A RESOLUTION

1 Requesting the President and the Congress of the United States
2 to use appropriate diplomatic channels to prevent the
3 construction of a Soviet-built nuclear reactor in Cuba.

4 WHEREAS, The recent nuclear accident at Chernobyl, the
5 Ukraine, U.S.S.R., has raised international concern over the
6 Soviet Union's less than forthright manner of disseminating
7 accurate and timely information regarding the incident; and

8 WHEREAS, Radioactivity issued from nuclear accidents heeds no
9 national boundaries and threatens the health, safety and welfare
10 of the entire world; and

11 WHEREAS, There have been reports that the Soviet Union
12 intends to construct a nuclear reactor in Cuba, 90 miles from
13 the United States; therefore be it

14 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives request the
15 President and the Congress of the United States to use
16 appropriate diplomatic channels to prevent the construction of
17 Soviet-built nuclear reactors in Cuba; and be it further

18 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to

1 the President of the United States, to the presiding officers of
2 each house of Congress and to each member of Congress from
3 Pennsylvania.
