INTRODUCED AS NONCONTROVERSIAL RESOLUTION UNDER RULE 35, DECEMBER 9, 2013

A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the Philadelphia Fire Department for 277 continuous
- years of providing fire protection and countless acts of
- bravery and heroism in serving the people and visitors of the
- 4 City of Brotherly Love.
- 5 WHEREAS, The Philadelphia Fire Department has served the
- 6 residents and visitors of the city since December 7, 1736; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Benjamin Franklin brought a group of 30 men together
- 8 on that date to form the Union Fire Company, the first organized
- 9 volunteer firefighting company within Philadelphia; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The equipment of the first Union Fire Company
- 11 included leather buckets with strong bags and baskets for
- 12 packing and transporting goods, which were taken to every fire;
- 13 and
- 14 WHEREAS, Mr. Franklin and his newly formed firefighting
- 15 brigade met monthly to discuss fire prevention and firefighting

- 1 methods, which included mandating all homeowners to have leather
- 2 firefighting buckets within their houses; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The efforts by Mr. Franklin and his firefighting
- 4 cohorts within the Union Fire Company inspired other men to form
- 5 their own companies in other neighborhoods within the city,
- 6 which, within a short span of time, brought about the formation
- 7 of the Heart-in-Hand, the Britannia, the Fellowship and other
- 8 fire companies; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The work of the volunteer firefighting companies,
- 10 coupled with the matchless leadership of Mr. Franklin, helped
- 11 alleviate the frantic fright the threat of fire created and
- 12 caused Philadelphia to quickly become one of the world's safest
- 13 cities in terms of fire damage; and
- 14 WHEREAS, In the late 1860s, city officials spoke of
- 15 transforming the volunteer service that had provided great
- 16 protection into a professional fire department to meet the ever-
- 17 growing needs of an expanding city stepping into an industrial
- 18 age; and
- 19 WHEREAS, In December 1870, a council meeting took place that
- 20 included approval of an ordinance to establish a professional
- 21 fire department, bringing forth the birth of the current
- 22 Philadelphia Fire Department; and
- 23 WHEREAS, The Philadelphia Fire Department responded to a
- 24 combined total of 277,636 emergency incidents in 2011; and
- 25 WHEREAS, Nearly 230,000 of the combined total calls in 2011
- 26 involved emergency medical incidents, and nearly 48,000 of those
- 27 calls involved responses for fire and other 911 emergency public
- 28 safety service requests; and
- 29 WHEREAS, Throughout the years, the Philadelphia Fire
- 30 Department has provided outstanding and dedicated service to its

- 1 residents and visitors, and its firefighters have shown in
- 2 countless ways their bravery and heroism in protecting life and
- 3 property within the City of Brotherly Love; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Many firefighters with the Philadelphia Fire
- 5 Department have sacrificed their lives in the line of duty; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Those who have given their lives in 2012 include
- 7 Robert P. Neary and Daniel Sweeney and in 2013 Battalion Chief
- 8 Michael Goodwin; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The Philadelphia Fire Department works to prevent as
- 10 well as combat fire within the city in order to protect lives;
- 11 and
- 12 WHEREAS, During 2012, members of the Philadelphia Fire
- 13 Department visited 7,745 homes and installed 18,966 smoke alarms
- 14 as part of its "Freedom from Fire, Building a Safe Environment
- 15 through Community Risk Reduction" effort; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The Philadelphia Fire Department, with the help of
- 17 Drexel University, developed a fire safety application that
- 18 provides fire and life safety information to help educate the
- 19 public; and
- WHEREAS, The combined strategy of conducting home visits,
- 21 installing smoke alarms and providing fire and life safety
- 22 education has contributed to a downward trend of fire fatalities
- 23 within the city and resulted in the lowest number of fire
- 24 fatalities in the Philadelphia Fire Department's recorded
- 25 history; and
- 26 WHEREAS, The Philadelphia Fire Department recently presented
- 27 the 2013 "Firefighter of the Year" award to Firefighter Brandon
- 28 Mlodzinski for his valiant efforts and dedicated service in the
- 29 rescue of three young children in a storm-surged Atlantic City
- 30 surf; therefore be it

- 1 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize and
- 2 honor the Philadelphia Fire Department upon its 277th
- 3 anniversary on December 7, 2013, its founder Benjamin Franklin
- 4 and the other members who formed the city's Union Fire Company;
- 5 and be it further
- 6 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize and
- 7 honor the current Philadelphia Fire Department upon the 143rd
- 8 anniversary of its formal creation by the Philadelphia City
- 9 Council; and be it further
- 10 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 11 sacrifices of the department over the years in protecting life
- 12 and property in the city, including the loss of firefighters
- 13 Robert P. Neary and Daniel Sweeney in 2012 and Battalion Chief
- 14 Michael Goodwin in 2013; and be it further
- 15 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives join with the
- 16 City of Philadelphia in congratulating Firefighter Brandon
- 17 Mlodzinski for being named by the selection committee from
- 18 Fireman's Hall as the 2013 "Firefighter of the Year."
