AN ACT

- Providing for a program to address the illicit manufacture of methamphetamines in underground laboratories.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Short title.
- 6 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Meth Watch
- 7 Program Act.
- 8 Section 2. Definitions.
- 9 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 10 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 11 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 12 "Precursor substance." Any product containing ephedrine,
- 13 pseudoephedrine or phenylpropanolamine or its salts or optical
- 14 isomers or salts of optical isomers as an active ingredient.
- 15 "Program." The Meth Watch Program established under section
- 16 3.
- 17 Section 3. Establishment.

- 1 The Office of Attorney General shall establish the Meth Watch
- 2 Program to address the proliferation of the illicit manufacture
- 3 of methamphetamine in small underground laboratories using over-
- 4 the-counter cold medications and other products.
- 5 Section 4. Meth Watch Program.
- 6 The program shall include the following components:
- 7 (1) Development of strategies to curtail the theft and
- 8 suspicious sales of precursor substances and other household
- 9 commodities used in the illicit manufacturing of
- 10 methamphetamines.
- 11 (2) Promotion of cooperation between retailers, their
- employees and law enforcement agencies to address the
- diversion of legitimate products to manufacture
- methamphetamines.
- 15 (3) Establishment of a voluntary public-private
- 16 partnership that allows retailers to contribute to the
- funding of the program and to provide consultation with the
- 18 Office of Attorney General to develop the program.
- 19 (4) Increase in awareness by pharmacists, retailers and
- their employees of methamphetamine production and the manner
- in which certain substances are diverted from legal products
- into methamphetamines.
- 23 Section 5. Participation by retailers.
- 24 Participation in the program by retailers and pharmacies
- 25 shall be voluntary.
- 26 Section 6. Powers and duties.
- 27 The Office of Attorney General shall have the following
- 28 powers and duties:
- 29 (1) To produce printed materials to be used by the
- 30 following:

- 1 (i) Pharmacists and retailers for the education of 2 employees about the use of precursor products to 3 manufacture methamphetamines.
- 4 (ii) Potential purchasers to inform them of the 5 penalties and dangers of the manufacture of 6 methamphetamines.
- 7 (iii) The general public to increase public 8 awareness of methamphetamine and its impact on 9 communities.
- 11 retailers, pharmaceutical manufacturers or other entities or

To utilize funds contributed by pharmacies,

- 12 funds appropriated by the Federal Government or the General
- 13 Assembly to develop and implement the program.
- 14 Section 7. Expiration.

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- The provisions of this act shall expire December 31, 2008.
- 16 Section 8. Effective date.
- 17 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
