## AN ACT

1 2 3	Amending Title 27 (Environmental Resources) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in environmental protection, providing for polystyrene food container prohibition.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Title 27 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
7	Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read:

19	<u>§ 4301. Purpose.</u>

1	The intent of this chapter is to reduce the adverse		
2	environmental impact of polystyrene food containers by		
3	prohibiting a food establishment from dispensing prepared food		
4	to a customer in a polystyrene food service container.		
5	<u>§ 4302. Definitions.</u>		
6	The following words and phrases when used in this chapter		
7	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the		
8	context clearly indicates otherwise:		
9	"Department." The Department of Environmental Protection of		
10	the Commonwealth.		
11	"Food establishment." All sales outlets, stores, shops or		
12	other places of business located within this Commonwealth which		
13	operate primarily to sell or convey food directly to the		
14	ultimate consumer, which food is predominately contained,		
15	wrapped or held in or on packaging. The term shall include, but		
16	not be limited to, any place where food is prepared, mixed,		
17	cooked, baked, smoked, preserved, bottled, packaged, handled,		
18	stored, manufactured and sold or offered for sale, including,		
19	but not limited to, any fixed or mobile restaurant, drive-in,		
20	coffee shop, cafeteria, short order cafe, delicatessen,		
21	luncheonette, grill, sandwich shop, soda fountain, tavern, bar,		
22	cocktail lounge, nightclub, roadside stand, prepared food take-		
23	out place, industrial feeding establishment, catering kitchen,		
24	commissary, grocery store, public food market, food stand or		
25	similar place in which food or drink is prepared for sale or for		
26	service on the premises or elsewhere, and any other		
27	establishment or operation, including homes, where food is		
28	processed, prepared, stored, served or provided for the public		
29	for charge.		
30	"Polystyrene food service container." As follows:		
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1	(1) A single-use polystyrene foam food service container
2	such as a cup, bowl, plate and clamshell-style container in
3	addition to a foam cooler that is not encased in another
4	material.
5	(2) A single-use polystyrene solid plastic food
6	<u>container such as a cup, bowl, plate, clamshell-style</u>
7	container, cutlery, straw and cup lid.
8	"Prepared food." Food or beverage prepared for public
9	consumption by a food establishment using any cooking or food
10	preparation technique. The term does not include raw or uncooked
11	meat, fish or eggs, provided for public consumption without
12	further food preparation.
13	"Retailer." A person that purchases or receives products
14	from any source for the purpose of sale to a consumer.
15	§ 4303. Prohibition.
16	(a) Food establishmentA food establishment is prohibited
17	from the following:
18	(1) Dispensing prepared food in or on a polystyrene food
19	service container.
20	(2) Selling, giving or providing eating utensils or
21	straws composed of polystyrene.
22	(b) RetailerA retailer is prohibited from selling, giving
23	or providing a polystyrene food service container except for the
24	following:
25	(1) Meat trays.
26	(2) Egg cartons.
27	(3) Packing materials.
28	<u>§ 4304. Complaints.</u>
29	The department shall prescribe a procedure for a person to
30	file a complaint with the department for a violation of this
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1 <u>chapter.</u>

2	<u>§ 4305. Compliance.</u>	
3	The department shall develop and maintain a publicly	
4	accessible Internet website with all of the following:	
5	(1) A description of the information necessary to comply	
6	with the prohibition under section 4303 (relating to	
7	prohibition).	
8	(2) A description of the procedure to file a complaint	
9	with the department for a violation of the prohibition under	
10	section 4304 (relating to complaints).	
11	<u>§ 4306. Regulations.</u>	
12	The department may promulgate rules and regulations necessary	
13	to implement the provisions of this chapter.	
14	<u>§ 4307. Penalties.</u>	
15	(a) ImpositionThe department may impose a civil penalty	
16	in the following amounts for a violation of this chapter:	
17	(1) For a first violation, \$500.	
18	(2) For a second violation, \$1,000.	
19	(3) For a third or subsequent violation, \$2,000.	
20	(b) PaymentAny civil penalty collected under subsection	
21	(a) shall be paid to the department.	
22	(c) Local lawThis chapter shall preempt any ordinance or	
23	resolution passed or adopted by any political subdivision that	
24	is effective on or before or after the effective date of this	
25	chapter to the extent that the ordinance or resolution conflicts	
26	or is inconsistent with the provisions of this chapter.	
27	<u>§ 4308. Applicability.</u>	
28	This act shall apply to transactions consummated after	
29	<u>December 31, 2018.</u>	
30	Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.	
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
