AN ACT

- Amending Title 66 (Public Utilities) of the Pennsylvania
- Consolidated Statutes, in powers and duties of commission, 2
- providing for pipeline siting review. 3
- The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 4
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Title 66 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
- § 531. Pipeline siting review. 8
- (a) Commission duties. -- The commission shall, within 18 9
- 10 months of the effective date of this section, adopt regulations
- 11 regarding the siting of the new construction of pipelines.
- 12 (b) Pipeline siting application. -- Prior to the new
- 13 construction of pipelines or pipeline construction projects
- described under subsection (a), a public utility shall submit an 14
- 15 application to the commission for authorization regarding the
- 16 siting of the pipeline to be constructed.
- 17 (c) Application contents. -- Applications submitted under
- 18 subsection (b) shall include:
- (1) The name and address of the public utility proposing 19

- 1 the pipeline and the name and contact information for the
- 2 <u>pipeline's representative for purposes of communication</u>
- 3 <u>regarding the application.</u>
- 4 (2) A general description of the proposed route of the
- 5 pipeline, to include the number of route miles, the right-of-
- 6 way width and the location of the proposed pipeline within
- 7 <u>each city, borough, town and township traversed.</u>
- 8 (3) The names of known persons, corporations and other
- 9 <u>entities of record owning property within the proposed right-</u>
- 10 <u>of-way, together with an indication of the pipeline rights-</u>
- of-way acquired by the public utility.
- 12 <u>(4) A statement of the safety considerations that will</u>
- 13 <u>be incorporated into the design, construction and maintenance</u>
- of the proposed pipeline.
- 15 (5) A description of studies that have been made as to
- the projected environmental impact of the pipeline as
- 17 <u>proposed and of the efforts which have been and which will be</u>
- 18 made to minimize the impact of the pipeline upon the
- 19 environment and scenic and historic areas, including, but not
- limited to, impacts, where applicable, upon land use, soil
- 21 and sedimentation, plant and wildlife habitats, terrain,
- 22 hydrology and landscape.
- 23 (6) A description of the efforts of the public utility
- 24 to locate and identify archeologic, geologic, historic,
- 25 scenic or wilderness areas of significance within two miles
- of the proposed right-of-way and the location and identity of
- 27 the areas discovered by the public utility.
- 28 (7) A general description of reasonable alternative
- 29 routes to the proposed pipeline, including a description of
- the corridor planning methodology, a comparison of the merits

	and detriments of each route and a statement of the reasons
)	for selecting the proposed pipeline route.
3	(8) A list of the Federal, State and local governmental
ŀ	agencies that have requirements to be met in connection with
	the construction or maintenance of the proposed pipeline and
	a list of documents that have been or are required to be
	filed with those agencies in connection with the siting and
	construction of the proposed pipeline.
	(9) A list of the governing bodies of the municipalities
	through which the proposed pipeline will be located.
	(10) A description of the product or material to be
	transported through the proposed pipeline.
	(11) The estimated cost of construction of the proposed
	pipeline and the projected date for completion.
	(12) A general statement of the need for the proposed
	pipeline in meeting identified present and future demands for
	service and of how the proposed pipeline will meet that need
	and of the engineering justifications for the proposed
	pipeline.
	(13) Any other information, documentation, exhibits or
	maps required by the commission.
	(d) Service of application and notice of filing
	(1) A public utility shall file the original application
	under subsection (b) with the commission accompanied by an
	affidavit of service showing the identity of those served
	under paragraphs (2) and (3).
	(2) At the time of filing, the public utility shall
	serve a copy of the application upon the following:
	(i) The chief executive officer, the governing body
	and the body charged with the duty of planning land use

	in each municipality in which any portion of the pipeline
	is proposed to be located.
	(ii) The Secretary of Environmental Protection.
	(iii) The local coordinators of any local emergency
	management organizations in the areas in which the
	proposed pipeline route will be located.
	(3) At the time of filing, the public utility shall
1	serve a notice of filing and a map of suitable detail showing
-	the proposed route of the proposed pipeline upon the
-	following:
	(i) The Secretary of Transportation.
	(ii) The Chairman of the Historical and Museum
	Commission.
	(iii) Other Federal, State and local agencies
	designated in subsection (c)(8).
	(iv) The persons, corporations and other entities
	designated in subsection (c)(3).
	(4) The notice of filing shall contain a statement
	identifying the filing, the date on which the filing was or
2	is to be made, a description of the proposed pipeline, a
9	description of the product or material to be transported
	through the proposed pipeline, the number of route miles, the
-	right-of-way width and the location of the proposed pipeline
1	vithin each municipality traversed and a statement that a
(copy of the application is available for public examination
3	as provided in paragraph (5).
	(5) On the day of filing of the application, the public
1	atility shall make a copy of the application available for
]	oublic examination on the public utility's publicly
<u>.</u>	accessible Internet website or during ordinary business hours

- 1 at a convenient location within any county in which a part of
- 2 <u>the proposed pipeline will be located.</u>
- 3 (e) Hearing and notice.--
- 4 (1) Upon filing of an application, the commission shall
- 5 set the time and place for at least two public hearings in
- 6 <u>each county in which a portion of the pipeline is proposed to</u>
- 7 be located.
- 8 (2) The public utility shall publish for two consecutive
- 9 <u>weeks a notice of hearings in a newspaper of general</u>
- 10 <u>circulation within each municipality in which the pipeline is</u>
- 11 proposed to be located. The publication of the notice of
- 12 <u>hearings shall begin at least 45 days before the date set for</u>
- the commencement of the hearings. The notice of hearing for
- 14 <u>publication shall contain a brief description of the proposed</u>
- 15 pipeline, the pipeline's location, a statement of the date,
- time and place of the hearing and of the hearing's purpose
- 17 and a statement as to where and when a copy of the
- 18 application will be available for public examination.
- 19 (3) The commission shall notify, and allow the timely
- intervention of, each person or agency designated in
- 21 subsection (d)(2) and (3) of the time and place of the
- 22 hearings on the application and shall notify any other
- 23 <u>parties granted leave to intervene in accordance with</u>
- 24 commission rules or regulations.
- 25 (4) At hearings held under this section, the commission
- shall accept evidence upon, and in the commission's
- determination of the application the commission will consider
- the following matters in consultation with the persons or
- 29 agencies listed in subsection (d)(2), where applicable:
- 30 (i) The present and future necessity of the proposed

1	pipeline in furnishing service to the public.
2	(ii) The safety of the proposed pipeline.
3	(iii) The impact and the efforts which have been and
4	will be made to minimize the impact, if any, of the
5	proposed pipeline upon the following:
6	(A) Land use.
7	(B) Soil and sedimentation.
8	(C) Plant and wildlife habitats.
9	(D) Terrain.
10	(E) Hydrology.
11	(F) Landscape.
12	(G) Archeologic areas.
13	(H) Geologic areas.
14	(I) Historic areas.
15	(J) Scenic areas.
16	(K) Wilderness areas.
17	(L) Scenic rivers.
18	(iv) The availability of reasonable alternative
19	routes.
20	(f) Commission determination
21	(1) The commission shall grant or deny the application,
22	in whole or in part, as filed or upon the terms, conditions
23	or modifications of the location, construction, operation or
24	maintenance of the line as the commission deems appropriate.
25	(2) The commission may not grant the application, either
26	as proposed or as modified, unless the commission finds and
27	determines as to the proposed pipeline that:
28	(i) There is a need for the proposed pipeline.
29	(ii) The proposed pipeline will not create an
30	unreasonable risk of danger to the health and safety of

1	the public.
2	(iii) The proposed pipeline is in compliance with
3	applicable statutes and regulations providing for the
4	protection of the natural resources of this Commonwealth.
5	(iv) The proposed pipeline will have minimum adverse
6	environmental impact, considering the needs of the public
7	for the pipeline, the state of available technology and
8	the available alternatives.
9	(g) Definitions As used in this section, the following
10	words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
11	subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
12	"Pipeline." Includes:
13	(1) A pipeline of a public utility defined in paragraph
14	(1)(v) of the definition of "public utility" in section 102
15	(relating to definitions).
16	(2) A pipeline of a public utility defined in paragraph
17	(1)(i) of the definition of "public utility" in section 102
18	carrying natural or artificial gas, which pipeline has a
19	nominal inside diameter of eight inches or greater.
20	(3) Pipeline construction projects of a public utility
21	with total costs of \$5,000,000 or more.
22	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
