A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing the month of August 2014 as "National Immunization Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Immunization is one of the most significant public
- 4 health achievements of the 20th century; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The United States has eradicated smallpox and polio
- 6 and seen the incidence of measles, pertussis and diphtheria fall
- 7 by more than 98% since the discovery of vaccinations; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Vaccines are available for hepatitis A, hepatitis B,
- 9 influenza, diphtheria, cervical cancer (HPV), measles,
- 10 meningococcal, mumps, pertussis, pneumococcal disease, polio,
- 11 rabies, shingles, smallpox, tetanus, tuberculosis, typhoid
- 12 fever, varicella, yellow fever and several other diseases; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Throughout the world, 1.7 million children die
- 14 annually from diseases that could have been prevented with
- 15 readily available vaccinations; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Only 77% of children in the United States have
- 17 received all of the recommended vaccinations; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Annually, 50,000 adults die in the United States
- 2 from diseases that could have been prevented with readily
- 3 available vaccinations; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Pneumonia and influenza are the fifth leading cause
- 5 of death among adults 65 years of age or older; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Less than 70% of adults 65 years of age or older are
- 7 vaccinated for both pneumonia and influenza; and
- 8 WHEREAS, August is the ideal month for children to receive
- 9 immunizations before school begins; therefore be it
- 10 RESOLVED, That the Senate:
- 11 (1) support the goals and ideals of National
- 12 Immunization Awareness Month;
- 13 (2) encourage local communities to raise awareness
- 14 surrounding the benefits of immunization;
- 15 (3) encourage individuals to receive recommended
- 16 immunizations;
- 17 (4) recognize and salute health care professionals and
- 18 researchers that have facilitated the success of
- immunizations in eradicating and drastically decreasing the
- 20 incidence of several diseases; and
- 21 (5) recognize and reaffirm the nation's commitment to
- 22 continued education surrounding immunization and to
- furthering every available opportunity for the immunization
- of children and adults;
