4	The following words and phrases when used in this chapter

7	<u>"Insurer." As follows:</u>
8	(1) An entity that issues or administers health
9	insurance policies or health plans and is subject to the
10	jurisdiction of the department.
11	(2) The term includes an entity organized or existing
12	under, or subject to, any of the following:
13	(i) The act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), known
14	as The Insurance Company Law of 1921.
15	(ii) The act of December 29, 1972 (P.L.1701,
16	No.364), known as the Health Maintenance Organization
17	Act.
18	(iii) The act of May 18, 1976 (P.L.123, No.54),
19	known as the Individual Accident and Sickness Insurance
20	<u>Minimum Standards Act.</u>
21	(iv) Chapter 61 (relating to hospital plan
22	corporations) or 63 (relating to professional health
23	services plan corporations).
24	"HEALTH INSURANCE POLICY." AS FOLLOWS:
25	(1) AN INSURANCE POLICY, SUBSCRIBER CONTRACT,
26	CERTIFICATE OR PLAN THAT PROVIDES MEDICAL OR HEALTH CARE
27	COVERAGE, INCLUDING EMERGENCY SERVICES.
28	(2) THE TERM DOES NOT INCLUDE ANY OF THE FOLLOWING TYPES
29	OF POLICIES:
30	(I) ACCIDENT ONLY.

13	"INSURER." AN ENTITY LICENSED BY THE DEPARTMENT WITH

15	THAT IS OFFERED OR GOVERNED UNDER ANY OF THE FOLLOWING:
16	(1) THE ACT OF MAY 17, 1921 (P.L.682, NO.284), KNOWN AS
17	THE INSURANCE COMPANY LAW OF 1921, INCLUDING SECTION 630 AND
18	ARTICLE XXIV OF THAT ACT.

27	<u>§ 4303. Certification.</u>
28	No later than January 1 of each year, an insurer that issues
29	or administers a health insurance policy or health plan in this
30	Commonwealth, including a policy or plan in which mental health

- 2 other than the insurer, shall file with the department a written-
- 3 certification signed by an officer of the insurer under oath
- 4 <u>attesting that:</u>
- 5 (1) The insurer has completed a comprehensive review of
- 6 <u>all health insurance policies and health plans issued or</u>
- 7 <u>administered by the insurer, including policies and plans in</u>
- 8 which mental health or substance use disorder benefits are
- 9 <u>managed by an entity other than the insurer, for compliance</u>
- 10 <u>with the requirements of MHPAEA and its implementing</u>
- 11 regulations and compliance with section 604-B of the act of
- 12 May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), known as The Insurance
- 13 <u>Company Law of 1921, and its implementing regulations.</u>
- 14 <u>(2) All policies and plans under paragraph (1) comply</u>
- 15 with the laws and regulations referred to in paragraph (1).

- 17 (A) STATEMENT REGARDING MHPAEA COMPLIANCE. -- FOR THE FORM FOR

- 18 EACH HEALTH INSURANCE POLICY OFFERED, ISSUED OR RENEWED BY AN
- 19 INSURER, THE INSURER SHALL ANNUALLY FILE WITH THE DEPARTMENT A
- 20 STATEMENT ATTESTING TO THE INSURER'S DOCUMENTED ANALYSES OF
- 21 EFFORTS TO COMPLY WITH MHPAEA AND THE FEDERAL REGULATIONS
- 22 RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH AND SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER PARITY AS
- 23 OF THE DATE OF THE ATTESTATION.
- 24 (B) STATEMENT REGARDING MHPAEA NONAPPLICABILITY. -- FOR THE
- 25 FORM FOR EACH INSURANCE POLICY OFFERED, ISSUED OR RENEWED BY AN
- 26 INSURER IN THIS COMMONWEALTH THAT IS REQUIRED TO BE FILED BUT TO
- 27 WHICH MHPAEA DOES NOT APPLY, THE INSURER SHALL ANNUALLY FILE
- 28 <u>WITH THE DEPARTMENT A STATEMENT ATTESTING TO THE</u>
- 29 NONAPPLICABILITY OF MHPAEA TO THE POLICY FORM.
