion of his training, PFC McClellan  
35 was selected to serve in the Honor Guard at Fort Myers,

1 Virginia, near Washington D.C., during which time he was  
2 chosen to stand by the grave of President John F. Kennedy.

3 (5) In December of 1965, PFC McClellan was deployed to  
4 Vietnam, where he was assigned as an infantryman to the 1st  
5 Platoon, B Company, 1st Battalion, 5th Cavalry, 1st Cavalry  
6 Division, during the Vietnam Conflict.

7 (6) On February 28, 1966, at 21 years of age, PFC  
8 McClellan was killed in an ambush by hostile forces during  
9 Operation Masher, also known as Operation White Wing, in Binh  
10 Dinh Province, South Vietnam.

11 (7) PFC McClellan's awards include the Purple Heart, the  
12 National Defense Service Medal, the Vietnam Service Medal,  
13 the Vietnam Campaign Medal and the Combat Infantryman Badge.

14 (b) Designation.--The bridge, identified as Bridge Key  
15 53825, located on that portion of State Route 1011, also known  
16 as Castile Run Road, over the South Fork Tenmile Creek between  
17 Jefferson Township and Clarksville Borough, Greene County, is  
18 hereby designated as the PFC Brent A. McClellan Memorial Bridge.

19 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and  
20 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to  
21 traffic in both directions on the bridge.

22 Section 4. Specialist Dale J. Kridlo Memorial Bridge.

23 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as  
24 follows:

25 (1) On March 27, 1977, Specialist Dale J. Kridlo was  
26 born to Albert Kridlo and Michelle Shymanski Dale in the City  
27 of Scranton.

28 (2) Specialist Kridlo was a graduate of Pittston Area  
29 High School and worked as a local painting contractor before  
30 enlisting with the United States Army.

31 (3) After joining the United States Army, Specialist  
32 Kridlo was assigned to the 27th Engineer Battalion, 20th  
33 Engineer Brigade, XVIII Airborne Corps, Fort Bragg, North  
34 Carolina.

35 (4) On November 7, 2010, at the age of 33, Specialist  
36 Kridlo was killed in Kunar Province, Afghanistan, while  
37 serving in support of Operation Enduring Freedom.

38 (5) For his military service, Specialist Kridlo was  
39 awarded the Bronze Star Medal and the Purple Heart.

40 (b) Designation.--The bridge located on that portion of U.S.  
41 Route 11 over the Susquehanna River between the City of Pittston  
42 and West Pittston Borough, Luzerne County, is hereby designated  
43 as the Specialist Dale J. Kridlo Memorial Bridge.

44 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and  
45 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to  
46 traffic in both directions on the bridge.

47 Section 5. U.S. Navy SOC David M. Collins Veterans Memorial  
48 Bridge.

49 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as  
50 follows:

1 (1) Bald Eagle Township and Mill Hall Borough wish to  
2 honor a fallen soldier of Clinton County who served our  
3 nation in the armed forces.

4 (2) David M. Collins was born on March 3, 1969, and was  
5 raised in Lock Haven.

6 (3) After graduating from Lock Haven High School in  
7 1988, he enlisted in the United States Navy.

8 (4) Over the course of his career, Chief Petty Officer  
9 David M. Collins completed deployments to South America, Iraq  
10 and Afghanistan, having served in the first Gulf War, the  
11 Iraq War and Operation Enduring Freedom.

12 (5) Chief Petty Officer David M. Collins' personal  
13 awards and decorations include a Bronze Star Medal, Joint  
14 Service Commendation Medal, Navy and Marine Corps  
15 Commendation Medal with Valor, Army Commendation Medal, Navy  
16 and Marine Corps Achievement Medal, Combat Action Ribbon,  
17 eight Navy Good Conduct Medals and numerous service and  
18 campaign awards.

19 (6) After 25 years of service, Chief Petty Officer David  
20 M. Collins retired in September 2012 from the United States  
21 Navy.

22 (7) Upon retirement, Chief Petty Officer David M.  
23 Collins worked for Blackbird Technologies.

24 (8) On March 12, 2014, at age 45, Chief Petty Officer  
25 David M. Collins passed away in Virginia Beach, Virginia.

26 (9) Chief Petty Officer David M. Collins is survived by  
27 his wife, Jennifer M. Collins, children, Grace and Samuel  
28 Collins, mother, Rose Ann McNerney, sister, Lari Ann Collins,  
29 and brother, Thomas Collins.

30 (b) Designation.--The bridge located at the junction of  
31 State Route 150 and State Route 64 over Fishing Creek in Mill  
32 Hall Borough, Clinton County, is designated the U.S. Navy SOC  
33 David M. Collins Veterans Memorial Bridge.

34 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and  
35 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to  
36 traffic in both directions on the bridge.

37 Section 6. Alexander M. McFadden Memorial Bridge.

38 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds as follows:

39 (1) Upon Williamsport's incorporation as a city on  
40 January 15, 1866, the city sought the appointment of a  
41 regular police force.

42 (2) Alexander M. McFadden, a native of Loyalsock  
43 Township, was named the first Chief of Police of the City of  
44 Williamsport on July 2, 1866, and served until May 23, 1867.

45 (b) Designation.--The bridge located on State Route 2014  
46 over Lycoming Creek, City of Williamsport, Lycoming County, is  
47 hereby designated as the Alexander M. McFadden Memorial Bridge.

48 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and  
49 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to  
50 traffic in both directions on the bridge.

51 Section 7. Henry Lue Weaver Memorial Bridge.

1 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as  
2 follows:

3 (1) Private First Class Henry Lue Weaver was a native of  
4 Plumville, Indiana County, and graduated from Marion Center  
5 Area High School.

6 (2) PFC Weaver was drafted into the United States Army  
7 in August 1966 and completed basic training at Fort Jackson  
8 in South Carolina.

9 (3) On April 22, 1967, PFC Weaver was killed in action  
10 in South Vietnam while serving with the 35th Infantry  
11 Regiment, 25th Division.

12 (4) While growing up in Plumville, PFC Weaver walked  
13 across the bridge being designated in his honor almost daily.

14 (b) Designation.--The bridge located on State Route 85 over  
15 the north branch of Plum Creek in Plumville Borough, Indiana  
16 County, is designated the Henry Lue Weaver Memorial Bridge.

17 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and  
18 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to  
19 traffic in both directions on the bridge.
