AN ACT

1 Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled
2 "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the
3 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the
4 Executive Department thereof and the administrative
5 departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof,
6 including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or
7 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or
8 authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative
9 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and
10 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative
11 officers, and of the several administrative departments,
12 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the
13 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive
14 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of
15 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and
16 other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards,
17 and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the
18 number and compensation of the deputies and all other
19 assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and
20 commissions shall be determined," in powers and duties of the
21 Department of General Services and its departmental
22 administrative and advisory boards and commissions, providing
23 for GPS tracking of State-owned vehicles.

24 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
25 hereby enacts as follows:

26 Section 1. The act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known
27 as The Administrative Code of 1929, is amended by adding a
28 section to read:

1 Section 2407.2. GPS Tracking of State-Owned Vehicles.--(a)
2 The Department of General Services shall install GPS tracking
3 devices in State-owned vehicles.

4 (b) The Department of General Services shall provide notice
5 of the following to each employe who uses a State-owned vehicle:

6 (1) The information monitored by the GPS tracking device.

7 (2) The purpose of the monitoring.

8 (3) The extent to which information obtained from monitoring
9 may be disclosed.

10 (c) The following words and phrases when used in this
11 section shall have, unless the context clearly indicates
12 otherwise, the meanings given to them in this section:

13 "GPS." A global positioning system operated by the United
14 States Department of Defense which provides specially coded
15 satellite signals that can be processed by a receiver to compute
16 location.

17 "GPS tracking device." A device which enables a vehicle to
18 be monitored through use of GPS and related technology and which
19 is designed to actively and continuously monitor, identify and
20 report vehicle data, including vehicle location, speed,
21 direction of travel, ignition status, braking, idle times and
22 maintenance alerts.

23 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
