1	Amend Bill, page 1, line 7, by inserting after "system"
2 3	; and, in terms and courses of study, providing for pandemic of 2020
4	Amend Bill, page 28, by inserting between lines 12 and 13
5	Section 4. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
6	Section 1501.8. Pandemic of 2020(a) This section applies
7	<u>only to the school year 2019-2020 as a result of the global</u>
8	pandemic declared by the World Health Organization on March 11,
9	<u>2020.</u>
10	(b) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary,
11	the following shall apply:
12	(1) The requirement under section 1501 requiring all school
13	<u>entities to be kept open each school year for at least one</u>
14	hundred eighty (180) instructional days is waived immediately.
15	(2) The secretary may do any or all of the following:
16	<u>(i) Order the closure of all school entities until the</u>
17	threat to health and safety caused by the pandemic of 2020 has
18	ended.
19	<u>(ii) Increase the number of flexible instructional days that</u>
20	<u>school entities may institute under section 1506 to a number of</u>
21	flexible instructional days determined by the secretary during
22	the 2019-2020 school year and waive the application deadline
23	<u>under section 1506(c)(1).</u>
24	<u>(iii) Waive the minimum total number of hours required for a</u>
25	<u>career and technical education program under 22 Pa. Code §</u>
26	<u>339.22(9)(i) (relating to program content).</u>
27	<u>(iv) Waive the requirement to include performance data</u>
28	<u>otherwise required under section 1123(b)(1)(ii) in a</u>
29	professional employe's performance rating under section 1123.
30	<u>(v) Waive the minimum number of days of prekindergarten</u>
31	<u>instruction required under 22 Pa. Code § 405.41 (relating to</u>
32	<u>school term).</u>
33	<u>(vi) Waive the twelve-week student teacher requirement under</u>
34	<u>22 Pa. Code § 354.25(f) (relating to preparation program</u>
35	curriculum) for educator preparation programs that are unable to
36	meet the regulatory requirement due to the pandemic of 2020.
37	(vii) Waive the NIMS assessment and the NOCTI exam.

1	(c) Notwithstanding the provisions under subsection (b), the
2	following shall apply:
3	(1) No employe of any school entity who was employed as of
4	March 13, 2020, shall receive more or less compensation than the
5	employe would otherwise have been entitled to receive from the
6	school entity had the pandemic of 2020 not occurred, had the
7	minimum instructional day requirement not been waived under
8	
9	subsection (b) (1) or had the secretary not taken action under
	subsection (b) (2).
10	(2) No employe of any school entity who was employed as of
11	March 13, 2020, shall receive more or less credit or contribute
12	more or less than the employe would otherwise have contributed
13	pursuant to the Public School Employees' Retirement Code under
14	24 Pa.C.S. Pt. IV (relating to retirement for school employees)
15	had the pandemic of 2020 not occurred, had the minimum
16	<u>instructional day requirement not been waived under subsection</u>
17	<u>(b)(1) or had the secretary not taken action under subsection</u>
18	<u>(b) (2) .</u>
19	<u>(3) Each school entity shall provide any employe who is</u>
20	responsible for cleaning school facilities as a result of, or
21	during the threat to health and safety caused by, the pandemic
22	of 2020, with appropriate cleaning materials and protective
23	clothing and gear as recommended by the Centers for Disease
24	Control and Prevention.
25	(4) Each school entity shall provide written notice to the
26	parent or guardian of each student who receives services under
27	an Individualized Education Program under the Individuals with
28	Disabilities Education Act (Public Law 91-230, 20 U.S.C. § 1400
29	et seq.) (IDEA) of the school entity's plans for ensuring the
30	student receives a free and appropriate public education as
31	required under IDEA.
32	<u>(5) Each school entity shall make a good faith effort to</u>
33	<u>plan to offer continuity of education to students using</u>
34	alternative means during the period of closure. The Department
35	<u>of Education shall provide guidance to school entities and </u>
36	<u>intermediate units may provide technical assistance. A school</u>
37	entity shall submit the plan to the Department of Education. The
38	school entity shall post the plan on its publicly accessible
39	Internet website.
40	(d) A school entity which was closed as a result of the
41	pandemic of 2020 may not receive less subsidy payments,
42	reimbursements, allocations, tuition or other payments from the
43	Department of Education or another school entity than the school
44	entity would otherwise be entitled to receive for the school
45	year 2019-2020 had the pandemic of 2020 not occurred, had the
46	minimum instructional day requirement not been waived under
47	subsection (b)(1) or had the secretary not taken action under
48	subsection (b) (2). For the time period a charter school,
49	regional charter school or cyber charter school is closed due to
50	the 2020 pandemic, the charter school, regional charter school
51	or cyber charter school shall receive tuition payments based

1	<u>upon the enrollment as of March 13, 2020.</u>
2	(e) The secretary shall apply to the United States
3	Department of Education for a waiver of the testing and
4	accountability requirements of the Elementary and Secondary
5	<u>Education Act of 1965 (Public Law 89-10, 20 U.S.C. § 6301 et</u>
6	seq.), as amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act (Public Law
7	114-95, 129 Stat. 1802), to allow the cancellation of testing
8	for the 2019-2020 school year.
9	(f) The governing body of a school entity may apply to the
10	secretary for a waiver, in the form and manner prescribed by the
11	secretary, of any provision of this act, the regulation of the
12	State Board of Education or the standards of the Department of
13	Education, excluding sections 528, 1124 and 1125.1, if the
14	waiver is directly related to the school entity's staffing needs
15	or impacts the school entity's instructional program or
16	operations as a result of the pandemic of 2020. The secretary
17	shall have 30 days from the receipt of the application to
18	approve or disapprove the request. The secretary's determination
19	related to a waiver request under this subsection shall not be
20	appealable under 2 Pa.C.S. (relating to administrative law and
21	procedure).
22	(q) Beginning on the effective date of this subsection and
23	notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, each
24	professional educator's current continuing professional
25	education compliance period under section 1205.2 or 1205.5 shall
26	<u>be extended by one year. This subsection shall apply only to</u>
27	professional educators with an active certification as of the
28	effective date of this subsection and shall expire one year from
29	the effective date of this subsection.
30	(h) Any waiver of Federal requirements sought as a result of
31	the pandemic of 2020 shall not be subject to the requirements of
32	section 126.
33	<u>(i) The following shall apply to nonpublic schools for the</u>
34	<u>2019-2020 school year:</u>
35	<u>(1) The governing body of a nonpublic school may close the</u>
36	nonpublic school due to the threat to health and safety caused
37	by the pandemic of 2020.
38	<u>(2) The minimum instructional time requirements of section</u>
39	<u>1327(b) shall not apply.</u>
40	(j) The following shall apply:
41	(1) The minimum instructional time requirements of section
42	1327.1 shall not apply.
43	(2) The requirements to administer a nationally normed
44	standardized achievement test or Statewide test under section
45	1327.1(e)(1) and conduct the annual evaluations under section
46	<u>1327.1(e)(2) and (h.1) shall not apply.</u>
47	(k) A private or nonpublic school which was closed because
48	of the 2020 pandemic may not receive more or less payment from
49	school entities for any student placed by a school entity and
50	enrolled as of March 13, 2020, as long as the private or
51	nonpublic school is offering continuity of education during the

1	<u>period of closure.</u>
2	(1) The following shall apply:
3	<u>(1) Each school entity may renegotiate a contract for</u>
4	<u>school bus transportation services to ensure contracted</u>
5	personnel and fixed costs, including administrative and
6	equipment, are maintained during the period of school
7	closure. During the period of school closure, the school bus
8	transportation contractor shall submit weekly documentation
9	to the school entity that its complement levels remain at or
10	above the level on March 13, 2020, in order to continue being
11	paid.
12	(2) Notwithstanding any other provision of this act, if
13	<u>a school entity continues to pay a school bus transportation</u>
14	contractor or operates its own school bus transportation, the
15	school entity shall be eligible for reimbursement from the
16	<u>Department of Education at a rate the school entity would</u>
17	have received had the pandemic of 2020 not occurred, had the
18	<u>minimum instruction days requirement not been waived under</u>
19	subsection (b)(1) or had the secretary not taken action under
20	subsection (b)(2).
21	<u>(m) A private residential rehabilitative institution that</u>
22	was closed because of the 2020 pandemic may not receive less
23	payment from school entities or the Commonwealth for any student
24	<u>enrolled as of March 13, 2020.</u>
25	(n) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
26	shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless
27	<u>the context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
28	"NIMS assessment." An assessment based on the National
29	Institute for Metalworking Skills standards.
30	"NOCTI exam." A National Occupational Competency Testing
31	Institute exam.
32	"School entity." Any school district, intermediate unit,
33	area career and technical school, charter school, cyber charter
34	school or regional charter school a child attends in order to
35	fulfill the compulsory attendance requirements of this act.
