## AN ACT

Amending the act of October 4, 1978 (P.L.883, No.170), entitled 1 2 "An act relating to conflicts of interest involving certain public officials serving in State or State agencies and local 3 4 political subdivision positions and prohibiting certain 5 public employees from engaging in certain conflict of interest activities requiring certain disclosures and 6 providing penalties," further providing for the filing of 7 statements or financial interests BY MEMBERS OF THE JUDICIARY 8 9 OR OTHER JUDICIAL OFFICERS AND for county and municipal 10 offices.

11 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

12 hereby enacts as follows:

14 October 4, 1978 (P.L.883, No.170), referred to as the Public

15 Official and Employee Ethics Law, are amended to read:

16 Section 4. Statement of financial interests required to be

19 SECTION 1. SUBSECTION (E) OF SECTION 3, ACT OF OCTOBER 4,
20 1978 (P.L.883, NO.170), REFERRED TO AS THE PUBLIC OFFICIAL AND

1 EMPLOYEE ETHICS LAW, IS REENACTED TO READ:

2 SECTION 3. RESTRICTED ACTIVITIES.

3 \* \* \*

4 (E) NO FORMER OFFICIAL OR PUBLIC EMPLOYEE SHALL REPRESENT A 5 PERSON, WITH OR WITHOUT COMPENSATION, ON ANY MATTER BEFORE THE 6 GOVERNMENTAL BODY WITH WHICH HE HAS BEEN ASSOCIATED FOR ONE YEAR 7 AFTER HE LEAVES THAT BODY.

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9 SECTION 2. SECTION 4 OF THE ACT IS REENACTED AND AMENDED TO 10 READ:

11 SECTION 4. STATEMENT OF FINANCIAL INTERESTS REQUIRED TO BE 12 FILED.

13 (A) EACH PUBLIC EMPLOYEE EMPLOYED BY THE COMMONWEALTH SHALL FILE A STATEMENT OF FINANCIAL INTERESTS FOR THE PRECEDING 14 15 CALENDAR YEAR WITH THE DEPARTMENT, AGENCY OR BUREAU IN WHICH HE IS EMPLOYED NO LATER THAN MAY 1 OF EACH YEAR THAT HE HOLDS SUCH 16 17 A POSITION AND OF THE YEAR AFTER HE LEAVES SUCH A POSITION. ANY 18 OTHER PUBLIC EMPLOYEE SHALL FILE A STATEMENT OF FINANCIAL 19 INTERESTS WITH THE GOVERNING AUTHORITY OF THE POLITICAL 20 SUBDIVISION BY WHICH HE IS EMPLOYED NO LATER THAN MAY 1 OF EACH 21 YEAR THAT HE HOLDS SUCH A POSITION AND OF THE YEAR AFTER HE 22 LEAVES SUCH A POSITION.

23 (b) Each candidate for public office except county and 24 municipal offices shall file a statement of financial interests 25 for the preceding calendar year with the commission prior to 26 filing a petition to appear on the ballot for election as a public official. A petition to appear on the ballot for a public 27 28 office other than county and municipal offices shall not be 29 accepted by an election official unless the petition includes an 30 affidavit that the candidate has filed the required statement of - 2 -19810H2023B2916

financial interests with the commission. Each candidate for a 1 county or municipal office shall file a statement of financial 2 3 interests for the preceding calendar year with the county 4 election board at the time of or prior to filing a petition to 5 appear on the ballot for election as a local public official. A petition to appear on the ballot for a county or municipal 6 7 office shall not be accepted by an election official unless the petition is accompanied by the financial statement or the 8 9 petition includes an affidavit that the candidate has filed the 10 required statement of financial interests with the board. \* \* \* 11 (C) EACH CANDIDATE FOR PUBLIC OFFICE NOMINATED BY A PUBLIC 12 13 OFFICIAL OR GOVERNMENTAL BODY AND SUBJECT TO CONFIRMATION BY A PUBLIC OFFICIAL OR GOVERNMENTAL BODY SHALL FILE A STATEMENT OF 14 FINANCIAL INTERESTS FOR THE PRECEDING CALENDAR YEAR WITH THE 15

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16 COMMISSION AND WITH THE OFFICIAL OR BODY THAT IS VESTED WITH THE 17 POWER OF CONFIRMATION AT LEAST TEN DAYS BEFORE THE OFFICIAL OR 18 BODY SHALL APPROVE OR REJECT THE NOMINATION.

(d) No public official shall be allowed to take the oath of office or enter or continue upon his duties, nor shall he receive compensation from public funds, unless he has filed a statement of financial interests [with the commission] as required by this act.

(e) (1) Any candidate for State [or county-wide] public
office shall file a statement of financial interests with the
commission pursuant to this act and shall file a copy of that
statement with the Board of Elections in the county in which
the candidate resides.

29 (2) Any candidate for <u>county-wide or</u> local office shall 30 file a statement of financial interests [with the commission] 19810H2023B2916 - 3 - pursuant to this act and shall file a copy of that statement with the governing authority of the political subdivision in which he is a candidate <u>or with the Board of Elections in the</u> <u>county in which the candidate resides</u>, as the case may be.

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6 Section 2. This act shall take effect January 1, 1983.

7 (F) ALL STATEMENTS OF FINANCIAL INTEREST FILED PURSUANT TO
8 THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ACT SHALL BE MADE AVAILABLE FOR PUBLIC
9 INSPECTION AND COPYING DURING REGULAR OFFICE HOURS.

SECTION 3. SECTION 5 OF THE ACT IS REENACTED TO READ:
 SECTION 5. STATEMENT OF FINANCIAL INTERESTS.

12 (A) THE STATEMENT OF FINANCIAL INTERESTS FILED PURSUANT TO 13 THIS ACT SHALL BE ON A FORM PRESCRIBED BY THE COMMISSION AND 14 SHALL BE SIGNED UNDER PENALTY OF PERJURY BY THE PERSON REQUIRED 15 TO FILE THE STATEMENT.

16 (B) THE STATEMENT SHALL INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION
17 FOR THE PRIOR CALENDAR YEAR WITH REGARD TO THE PERSON REQUIRED
18 TO FILE THE STATEMENT AND THE MEMBERS OF HIS IMMEDIATE FAMILY.

19 (1) THE NAME, ADDRESS AND POSITION OF THE PERSON20 REQUIRED TO FILE THE STATEMENT.

(2) THE OCCUPATIONS OR PROFESSIONS OF THE PERSON
 REQUIRED TO FILE THE STATEMENT AND THOSE OF HIS IMMEDIATE
 FAMILY.

(3) ANY DIRECT OR INDIRECT INTEREST IN ANY REAL ESTATE
WHICH WAS SOLD OR LEASED TO THE COMMONWEALTH, ANY OF ITS
AGENCIES OR POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS; PURCHASED OR LEASED FROM
THE COMMONWEALTH, ANY OF ITS AGENCIES OR POLITICAL
SUBDIVISIONS; OR WHICH WAS THE SUBJECT OF ANY CONDEMNATION
PROCEEDINGS BY THE COMMONWEALTH, ANY OF ITS AGENCIES OR
POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS.

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(4) THE NAME AND ADDRESS OF EACH CREDITOR TO WHOM IS
 OWED IN EXCESS OF \$5,000 AND THE INTEREST RATE THEREON.
 HOWEVER, LOANS OR CREDIT EXTENDED BETWEEN MEMBERS OF THE
 IMMEDIATE FAMILY AND MORTGAGES SECURING REAL PROPERTY WHICH
 IS THE PRINCIPAL RESIDENCE OF THE PERSON FILING OR OF HIS
 SPOUSE SHALL NOT BE INCLUDED.

7 (5) THE NAME AND ADDRESS OF ANY PERSON WHO IS THE DIRECT
8 OR INDIRECT SOURCE OF INCOME TOTALLING IN THE AGGREGATE \$500
9 OR MORE. HOWEVER, THIS PROVISION SHALL NOT BE CONSTRUED TO
10 REQUIRE THE DIVULGENCE OF CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION PROTECTED
11 BY STATUTE OR EXISTING PROFESSIONAL CODES OF ETHICS.

12 (6) THE NAME AND ADDRESS OF ANY PERSON FROM WHOM A GIFT
13 OR GIFTS VALUED IN THE AGGREGATE AT \$200 OR MORE WERE
14 RECEIVED, AND THE VALUE AND THE CIRCUMSTANCES OF EACH GIFT.
15 HOWEVER, THIS PROVISION SHALL NOT BE APPLICABLE TO GIFTS
16 RECEIVED FROM THE INDIVIDUAL'S SPOUSE, PARENTS, PARENTS BY
17 MARRIAGE, SIBLINGS, CHILDREN OR GRANDCHILDREN.

18 (7) THE SOURCE OF ANY HONORARIUM RECEIVED WHICH IS IN
19 EXCESS OF \$100.

20 (8) ANY OFFICE, DIRECTORSHIP OR EMPLOYMENT OF ANY NATURE
21 WHATSOEVER IN ANY BUSINESS ENTITY.

22 (9) ANY FINANCIAL INTEREST IN ANY LEGAL ENTITY ENGAGED23 IN BUSINESS FOR PROFIT.

(C) THE STATEMENT OF FINANCIAL INTEREST NEED NOT INCLUDE 24 25 SPECIFIC AMOUNTS FOR ANY OF THE ITEMS REQUIRED TO BE LISTED. 26 SECTION 4. THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF 27 PENNSYLVANIA, FULLY AWARE OF THE IMPACT AND EFFECT OF THE 28 DECISION OF THE SUPREME COURT OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF 29 PENNSYLVANIA IN WAJERT V STATE ETHICS COMMISSION (491PA.255) AND 30 THE DECISIONS OF THE COMMONWEALTH COURT IN KREMER V STATE ETHICS - 5 -19810H2023B2916

COMMISSION ET AL. (56 COMMONWEALTH CT. 160) AND BALLOU V STATE
 ETHICS COMMISSION ET AL. (56 COMMONWEALTH CT. 240), DECLARES
 THAT IT IS THE INTENT OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY THAT THE
 PROVISIONS OF THE ACT OF OCTOBER 4, 1978 (P.L.883, NO.170) SHALL
 APPLY TO ALL MEMBERS OF THE JUDICIARY, OTHER JUDICIAL OFFICERS
 AND SOLICITORS.

7 SECTION 5. THIS ACT SHALL TAKE EFFECT JANUARY 1, 1983.
