## AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the
- 2 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, making revisions to the
- 3 provisions regarding the Pennsylvania sentencing guidelines.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 2155 of Title 42 of the Pennsylvania
- 7 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
- 8 § 2155. Publication of guidelines for sentencing.
- 9 (a) General rule. -- The commission shall:
- 10 (1) Prior to adoption, publish in the Pennsylvania
- 11 Bulletin all proposed [initial and subsequent] sentencing
- 12 guidelines and hold public hearings not earlier than 30 days
- 13 and not later than 60 days thereafter to afford an
- opportunity for the following persons and organizations to
- 15 testify:
- 16 (i) Pennsylvania District Attorneys Association.

- 1 (ii) Chiefs of Police Associations.
- 2 (iii) Fraternal Order of Police.
- 3 (iv) Public Defenders Organization.
- 4 (v) Law school faculty members.
- 5 (vi) State Board of Probation and Parole.
- 6 (vii) Bureau of Correction.
- 7 (viii) Pennsylvania Bar Association.
- 8 (ix) Pennsylvania Wardens Association.
- 9 (x) Pennsylvania Association on Probation, Parole 10 and Corrections.
- 11 (xi) Pennsylvania Conference of State Trial Judges.
- 12 (xii) Any other interested person or organization.
- 13 (2) Publish in the Pennsylvania Bulletin [all initial and subsequent] sentencing guidelines as adopted by the
- 15 commission.
- 16 [(3) Adopt and publish in the Pennsylvania Bulletin
- 17 pursuant to subsection (a)(2) the initial sentencing
- guidelines within 21 months of the first meeting of the
- 19 Pennsylvania Commission on Sentencing.]
- 20 (b) Rejection by General Assembly. -- [The] Subject to
- 21 <u>qubernatorial review pursuant to section 9 of Article III of the</u>
- 22 Constitution of Pennsylvania, the General Assembly may by
- 23 concurrent resolution reject in their entirety any [initial or
- 24 subsequent] guidelines adopted by the commission within 90 days
- 25 of their publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin pursuant to
- 26 subsection (a)(2).
- 27 (c) Effective date.--[Initial and any subsequent] Sentencing
- 28 guidelines adopted by the commission shall become effective
- 29 [180] 90 days after publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin
- 30 pursuant to subsection (a)(2) unless [rejected in their entirety

- 1 by the General Assembly by a concurrent resolution within 90
- 2 days of their publication] <u>disapproved pursuant to subsection</u>
- 3 (b). If not [rejected by the General Assembly] disapproved, the
- 4 commissioners shall conduct training and orientation for trial
- 5 court judges prior to the effective date of the guidelines.
- 6 Section 2. Any sentencing guidelines adopted by the
- 7 Pennsylvania Commission on Sentencing and disapproved by the
- 8 General Assembly prior to the effective date of this act shall
- 9 be deemed null and void upon the adoption of sentencing
- 10 guidelines subsequent to the effective date of this act and
- 11 pursuant to this section of this act. Notwithstanding the
- 12 requirements set forth in 42 Pa.C.S. § 2155 (relating to
- 13 publication of guidelines for sentencing), said guidelines shall
- 14 be adopted by the commission and published in the Pennsylvania
- 15 Bulletin within 20 days of the effective date of this act. The
- 16 General Assembly shall take any action permitted pursuant to 42
- 17 Pa.C.S. § 2155(b) within 30 days from the date that the
- 18 guidelines are published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin, and said
- 19 quidelines shall become effective 30 days after publication in
- 20 the Pennsylvania Bulletin unless disapproved pursuant to 42
- 21 Pa.C.S. § 2155(b). The guidelines shall apply to all offenses
- 22 committed on or after the effective date of the adopted
- 23 quidelines.
- 24 SECTION 2. ANY SENTENCING GUIDELINES ADOPTED BY THE
- 25 PENNSYLVANIA COMMISSION ON SENTENCING AND DISAPPROVED BY THE
- 26 GENERAL ASSEMBLY PRIOR TO THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ACT SHALL

- 27 BE DEEMED NULL AND VOID UPON THE ADOPTION OF SENTENCING
- 28 GUIDELINES SUBSEQUENT TO THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ACT AND
- 29 PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION. NOTWITHSTANDING THE REQUIREMENTS SET
- 30 FORTH IN 42 PA.C.S. § 2155 (RELATING TO PUBLICATION OF

- 1 GUIDELINES FOR SENTENCING), THOSE GUIDELINES PUBLISHED IN THE
- 2 PENNSYLVANIA BULLETIN ON DECEMBER 5, 1987, AND ADOPTED BY THE
- 3 COMMISSION ON FEBRUARY 22, 1988, SHALL BE SUBMITTED TO THE
- 4 STANDING COMMITTEE OF EACH HOUSE OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY WHICH
- 5 HAS BEEN DESIGNATED TO PERFORM THE RESPONSIBILITIES ESTABLISHED
- 6 PURSUANT TO THE ACT OF JUNE 25, 1982 (P.L.633, NO.181), KNOWN AS
- 7 THE REGULATORY REVIEW ACT, RELEVANT TO THE COMMISSION WITHIN
- 8 FIVE DAYS OF THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ACT; AND THE GENERAL
- 9 ASSEMBLY MAY, BY CONCURRENT RESOLUTION, REJECT IN THEIR ENTIRETY
- 10 SAID GUIDELINES WITHIN 30 DAYS FROM THE DATE THAT SAID
- 11 GUIDELINES ARE SUBMITTED TO THE DESIGNATED STANDING COMMITTEE OF
- 12 EACH HOUSE OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, AND SAID GUIDELINES SHALL
- 13 BECOME EFFECTIVE 30 DAYS AFTER SUCH SUBMITTAL UNLESS DISAPPROVED
- 14 PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION. THE GUIDELINES SHALL APPLY TO ALL
- 15 OFFENSES COMMITTED ON OR AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE ADOPTED
- 16 GUIDELINES.
- 17 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
