

AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL NO. 1152

1 Amend Bill, page 2, lines 6 through 9, by striking out "The
2 Washington/Baltimore High Intensity Drug" in line 6, all of
3 lines 7 and 8 and "(2)" in line 9

4 Amend Bill, page 2, line 10, by striking out "(3)" and
5 inserting

7 Amend Bill, page 3, by inserting between lines 18 and 19

8 (3) Ensure access to collected data, in the form of raw
9 data, dashboards and useful exportable reports, by State,
10 county and local governmental, public health and public
11 safety stakeholders to real time data that may be used to
12 make actionable decisions in as close to real-time as
13 possible.

14 (4) Send automatic and immediate overdose spike-alerts
15 to preapproved State, county and local governmental, public
16 health and public safety leaders who may use the notification
17 to make decisions regarding how to respond to overdose
18 anomalies in their areas of responsibility. Initial
19 recommended spike thresholds shall be established using
20 relevant public health data. Local leaders shall have the
21 option to adjust the local spike threshold to fit the local
22 response plan needs.

23 (5) Share examples of the spike-response framework with
24 State, county and local leaders and support the leaders in
25 the implementation of the responses by providing access to
26 overdose data and useful reports based on the data.

27 (6) Using an application programming interface, connect
28 the data in the Pennsylvania State Police system with the
29 Overdose Mapping Application Program created by the
30 Washington-Baltimore High Intensity Drug Trafficking Areas.

6 If an individual is experiencing a confirmed or suspected

8 individual required to report under this subsection, medical
9 personnel at the receiving medical facility shall report
10 information about the overdose under this section.
