## AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An
- act relating to the public school system, including certain
- provisions applicable as well to private and parochial
- schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the
- laws relating thereto," in terms and courses of study,
- providing for child opioid awareness education.
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- 10 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a
- 11 section to read:
- 12 <u>Section 1528. Child Opioid Awareness Education.--(a)</u>
- 13 Beginning with the 2018-2019 school year, each school entity
- 14 shall:
- 15 (1) Develop an age-appropriate child opioid awareness and
- 16 <u>education program and incorporate the program into the school</u>
- 17 entity's existing curriculum for students in grades six through
- 18 twelve. In developing the program, the school entity may use the
- 19 model curriculum developed by the department under subsection

- 1 (b) (1).
- 2 (2) Include training in child opioid awareness in the
- 3 professional development plan submitted by the school entity to
- 4 the secretary for approval under section 1205.1. A school entity
- 5 shall provide four (4) hours of training every five (5) years
- 6 for professional educators assigned to teach courses into which
- 7 <u>child opioid awareness education has been incorporated under</u>
- 8 paragraph (1). Training under this paragraph may be used to
- 9 satisfy a professional educator's continuing professional
- 10 education requirement under section 1205.2. A school entity may
- 11 use the materials made available by the department under
- 12 subsection (b) (2) to conduct the training.
- 13 (b) The department, in consultation with the Department of
- 14 <u>Health, the Department of Drug and Alcohol Programs and at least</u>
- 15 <u>one organization addressing child opioid awareness and</u>
- 16 education, shall do all of the following:
- 17 (1) Develop a model child opioid awareness and education
- 18 curriculum, which may include materials already publicly
- 19 <u>available</u>, and make the curriculum available to all school
- 20 entities and, upon request, to nonpublic schools.
- 21 (2) Compile, develop and post on its publicly accessible
- 22 Internet website recommended quidelines and educational
- 23 materials for the training provided for under subsection (a)(2).
- 24 Materials that are already publicly available may be used.
- 25 (c) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
- 26 shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless
- 27 <u>the context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 28 "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 29 <u>Commonwealth.</u>
- 30 "Nonpublic school." A nonprofit school:

- 1 (1) in which a resident of this Commonwealth may legally
- 2 fulfill the compulsory school attendance requirements of this
- 3 act; and
- 4 (2) which meets the requirements of Title VI of the Civil
- 5 Rights Act of 1964 (Public Law 88-352, 42 U.S.C. § 2000d et
- 6 <u>seq.).</u>
- 7 The term does not include a school entity.
- 8 "Professional educator." As defined in section 1205.2(o).
- 9 <u>"School entity." A school district, joint school district,</u>
- 10 charter school, regional charter school, cyber charter school,
- 11 <u>intermediate unit or area vocational-technical school.</u>
- 12 <u>"Secretary." The Secretary of Education of the Commonwealth.</u>
- 13 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
