1 Amend Bill, page 1, lines 9 through 13, by striking out all
2 of said lines and inserting

3 Section 1. Section 9(b)(7) of the act of October 27, 2014
4 (P.L.2911, No.191), known as the Achieving Better Care by
5 Monitoring All Prescriptions Program (ABC-MAP) Act, is amended,
6 the subsection is amended by adding paragraphs and the section
7 is amended by adding a subsection to read:

11 designees,

12 Amend Bill, page 2, line 24, by inserting after "if"

13 Medicaid

14 Amend Bill, page 2, lines 27 through 30; page 3, lines 1
15 through 14; by striking out all of said lines on said pages and
16 inserting

17 (13) (i) An authorized employee of a county or
18 municipal health department or the Department of Health
19 of the Commonwealth may have access to data from the
20 system for any of the following purposes:

21 (A) Developing education programs or public
22 health interventions relating to specific prescribing
23 practices, controlled substances and the prevention
24 of fraud and abuse.

25 (B) Conducting analyses on prescribing trends in
26 their respective jurisdictions.

27 (ii) For purposes of subparagraph (i)(A), a county
28 or municipal health department shall implement
29 appropriate technical and physical safeguards to ensure
30 the privacy and security of data obtained from the
31 system.

1 (d) Preemption.--Political subdivisions of the Commonwealth
2 may not establish a database requiring the submission and query
3 of prescription data by prescribers and dispensers in addition
4 to the database established under section 6.

5 Amend Bill, page 3, line 15, by striking out "in 60 days."

6 and inserting

7 as follows:

8 (1) This section shall take effect immediately.

9 (2) The addition of section 9(d) of the act shall take
10 effect immediately.

11 (3) The remainder of this act shall take effect in 60
12 days.
