12	WHEREAS, Hundreds of thousands of homeowners and renters will
13	see additional increases in the cost of heating their homes or
14	apartments unless action is taken to halt the current trend; and
15	WHEREAS, These increases affect not only Pennsylvania's

families but Pennsylvania's economy; therefore be it RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania urge the Congress of the United States to use any and all resources at its disposal to reduce the burden that high gas and electrical home heating costs have placed on Pennsylvania residents during the present home heating price crisis.
