AN ACT

Providing for formal recognition by the Governor of Native
American bands or clans, nations and tribes indigenous to
Pennsylvania; providing for certification of Native American
organizations; establishing the Commission on Native American
Affairs; conferring powers and imposing duties on the
Department of Community and Economic Development; and
imposing a penalty.

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- 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 10 hereby enacts as follows:
- 11 Section 1. Short title.
- 12 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Native
- 13 American Recognition Act.
- 14 Section 2. Legislative intent.
- 15 The General Assembly finds and declares as follows:
- 16 (1) This Commonwealth has been historically the homeland
- of diverse groups.
- 18 (2) The Commonwealth has a duty and responsibility to
- 19 foster awareness, understanding and appreciation of the many
- and varied contributions to the quality of life made by its
- 21 diverse ethnic communities, including Native Americans.
- 22 (3) It is in the public interest for the Commonwealth
- and its residents to identify, conserve and perpetuate the
- 24 diverse cultural and ethnic heritage of this Commonwealth and
- 25 to promote greater awareness and understanding for the
- 26 education, inspiration and the general public welfare of all
- 27 people, including future generations.
- 28 (4) It is in the shared interest of the Commonwealth and
- 29 groups in Pennsylvania to avoid misrepresentation of Native
- 30 American identity, culture and heritage.

- 1 (5) It is in the shared interest of the Commonwealth and
- 2 groups in this Commonwealth to establish a formal procedure
- 3 to recognize groups indigenous to Pennsylvania and to certify
- 4 Native American organizations.
- 5 (6) Recognition and certification will enable the
- 6 Commonwealth to provide access to Federal programs to
- 7 eligible groups.
- 8 Section 3. Definitions.
- 9 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 10 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 11 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 12 "Band." A sociopolitical division of a tribe, separated from
- 13 the tribe by historical events or geographical, political or
- 14 similar causes.
- "Certification." The process by which the Indian status of a
- 16 Native American organization is approved by the commission for a
- 17 period of two years subject to biennial recertification.
- 18 "Clan." A number of Native Americans related by bloodline
- 19 descent.
- 20 "Commission." The Commission on Native American Affairs
- 21 established in section 4.
- "Committee." A recognition advisory committee established in
- 23 section 11.
- "Delegate." An individual who serves on a committee.
- 25 "Department." The Department of Community and Economic
- 26 Development of the Commonwealth.
- "Group." A band, clan, tribe or nation.
- 28 "Indigenous to Pennsylvania." Having ancestors who inhabited
- 29 one or more specific areas within this Commonwealth before 1790.
- 30 "Members." Those individuals who have been determined by a

- 1 group to be its members according to criteria established by the
- 2 group.
- 3 "Nation." A distinct group of Native Americans, separated
- 4 from other groups by having its own language, history, sacred
- 5 places and rituals, and rooted in and part of the land out of
- 6 which it grew.
- 7 "Native American." Any individual or group that is, or has
- 8 its members descended from, a group which inhabited North
- 9 America before European contact in 1492.
- 10 "Recognition." The process by which the Pennsylvania Indian
- 11 status of a Native American band, clan or tribe is granted by
- 12 the Governor.
- 13 "Tribe." A separate and distinct community of Native
- 14 Americans generally related by blood, marriage or adoption, with
- 15 common cultural ties and interests which differentiate members
- 16 from nonmembers.
- 17 Section 4. Commission.
- 18 (a) Establishment. -- The Commission on Native American
- 19 Affairs is established in the department.
- 20 (b) Commissioners.--
- 21 (1) The commission shall consist of seven commissioners,
- 22 appointed by the Governor, with the consent of a majority of
- the members elected to the Senate.
- 24 (2) Four commissioners must be Native Americans.
- 25 (3) If a commissioner is sentenced for an offense graded
- above a summary offense, the commissioner shall forfeit
- 27 office.
- 28 (4) A commissioner shall serve a term of six years or
- 29 until a successor takes office. A commissioner may serve
- 30 unlimited terms.

- 1 (5) If a commissioner leaves office, a replacement shall
- 2 be appointed and approved under paragraphs (1) and (2) for
- 3 the remainder of the term.
- 4 (c) Quorum. -- Four commissioners constitute a quorum.
- 5 (d) Officers.--The commission shall elect a chairperson from
- 6 among the commissioners.
- 7 (e) Compensation. -- Commissioners shall serve without
- 8 compensation but shall be reimbursed for actual and necessary
- 9 expenses.
- 10 (f) Support. -- The department shall provide staff and support
- 11 services for the commission.
- 12 (q) Powers and duties. -- The commission shall have the
- 13 following powers and duties:
- 14 (1) Administer this act.
- 15 (2) Promulgate regulations and guidelines to implement
- 16 this act.
- 17 Section 5. Eligibility to petition.
- 18 (a) Recognition. -- A group may apply to the commission for
- 19 recognition if the group believes itself to be:
- 20 (1) a Native American band, clan, tribe or nation; and
- 21 (2) indigenous to Pennsylvania.
- 22 (b) Certification. -- A group may apply to the commission for
- 23 certification.
- 24 Section 6. Recognition criteria guidelines.
- 25 The commission shall promulgate guidelines specifying the
- 26 recognition criteria for a petitioning group. The guidelines
- 27 shall be based on whether the petitioning group meets the
- 28 following criteria:
- 29 (1) The petitioning group demonstrates a direct
- 30 genealogical connection to a Native American band, clan,

- tribe or nation that has been documented historically with reasonable certainty as having inhabited lands within the present boundaries of this Commonwealth.
 - (2) The petitioning group possesses formal membership rolls and written standards for membership that are based on an unbroken genealogical descent from a Native American band, clan, tribe or nation that has been documented historically with reasonable certainty as having inhabited lands within the present boundaries of this Commonwealth.
 - (3) The petitioning group demonstrates that the petitioning group is a distinct cultural entity capable of self-regulation by documenting the existence and function of the petitioning group's governmental and social institutions and traditions.
- 15 (4) A substantial portion of the members of the
 16 petitioning group presently inhabit a defined area and the
 17 petitioning group's tribal headquarters are located within
 18 this Commonwealth.
- 19 (5) The members of the petitioning group are a community
 20 that is generally viewed as Native American and culturally
 21 distinct from all other communities surrounding the
 22 petitioning group.
- 23 Section 7. Application process for recognition.
- 24 (a) Compliance with regulations. -- A petition for recognition
- 25 must comply with regulations promulgated by the commission.
- 26 (b) Documentation. -- The commission shall create a list of
- 27 documentation for a petitioning group to submit in order to
- 28 document that the petitioning group meets the criteria specified
- 29 in section 6.

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30 (c) Personal information confidential.--To protect the

- 1 confidential nature of this documentation, the commission shall
- 2 deny inspection or copying of any part of the documentation that
- 3 contains personal information relating to an individual.
- 4 Section 8. Certification criteria.
- 5 The commission shall make a positive recommendation for
- 6 certification of an organization as a Pennsylvania Native
- 7 American organization if the applicant demonstrates that it
- 8 adequately meets the criteria specified in section 6.
- 9 Section 9. Application process for certification.
- 10 (a) Compliance with regulations. -- A petition for
- 11 certification must comply with regulations promulgated by the
- 12 commission.
- 13 (b) Documentation. -- The commission shall create a list of
- 14 documentation for the petitioning group to submit in order to
- 15 document that the petitioning group meets the criteria specified
- 16 in section 6.
- 17 (c) Duration of certification.--Certification of Native
- 18 American organization status shall be in effect for a period of
- 19 five years. Organizations may reapply to renew their
- 20 certification.
- 21 Section 10. Notice of filing.
- Upon receipt of a complete application for recognition or
- 23 certification, including payment of any required fees, the
- 24 commission shall transmit notice of filing of the petition to
- 25 the Legislative Reference Bureau for publication in the next
- 26 available issue of the Pennsylvania Bulletin. Persons or groups
- 27 wishing to support or challenge a petition must provide written
- 28 comments within 30 days of the filing of the notice in the
- 29 Pennsylvania Bulletin.
- 30 Section 11. Recognition advisory committee.

- 1 (a) Convening of committee. -- The commission shall convene a
- 2 separate recognition advisory committee for each petition
- 3 requesting recognition.
- 4 (b) Role and responsibilities of committee. -- The committee
- 5 has the following powers and duties:
- 6 (1) Review the petition for recognition to determine if
- 7 any additional information is needed from the applicant
- 8 before determination of the petition can be finalized.
- 9 (2) Make recommendations for or against recognition.
- 10 (c) Role of Native American commissioner. -- A Native American
- 11 commissioner on the commission has the following duties with
- 12 respect to the committee:
- 13 (1) To serve as the chairperson of the committee.
- 14 (2) To call all meetings for petition reviews to order.
- 15 (3) To be a nonvoting delegate of the committee.
- 16 (4) To transmit all recommendations of the committee to
- 17 the commission.
- 18 (d) Composition of committee. -- The committee shall consist
- 19 of five voting delegates appointed by the commission in
- 20 accordance with the following:
- 21 (1) Two Native Americans from different Federal or State
- recognized groups, other than the petitioning group.
- 23 (2) One individual with demonstrated expertise in
- 24 genealogy and, if possible, in Native American genealogy. If
- possible, this delegate must be a Native American.
- 26 (3) Two individuals qualified in anthropology,
- 27 ethnohistory or related fields. If possible, these delegates
- 28 must be Native Americans.
- 29 (e) Conflict of interest. -- A delegate under subsection (d)
- 30 or the Native American Commissioner may not participate in any

- 1 deliberations with respect to a petition made by a petitioning
- 2 group of which the delegate or the commissioner is a member.
- 3 (f) Compensation. -- Delegates shall serve without salary or
- 4 compensation but shall be reimbursed for actual and necessary
- 5 expenses incurred while performing official functions required
- 6 by this act.
- 7 Section 12. Processing petitions.
- 8 (a) Acceptance by commission. -- The commission shall accept
- 9 for review all complete petitions. A petition may not be
- 10 considered complete until the commission has received payment of
- 11 required fees and all information requested in the petition form
- 12 or required by this act.
- 13 (b) Notice to group. -- After a petition is received, the
- 14 commission shall notify the petitioning group in writing:
- 15 (1) that the petition is complete; or
- 16 (2) that the petition is incomplete and the additional
- information required to complete the petition.
- 18 (c) Failure to complete petition. -- If the petitioning group
- 19 fails to complete the petition within one year after notice
- 20 under subsection (b) is mailed to the petitioning group that the
- 21 petition is not complete, the petition shall be deemed withdrawn
- 22 and the commission shall notify the petitioning group.
- 23 (d) Additional period to complete petition.--If the
- 24 petitioning group during the one-year period under subsection
- 25 (c) requires additional time to complete the petition and
- 26 provides reasonable justification, the commission may grant one
- 27 additional period of up to one year for the petitioning group to
- 28 complete the petition.
- 29 (e) Referral of petition to committee.--After the commission
- 30 determines the petition is complete, the commission shall refer

- 1 the petition to the committee.
- 2 (f) Preliminary review. -- Within 25 days after referral under
- 3 subsection (e), the committee shall review the documentation
- 4 submitted for the petition and may, through the commission,
- 5 request the petitioning group submit any specific additional
- 6 documentation necessary to determine whether a petitioning group
- 7 meets the recognition criteria specified in section 6.
- 8 (g) Completion of review. -- After the commission notifies the
- 9 petitioning group that all requested documentation has been
- 10 received, the committee shall complete review of the petition
- 11 and advise the commission whether the petitioning group meets
- 12 the recognition criteria specified in section 6. In advising the
- 13 commission whether a petition meets the recognition criteria
- 14 specified in section 6, the committee shall do all of the
- 15 following:
- 16 (1) Consider the petition, all factual or legal
- submissions in support of or in opposition to the petition
- and the petitioning group's written response.
- 19 (2) Use to the maximum extent practicable the
- 20 information and sources available to it, including
- 21 individuals not on the committee who have knowledge or
- 22 expertise with Federal or other state Indian tribe
- recognition procedures or an understanding of the history of
- Native Americans in this Commonwealth.
- 25 Section 13. Determination by commission.
- 26 (a) Review of committee recommendation.--The commission
- 27 shall review the committee's recommendation and determine
- 28 whether the petition meets the criteria specified in section 6.
- 29 (b) Recognition criteria established.--If the commission
- 30 determines that the petitioning group meets the criteria

- 1 specified in section 6, the commission shall submit to the
- 2 Governor a determination of findings and request that the
- 3 petitioning group be recognized.
- 4 (c) Inadequate information or documentation.--If the
- 5 commission determines that the information or documentation
- 6 submitted in support of the petition is not adequate to
- 7 establish that the petitioning group meets the criteria
- 8 specified in section 6, the commission shall notify the
- 9 petitioning group of its determination. The petitioning group
- 10 may request a reconsideration under section 14.
- 11 Section 14. Reconsideration of commission determination.
- 12 (a) Procedure for taking appeal. -- Upon receipt of a
- 13 determination that the criteria for recognition have not been
- 14 met, the petitioning group may appeal for a reconsideration by
- 15 the commission. The petitioning group must file a letter of
- 16 intent within 30 days of receipt of the commission's
- 17 determination and must submit additional documentation within 90
- 18 days.
- 19 (b) Appointment of review panel. -- After receiving a request
- 20 for review, the commission shall appoint a three-individual
- 21 panel to review the commission's determinations and all the
- 22 evidence submitted in support of or in opposition to the
- 23 petition. The panel shall include at least one commissioner and
- 24 one delegate, who together shall nominate the third individual
- 25 to the commission for appointment to the panel.
- 26 (c) Report of panel.--The panel shall report its findings
- 27 and recommendations to the commission within 60 days after
- 28 expiration of the 90-day appeal period. If the review panel
- 29 concludes that the commission failed to adequately consider any
- 30 evidence submitted and that the evidence, if adequately

- 1 considered, may reverse the commission's determination, the
- 2 appeal panel shall notify the commission to reconsider its
- 3 determination. Failure to act within the time specified in this
- 4 subsection shall be deemed a notification to reconsider.
- 5 (d) Action by commission. -- The commission may either:
- 6 (1) affirm its original determination and promptly
- 7 notify the petitioning group; or
- 8 (2) submit to the Governor its reconsidered
- 9 determination and recommendation for recognition.
- 10 (e) Notice to petitioning group. -- The commission shall
- 11 promptly notify the petitioning group of the commission's
- 12 recommendation and final determination. The commission's
- 13 determination under subsection (d) is subject to 2 Pa.C.S. Ch. 7
- 14 Subch. A (relating to judicial review of Commonwealth agency
- 15 action).
- 16 Section 15. Governor's action on recognition recommendation.
- 17 (a) Concurrence with request for recognition. -- If the
- 18 Governor concurs with a request for recognition by the
- 19 commission, the Governor may issue an executive order to
- 20 recognize the Pennsylvania Indian status of the petitioning
- 21 group. The commission shall promptly notify appropriate
- 22 governmental agencies and national and State Native American
- 23 organizations of the executive order.
- 24 (b) Nonconcurrence with request for recognition. -- If the
- 25 Governor does not concur with a request for formal recognition
- 26 by the commission, the Governor shall notify the commission of
- 27 the reasons and the commission shall promptly notify the
- 28 petitioning group.
- 29 Section 16. Effects of recognition.
- 30 An executive order issued by the Governor under section 15

- 1 shall not do any of the following:
- 2 (1) Create rights to land.
- 3 (2) Create rights or entitlements.
- 4 (3) Impair valid or existing rights, benefits or
- 5 entitlements of any Native Americans residing in this
- 6 Commonwealth.
- 7 (4) Impair existing judicial rulings of the Commonwealth
- 8 regarding Native Americans indigenous to Pennsylvania.
- 9 Section 17. Fees.
- 10 (a) Establishment. -- Fees required under this act shall be
- 11 set by the commission and the commission shall transmit notice
- 12 of the fees to the Legislative Reference Bureau for publication
- 13 in the next available issue of the Pennsylvania Bulletin. Fees
- 14 shall be set by the commission in order to offset costs
- 15 necessary to administer the provisions of this act and shall be
- 16 nonrefundable.
- 17 (b) Time for payment. -- Payment of fees as set by the
- 18 commission must be received at the time of filing the petition
- 19 for recognition, certification or recertification.
- 20 (c) Waiver of fee. -- The commission may upon request of a
- 21 petitioning group waive the petition fee, in full or in part, if
- 22 the commission determines that payment of the fee will create
- 23 financial hardship for the petitioning group.
- 24 Section 18. Penalty.
- In any matter relating to a petition under this act, a person
- 26 commits a misdemeanor of the third degree if the person:
- 27 (1) Knowingly and intentionally falsifies or conceals a
- 28 material fact.
- 29 (2) Makes a false, fictitious or fraudulent statement or
- 30 representation.

- 1 (3) Makes or uses a writing or document with knowledge
- 2 that the writing or document contains false, fictitious or
- 3 fraudulent statements or entries.
- 4 Section 19. Effective date.
- 5 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
