8 (i.1) Notice to sheriff.--Notwithstanding any statute to the
9 contrary:

11 (2) Upon adjudication that a person is incompetent or
12 upon the involuntary commitment of a person to a mental
13 institution for inpatient care and treatment under the act of
14 July 9, 1976 (P.L.817, No.143), known as the Mental Health
15 Procedures Act, or upon involuntary treatment of a person as
16 described under section 6105(c)(4), the judge of the court of
17 common pleas, mental health review officer or county mental
18 health and mental retardation administrator shall notify the
19 sheriff of the county in which that person resides, on a form
20 developed by the Pennsylvania State Police, of the identity
21 of the person who has been adjudicated, committed or treated
22 and the nature of the adjudication, commitment or treatment.
23 The notification shall be transmitted by the judge, mental
24 health review officer or county mental health and mental
25 retardation administrator within [seven days] 72 hours of the
26 adjudication, commitment or treatment.

27 (3) The judge of the court of common pleas, mental
28 health review officer or county mental health and mental
29 retardation administrator shall notify a person who has been
30 subject to involuntary treatment as described under section
31 6105(c)(4), on a form developed by the Pennsylvania State
32 Police, of the person's obligations and rights under section
33 6105(a)(2)(v) and (f)(1) prior to discharge from inpatient
34 care and treatment.
