(3) Unless otherwise provided by law, a contract entered 3 into by a Commonwealth agency involving real property 4 5 interests in which the Commonwealth agency is the respondent. (4) Property disputes between the Department of 6 7 Transportation and the Department of Conservation and Natural <u>Resources or between the Department of Transportation and the</u> 8 9 Pennsylvania Game Commission when land is required for a 10 public project. * * * 11
