1 Amend Bill, page 1, line 3, by striking out the period after
2 "Interchange" and inserting
3 ; designating a portion of Pennsylvania Route 144 beginning at
4 the intersection of Pennsylvania Route 26 in Pleasant Gap and
5 ending at the intersection of Pennsylvania Route 45 in Centre
6 Hall, Centre County, as the Duster-Quad 50-Searchlight
7 Highway; designating a bridge, identified by Bridge Key
8 31377, on that portion of State Route 2047 over the
9 Flaugherty Creek, Meyersdale Borough, Somerset County, as the
10 Harry Beal Bridge; designating a bridge on that portion of
11 U.S. Route 219 over Buffalo Creek in Brothersvalley Township,
12 Somerset County, as the John Vatavuk Memorial Bridge;
13 designating a bridge carrying State Route 4009 in York County
14 over the Conewago Creek as the Staff Sergeant Gary Crone
15 Memorial Bridge; designating the bridge located at
16 39°57'48.9"N 79°02'40.7"W (U.S. Route 219 over Walters Mill
17 Road), as the Mark J. Baserman Memorial Bridge; designating a
18 bridge, identified as Bridge Key 35729, on that portion of
19 State Route 3041 in Texas Township, Wayne County, as the PFC
20 Raymond P. Schwesinger Memorial Bridge; designating a bridge,
21 identified by Bridge Key 8671, on that portion of Washington
22 Street over the Conemaugh River in Johnstown City, Cambria
23 County, as the SFC Raymond R. Buchan Memorial Bridge;
24 designating a bridge, identified as Bridge Key 27659, on that
25 portion of State Route 2034, also known as Edge Hill Road,
26 over Pennsylvania Route 611, also known as Old York Road, in
27 Abington Township, Montgomery County, as the Captain Samuel
28 Schultz Memorial Bridge; designating a bridge on that portion
29 of State Route 1002, also known as Friend Lea Road, over U.S.
30 Route 219 in Cambria Township, Cambria County, as the PFC
31 Cyril T. Yeckley Memorial Bridge; designating a bridge on
32 that portion of Pennsylvania Route 56 over the Conemaugh
33 River, Indiana County, as the Spc. Beverly S. Clark Memorial
34 Bridge; designating a bridge on that portion of Pennsylvania
35 Route 553, bridge ID 32055302000620, over Dutch Run in Pine
36 Township, Indiana County, as the Private Chancy Franklin
37 Davis Memorial Bridge; designating a bridge on that portion
38 of Pennsylvania Route 403 over Dixon Run, Clymer Borough,

1 Indiana County, as the PFC Martin J. Popson Memorial Bridge;
2 designating a bridge on that portion of U.S. Route 422 over
3 Yellow Creek, Cherryhill Township, Indiana County, as the PFC
4 Ralph E. Dias Memorial Bridge; designating the bridge,
5 identified as Bridge Key 19010, on that portion of United
6 States Route 119 over the Yellow Creek in Center Township,
7 Indiana County, as the Dr. Patricia Hilliard-Robertson
8 Memorial Bridge; designating the bridge located on
9 Pennsylvania Route 897 (Main Street) over Little Cocalico
10 Creek in West Cocalico Township, Lancaster County, as the
11 Sheriff Terry A. Bergman Memorial Bridge; designating the
12 portion of State Route 3059 near its intersection with Little
13 Creek Road to the area immediately before State Route 3059
14 intersects with Officer David D. Tome Memorial Circle located
15 on State Route 116 at Hanover Road and Roth's Church Road in
16 Spring Grove, York County, as Corporal Earl H. Markle
17 Memorial Road; designating the portion of State Route 2012
18 South beginning at the intersection of South Courtland Street
19 and Day Street and ending at its intersection with Brown
20 Street in East Stroudsburg Borough, Monroe County, as the
21 Samuel Newman Way; and making a related repeal.

22 Amend Bill, page 2, by inserting after line 30

23 Section 2. Duster-Quad 50-Searchlight Highway.

24 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as
25 follows:

26 (1) Dusters, quad .50s and searchlights were weapons
27 used by the United States Army, grouped together as separate
28 small units and deployed to Vietnam starting in 1966 and
29 ending in 1972.

30 (2) Duster was the nickname given to a weapon mounted on
31 a tank chassis with two 40 mm guns mounted on top.

32 (3) Quad 50 was the nickname for a weapon that had
33 four .50 caliber machine guns mounted on the back of a two
34 and one-half ton truck.

35 (4) Searchlights provided white light and infrared
36 illumination to assist the United States Army in the defense
37 of combat bases at night.

38 (5) Several hundred soldiers from this Commonwealth
39 served in units heavily armed with dusters, quad .50s and
40 searchlights.

41 (6) The 1st Battalion, 44th Artillery, with Battery G of
42 the 65th Artillery and Battery G of the 29th Artillery
43 attached, was the highest decorated unit of its size to fight
44 in the Vietnam War.

45 (7) As a unit equipped with dusters, quad .50s and
46 searchlights, the unit was awarded more than 450 medals for
47 valor, including the Medal of Honor, and was awarded more
48 than 1000 Purple Hearts.

49 (8) During the Vietnam War, units equipped with dusters,

1 quad .50s and searchlights suffered the loss of 211 soldiers,
2 including five soldiers from this Commonwealth.

3 (b) Designation.--The portion of Pennsylvania Route 144
4 beginning at the intersection of Pennsylvania Route 26 in
5 Pleasant Gap and ending at the intersection of Pennsylvania
6 Route 45 in Centre Hall, Centre County, is designated the
7 Duster-Quad 50-Searchlight Highway.

8 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
9 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the highway to
10 traffic in both directions on the highway.

11 Section 3. The Harry Beal Bridge.

12 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as
13 follows:

14 (1) Harry Beal enlisted in the United States Navy in
15 June 1948, at 17 years of age.

16 (2) Mr. Beal completed specialized training in
17 underwater demolition, becoming what is commonly referred to
18 as a Navy "frogman."

19 (3) In 1962, President John F. Kennedy set out to look
20 for an elite group of Navy servicemen that could go anywhere
21 in the world at a moment's notice, creating the United States
22 Navy SEALs.

23 (4) The first person to step forward and sign up for the
24 new unit, Harry Beal is recognized as the first official Navy
25 SEAL.

26 (5) As a member of SEAL Team Two, based out of Little
27 Creek, Virginia, Mr. Beal's 20 years of service took him to
28 South America, Southeast Asia, Europe and the Caribbean Sea.

29 (6) Mr. Beal was part of a team that brought John Glenn
30 out of the space capsule after orbiting the earth.

31 (7) Following his military service, Mr. Beal worked for
32 the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation for 20 years
33 before retiring.

34 (b) Designation.--The bridge, identified by Bridge Key
35 31377, located on State Route 2047 over the Flaugherty Creek in
36 Meyersdale Borough, Somerset County, is designated the Harry
37 Beal Bridge.

38 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
39 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to
40 traffic in both directions on the bridge.

41 Section 4. The John Vatauvuk Memorial Bridge.

42 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as
43 follows:

44 (1) Born March 24, 1949, John Vatauvuk was a member of
45 the first graduating class of the University of Pittsburgh at
46 Johnstown in 1971.

47 (2) Mr. Vatauvuk was a dedicated teacher for 36 years in
48 the North Star School District.

49 (3) In addition to teaching, Mr. Vatauvuk spent 16 years
50 as a member of the Windber School Board.

51 (4) In 2007, Mr. Vatauvuk won his first term on the

1 Somerset County Board of Commissioners, which he would serve
2 on for three consecutive terms.

3 (5) Mr. Vatavuk was a tireless and dedicated advocate
4 for the betterment of Somerset County.

5 (6) Mr. Vatavuk was instrumental in promoting and
6 engaging the community in the building of the USS Somerset,
7 which launched in 2012 and was named in honor of the crew and
8 passengers of United Airlines Flight 93.

9 (7) Mr. Vatavuk was a lifelong advocate for the
10 completion of U.S. Route 219 and was vital in securing
11 funding for the creation of a new 11-mile section between
12 Somerset and Meyersdale.

13 (b) Designation.--The bridge on that portion of U.S. Route
14 219 over Buffalo Creek in Brothersvalley Township, Somerset
15 County, is designated the John Vatavuk Memorial Bridge.

16 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
17 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to
18 traffic in both directions on the bridge.

19 Section 5. Staff Sergeant Gary Crone Memorial Bridge.

20 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as
21 follows:

22 (1) Staff Sergeant Gary Crone was born on December 3,
23 1941, and was a lifelong resident of York County.

24 (2) Staff Sgt. Crone attended Northeastern High School
25 and enlisted into the armed forces in October 1959.

26 (3) Staff Sgt. Crone, age 27, formerly of Zions View in
27 York County, was killed in action on January 29, 1968, during
28 an enemy ambush while on patrol near Hill 471 around Khe
29 Sanh, Vietnam, while serving as a member of the 5th Special
30 Forces Group with the United States Army in Vietnam.

31 (4) Staff Sgt. Crone was one day away from completing
32 his second tour of duty in Vietnam at the time of his death.

33 (5) Staff Sgt. Crone received the Silver Star, Bronze
34 Star and two Purple Heart Medals for his service as a member
35 of the armed forces during the Vietnam War.

36 (6) Staff Sgt. Crone was survived by his parents, Ralph
37 and Ruth Crone, and his siblings, Geraldine and Richard
38 Crone.

39 (b) Designation.--The bridge carrying State Route 4009 in
40 York County over the Conewago Creek is hereby designated as the
41 Staff Sergeant Gary Crone Memorial Bridge.

42 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
43 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to
44 traffic in both directions on the bridge.

45 Section 6. Mark J. Baserman Memorial Bridge.

46 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as
47 follows:

48 (1) State Correctional Institution at Somerset Sergeant
49 Mark J. Baserman of Oakland, Stonycreek Township, Cambria
50 County, died February 26, 2018, after an inmate assault 11
51 days earlier.

1 (2) Born August 21, 1957, Sgt. Baserman was a United
2 States Army veteran who worked for the Department of
3 Corrections at the former SCI Cresson before transferring to
4 SCI Somerset.

5 (3) In his lifetime, Sgt. Baserman further protected his
6 community as an Oakland volunteer firefighter and East Hills
7 emergency medical technician.

8 (4) Sgt. Baserman was posthumously awarded the Medal of
9 Valor which is given to government-employed corrections
10 officers.

11 (5) University of Pittsburgh at Johnstown undergraduates
12 in the Justice Administration and Criminology program are
13 eligible for the Sgt. Mark J. Baserman Memorial Scholarship.

14 (b) Designation.--The bridge located at 39°57'48.9"N
15 79°02'40.7"W (U.S. Route 219 over Walters Mill Road), is
16 designated the Mark J. Baserman Memorial Bridge.

17 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
18 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to
19 traffic in both directions on and under the bridge.
20 Section 7. PFC Raymond P. Schwesinger Memorial Bridge.

21 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as
22 follows:

23 (1) On May 6, 1966, Seelyville resident, Raymond P.
24 Schwesinger, was killed in Quang Nam Province, Vietnam by a
25 hostile explosive device.

26 (2) PFC Schwesinger served as a rifleman with 3rd
27 Platoon, Delta Company, 1st Battalion, 9th Marines, 3rd
28 Marine Division, III Marine Amphibious Force, a battalion
29 that sustained the highest casualty rate in Marine Corps
30 history.

31 (3) PFC Schwesinger, a graduate of Honesdale High
32 School, was a member of the Seelyville Fire Company, which
33 honored his sacrifice with a flag pole and memorial at its
34 fire hall.

35 (b) Designation.--The bridge, identified as Bridge Key
36 35729, located on State Route 3041 in Texas Township, Wayne
37 County, is designated the PFC Raymond P. Schwesinger Memorial
38 Bridge.

39 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
40 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to
41 traffic in both directions on the bridge.
42 Section 8. SFC Raymond R. Buchan Memorial Bridge.

43 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as
44 follows:

45 (1) SFC Raymond R. Buchan was born on October 12, 1973,
46 in Johnstown and served the United States in the Army, where
47 he reached the rank of sergeant first class.

48 (2) A graduate of Westmont Hilltop High School and
49 Central Texas College, SFC Buchan dedicated 16 years, nearly
50 his entire adult life, to serving in the Army.

51 (3) SFC Buchan was assigned to the 1st Battalion, 18th

1 Infantry Regiment, 2nd Brigade Combat Team, 1st Infantry
2 Division in Schweinfurt, Germany, and also served as an Army
3 recruiter in Erie.

4 (4) On July 1, 2007, SFC Buchan was on his second tour of
5 duty in Iraq when he was killed by small-arms fire in Ta'meem
6 while escorting an explosives team.

7 (5) SFC Buchan was known for the many friends he made
8 among the Iraqi police with whom he worked.

9 (6) SFC Buchan was recognized for his selfless service
10 to his country with the following awards: the Bronze Star,
11 Purple Heart, Army Commendation Medal-three Oak Leaf
12 Clusters, Army Achievement Medal-two Oak Leaf Clusters, Army
13 Good Conduct Medal, National Defense Service Medal with
14 Bronze Star, Kosovo Campaign Medal, Iraq Campaign Medal,
15 Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal, Global War on
16 Terrorism Service Medal, Military Outstanding Volunteer
17 Service Medal, Army Noncommissioned Officer Professional
18 Development Ribbon, Army Service Ribbon, Army Overseas
19 Service Ribbon, North Atlantic Treaty Organization Medal,
20 Combat Infantryman Badge, Army Recruiter Badge, Driver and
21 Mechanic Badge with Wheeled Qualification Bar.

22 (b) Designation.--The bridge, identified by Bridge Key 8671,
23 on that portion of Washington Street over the Conemaugh River in
24 Johnstown City, Cambria County, is designated the SFC Raymond R.
25 Buchan Memorial Bridge.

26 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
27 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to
28 traffic in both directions on the bridge.
29 Section 9. Captain Samuel Schultz Memorial Bridge.

30 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as
31 follows:

32 (1) A native of Huntingdon Valley, Captain Samuel
33 Schultz graduated from Abington Senior High School in 2008.

34 (2) Following in his family's footsteps to become a
35 pilot, Captain Schultz received his private pilot's license
36 by 18 years of age.

37 (3) After graduation, Captain Schultz enrolled in the
38 Naval Reserve Officer Training Corps (ROTC) program at The
39 Pennsylvania State University.

40 (4) Captain Schultz joined the United States Marine
41 Corps in 2012, serving as a pilot assigned to Marine Heavy
42 Helicopter Squadron (HMH) 465, Marine Aircraft Group 16, 3rd
43 Marine Aircraft Wing, Marine Corps Air Station Miramar in San
44 Diego, California.

45 (5) On April 3, 2018, at 28 years of age, Captain
46 Schultz was one of four Marines killed as a result of a CH-
47 53E Super Stallion helicopter crash during a training
48 exercise near El Centro, California.

49 (b) Designation.--The bridge, identified as Bridge Key
50 27659, located on that portion of State Route 2034, also known
51 as Edge Hill Road, over Pennsylvania Route 611, also known as

1 Old York Road, in Abington Township, Montgomery County, is
2 designated as the Captain Samuel Schultz Memorial Bridge.

3 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
4 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to
5 traffic in both directions on the bridge.

6 Section 10. PFC Cyril T. Yeckley Memorial Bridge.

7 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as
8 follows:

9 (1) PFC Cyril T. Yeckley was born October 20, 1945, in
10 Carrolltown Borough, Cambria County.

11 (2) He enlisted in the United States Marine Corps and
12 began a tour of duty in Quang Nam Province, South Vietnam, on
13 February 23, 1969, as a rifleman with L Company, 3rd
14 Battalion, 5th Marine Regiment, 1st Marine Division.

15 (3) Less than one month later, on March 13, 1969, PFC
16 Yeckley was killed in action after receiving multiple
17 fragmentation wounds.

18 (b) Designation.--The bridge located on State Route 1002,
19 also known as Friend Lea Road, over U.S. Route 219 in Cambria
20 Township, Cambria County, is designated the PFC Cyril T. Yeckley
21 Memorial Bridge.

22 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
23 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to
24 traffic in both directions on the bridge.

25 Section 11. Spc. Beverly S. Clark Memorial Bridge.

26 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as
27 follows:

28 (1) Specialist Beverly S. Clark, a native of Indiana
29 County, joined the Westmoreland County-based 14th
30 Quartermaster Detachment of the Army Reserves upon graduation
31 from high school.

32 (2) On February 25, 1991, Specialist Clark, 23 years of
33 age, was killed during a Scud missile attack on the United
34 States military barracks at Riyadh, Saudi Arabia.

35 (b) Designation.--The bridge located on Pennsylvania Route
36 56 over the Conemaugh River, Indiana County, is designated the
37 Spc. Beverly S. Clark Memorial Bridge.

38 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
39 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to
40 traffic in both directions on the bridge.

41 Section 12. Private Chancy Franklin Davis Memorial Bridge.

42 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as
43 follows:

44 (1) Chancy Franklin Davis was born March 28, 1924, in
45 Alverda, Indiana County.

46 (2) Private Davis enlisted in the United States Marine
47 Corps in 1942.

48 (3) After basic training at Parris Island, North
49 Carolina, Private Davis served in the Pacific Ocean Theater
50 during World War II as a member of the 3rd Marine Division.

51 (4) On November 20, 1943, Private Davis was killed in

1 the Battle of Piva Forks while defending against a Japanese
2 counterattack toward recent American landings at Torakina Bay
3 in the Solomon Islands.

4 (b) Designation.--The bridge located on Pennsylvania Route
5 553, bridge ID 32055302000620, over Dutch Run in Pine Township,
6 Indiana County, is designated the Private Chancy Franklin Davis
7 Memorial Bridge.

8 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
9 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to
10 traffic in both directions on the bridge.

11 Section 13. PFC Martin J. Popson Memorial Bridge.

12 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as
13 follows:

14 (1) PFC Martin J. Popson of Penn Run served in the
15 United States Army in World War II.

16 (2) PFC Popson was awarded the Distinguished Service
17 Cross, the nation's second highest medal, for extraordinary
18 heroism in action during the liberation of Manila.

19 (3) PFC Popson also received a Purple Heart, Combat
20 Infantryman Badge and the Asiatic-Pacific Campaign Ribbon.

21 (b) Designation.--The bridge located on Pennsylvania Route
22 403 over Dixon Run, Clymer Borough, Indiana County, is
23 designated the PFC Martin J. Popson Memorial Bridge.

24 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
25 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to
26 traffic in both directions on the bridge.

27 Section 14. PFC Ralph E. Dias Memorial Bridge.

28 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as
29 follows:

30 (1) PFC Ralph E. Dias of Shelocta served in the United
31 States Marine Corps Company D, 1st Battalion, 7th Marines,
32 1st Marine Division, Fleet Marine Force in Vietnam.

33 (2) On November 12, 1969, PFC Dias, 19 years of age, was
34 killed in combat in Quang Nam Province, Vietnam.

35 (3) PFC Dias was awarded the Medal of Honor, the Purple
36 Heart, the Combat Action Badge, the Meritorious Unit
37 Commendation with one bronze star, the National Defense
38 Service Medal, the Vietnam Service Medal with three bronze
39 stars, the Republic of Vietnam Meritorious Unit Commendation
40 with palm and frame, the Republic of Vietnam Meritorious Unit
41 Commendation with palm and frame and the Republic of Vietnam
42 Campaign Medal with device.

43 (b) Designation.--The bridge located on U.S. Route 422 over
44 Yellow Creek, Cherryhill Township, Indiana County, is designated
45 the PFC Ralph E. Dias Memorial Bridge.

46 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
47 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to
48 traffic in both directions on the bridge.

49 Section 15. Dr. Patricia Hilliard-Robertson Memorial Bridge.

50 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as
51 follows:

1 (1) Patricia Hilliard-Robertson lived a life of service
2 to others and as an exemplary role model for women in STEM
3 education.

4 (2) Dr. Hilliard-Robertson was born on March 12, 1963,
5 in Indiana and grew up in Homer City. Dr. Hilliard-Robertson
6 graduated from Homer Center High School and the Indiana
7 University of Pennsylvania, where she earned a bachelor of
8 science degree in biology in 1985.

9 (3) In 1989, Dr. Hilliard-Robertson earned a medical
10 degree from the Medical College of Pennsylvania. She then
11 completed a three-year residency in family medicine and was
12 certified by the American Board of Family Practice.

13 (4) From 1992 to 1995, Dr. Hilliard-Robertson practiced
14 medicine in Erie, Pennsylvania. She was on the staff of St.
15 Vincent Hospital where she served as the clinical coordinator
16 for medical students in training and also provided training
17 and supervision for resident physicians.

18 (5) In 1995, Dr. Hilliard-Robertson was one of two
19 fellows selected to study aerospace medicine at the
20 University of Texas Medical Branch (UTMB), Galveston and at
21 the Johnson Space Center, Houston, Texas.

22 (6) While enrolled as a space medicine fellow, Dr.
23 Hilliard-Robertson completed a research project where she
24 studied eccentric and concentric resistive exercise
25 countermeasures for space flight. She also served as a member
26 of the faculty at UTMB in the departments of Family Medicine
27 and Emergency Medicine.

28 (7) In 1997, Dr. Hilliard-Robertson joined the Flight
29 Medicine Clinic at Johnson Space Center and served as the
30 Chairman of the Bone, Muscle and Exercise Integrated Product
31 Team.

32 (8) In 1998, NASA selected Dr. Hilliard-Robertson for
33 the Astronaut Candidate Training program. Upon completing
34 training, Dr. Hilliard-Robertson served as the office
35 representative for the Crew Healthcare System (CheCS) and as
36 Crew Support Astronaut (CSA) for the International Space
37 Station Expedition-2 Crew.

38 (9) Dr. Hilliard-Robertson passed away on May 24, 2001.

39 (b) Designation.--The bridge, identified as Bridge Key
40 19010, located on that portion of United States Route 119 over
41 the Yellow Creek in Center Township, Indiana County, is
42 designated the Dr. Patricia Hilliard-Robertson Memorial Bridge.

43 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
44 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to
45 traffic in both directions on the bridge.

46 Section 16. Sheriff Terry A. Bergman Memorial Bridge.

47 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as
48 follows:

49 (1) Terry A. Bergman was born in Ephrata Borough,
50 Lancaster County, graduated from the Cocalico High School in
51 1971 and received a bachelor of science degree in criminal

1 justice from The Pennsylvania State University.

2 (2) Sheriff Bergman was a corporal in the United States
3 Marine Corps from 1972 through 1975 and was assigned to
4 Marine Corps Headquarters in Washington, DC.

5 (3) Sheriff Bergman was a member of the Marine Corps
6 Association and a charter member of the Marine Corps Heritage
7 Foundation.

8 (4) Sheriff Bergman served as the Lancaster County
9 Sheriff from December 2000 to December 2010 and worked in the
10 Sheriff's Office for a total of 33 years prior to retiring in
11 2010.

12 (5) Sheriff Bergman was a charter member of the West
13 Cocalico Parks and Recreation Board, having served for more
14 than 20 years.

15 (6) Sheriff Bergman was a former Pennsylvania State
16 Commandant of the Marine Corps League of Pennsylvania.

17 (7) Sheriff Bergman was a former member of the
18 Pennsylvania Veterans Commission where he was the recipient
19 of the Adjutant General's prestigious "Pennsylvania
20 Commendation Medal."

21 (8) Sheriff Bergman was a 32nd degree Mason and a member
22 of the Ephrata Lodge No. 665 Free & Accepted Masons of
23 Pennsylvania, Lancaster Lodge of Perfection, Reading
24 Consistory and Shriners International.

25 (b) Designation.--The bridge located on Pennsylvania Route
26 897 (Main Street) over Little Cocalico Creek in West Cocalico
27 Township, Lancaster County, is designated the Sheriff Terry A.
28 Bergman Memorial Bridge.

29 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
30 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to
31 traffic in both directions on the bridge.
32 Section 17. Corporal Earl H. Markle Memorial Road.

33 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as
34 follows:

35 (1) In November of 1950, Corporal Earl H. Markle, age
36 19, formerly of Spring Grove Borough, York County, was killed
37 in action at the Battle of Unsan during the Korean War while
38 serving as an infantryman with the 1st Calvary Division of
39 the United States Army.

40 (2) Corporal Markle was born on October 8, 1931.

41 (3) Corporal Markle enlisted in the United States Army
42 on May 13, 1949, at 17 years of age.

43 (4) Corporal Markle was awarded the Purple Heart for his
44 service and bravery.

45 (5) After the Battle of Unsan, Corporal Markle was
46 reported as missing by his unit.

47 (6) The United States Army could not account for
48 Corporal Markle after he was reported missing for a long
49 period of time.

50 (7) Consequently, the United States Army declared
51 Corporal Markle deceased on December 31, 1953.

1 (8) On July 27, 2018, as part of the negotiations
2 between President Donald J. Trump and North Korean Chairman
3 Kim Jong-un regarding North Korea's nuclear program, the
4 remains of Corporal Markle were returned to the United
5 States.

6 (b) Designation.--The portion of State Route 3059 near its
7 intersection with Little Creek Road to the area immediately
8 before State Route 3059 intersects with Officer David D. Tome
9 Memorial Circle located on State Route 116 at Hanover Road and
10 Roth's Church Road in Spring Grove, York County, is designated
11 as Corporal Earl H. Markle Memorial Road.

12 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
13 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the road to
14 traffic in both directions on the road.

15 Section 18. Samuel Newman Way.

16 (a) Designation.--The portion of State Route 2012 South
17 beginning at the intersection of South Courtland Street and Day
18 Street and ending at its intersection with Brown Street in East
19 Stroudsburg Borough, Monroe County, is designated the Samuel
20 Newman Way.

21 (b) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
22 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the highway to
23 traffic in both directions on the highway.

24 Section 19. Repeals.

25 Repeals are as follows:

26 (1) The General Assembly finds that the repeal under
27 paragraph (2) is necessary to effectuate section 2 of this
28 act.

29 (2) Section 8 of the act of July 2, 2019 (P.L.318,
30 No.44), is repealed.
