- 10 Section 1. Title 51 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 11 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
- 12 § 506.1. Use of Pennsylvania National Guard for special State 13 duty.
- (a) Authorization. -- The Governor may place, or delegate 14
- authority to the Adjutant General to order, any volunteer member 15
- 16 of the Pennsylvania National Guard or, if unavailable due to
- call or order into the service of the United States, any member 17
- of the Pennsylvania Guard on special State duty to respond to 18
- community needs, support Commonwealth functions and ceremonies, 19
- participate in courts-martial and board functions, support State 20
- and local governments and designated critical infrastructure 21
- 22 with cybersecurity functional support and nongovernmental and
- 23 educational institutions with cyber training or exercises and
- 24 perform other necessary military duties to the extent that money
- 25 is appropriated and available for special State duty.
- 26 (b) Report. --
- 27 (1) If members of the Pennsylvania National Guard or Pennsylvania Guard are ordered to special State duty in 28
- 29 support of Federal, State and local cybersecurity functions,
- operations or training or exercise support, the Governor 30
- shall annually, by April 1, submit a report to the General 31
- Assembly setting forth the following, which shall protect the 32
- security of sensitive information: 33
- 34 (i) the types of cybersecurity operations and
- training performed; 35

1 (ii) the name and type of organizations supported; 2 (iii) the number and types of personnel involved; 3 (iv) the types of equipment and systems utilized; 4 <u>and</u> 5 (v) problems encountered in matters of jurisdiction, command and control, hostile encounters and operation 6 7 approval procedures. 8 (2) The report shall include a breakdown of support 9 provided in the normal course of training and support substantially equivalent to training. 10 11 (c) Limitation. -- Special State duty shall not be provided if 12 the provision of the support will adversely affect the ability of the Pennsylvania National Guard or Pennsylvania Guard to 13 perform its primary military-preparedness missions. 14 15 (d) Adjutant General. -- In addition to the powers and duties 16 of the Adjutant General under this title, the Adjutant General is authorized and directed to order members of the Pennsylvania 17 18 National Guard to special State duty under subsection (a). (e) Pay and allowances. -- Officers and enlisted personnel 19 20 ordered on special State duty for which pay is authorized under the order prescribing the performance of duty shall receive the 21 pay and allowances of their respective grades during the time 22 23 the duty is ordered. The pay authorized under this subsection 24 may not be less than \$100 per day. 25 (f) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this 26 subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise: 27 "Special State duty." State military duty by the 28 29 Pennsylvania military forces as authorized under this section. The term does not include active State duty authorized under 30 31 section 508 (relating to active duty for emergency) or duty authorized and funded under 10 U.S.C. (relating to Armed Forces) 32 and 32 U.S.C. (relating to National Guard). 33 Section 2. Repeals are as follows: 34 (1) The General Assembly declares that the repeal under 35 36 paragraph (2) is necessary to effectuate the addition of 51 37 Pa.C.S. § 506.1. 38 (2) Section 1415 of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, 39

- No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, is 40 repealed.
- Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days. 41
