AN ACT

To provide from the General Fund for the expenses of the Executive and Judicial Departments, the State Government 2 3 Support Agencies and the General Assembly of the Commonwealth, the public debt and the public schools for the 4 5 fiscal year July 1, 2017, to June 30, 2018, for certain institutions and organizations, and for the payment of bills 6 7 incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2017; to provide appropriations from the 8 State Lottery Fund, the Tobacco Settlement Fund, the Aviation 9 Restricted Account, the Hazardous Material Response Fund, The 10 State Stores Fund, the Milk Marketing Fund, the Home 11 Investment Trust Fund, the Emergency Medical Services 12 Operating Fund, the Tuition Account Guaranteed Savings 13 Program Fund, the Banking Fund, the Firearm Records Check 14 Fund, the Ben Franklin Technology Development Authority Fund, 15 the Oil and Gas Lease Fund, the Home Improvement Account, the 16 Cigarette Fire Safety and Firefighter Protection Act 17 Enforcement Fund, the Commonwealth Financing Authority Debt 18 Service Restricted Revenue Account, the Insurance Regulation 19 and Oversight Fund, the Pennsylvania Racehorse Development 20 Restricted Receipt Account, the Justice Reinvestment Fund and 21 the Multimodal Transportation Fund to the Executive 22 Department; to provide appropriations from the Judicial 23 24 Computer System Augmentation Account to the Judicial 25 Department for the fiscal year July 1, 2017, to June 30, 2018; to provide appropriations from the Motor License Fund 26 for the fiscal year July 1, 2017, to June 30, 2018, for the 27 proper operation of several departments of the Commonwealth 28 and the Pennsylvania State Police authorized to spend Motor 29 License Fund money; to provide for the appropriation of 30 31 Federal funds to the Executive Department of the Commonwealth 32 and for the payment of bills remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2017. 33

- 24 workers' compensation, insurance premiums on policies of
- 25 liability insurance, insurance premiums on medical payment
- 26 insurance and surety bonds for volunteer workers, premiums on
- 27 employee group life insurance and employee and retired employee
- 28 group hospital and medical insurance, payment of Commonwealth
- 29 share of Social Security taxes and unemployment compensation
- 30 costs for State employees, the purchase of replacement or
