## AN ACT

- 1 Requiring the use of safety glazing materials in hazardous
- 2 locations in residential, commercial and public buildings,
- 3 imposing duties on the Department of Labor and Industry and
- 4 providing penalties.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Definitions.--As used in this act:
- 8 (1) "Safety glazing material" means any glazing material,
- 9 such as tempered glass, laminated glass, wire glass or rigid
- 10 plastic, which meets the requirements of USA Standard Z-97.1-
- 11 1966 or such requirements adopted by the State Department of
- 12 Labor and Industry, and which are so constructed, treated or
- 13 combined with other materials as to minimize the likelihood of
- 14 cutting and piercing injuries resulting from human contact with
- 15 the glazing material.
- 16 (2) "Hazardous locations" means those installations glazed
- 17 or to be glazed in residential, commercial and public buildings

- 1 known as sliding glass doors, framed or unframed glass doors,
- 2 doors or adjacent fixed glazed panels, which may cover or be
- 3 mistaken for means of ingress or egress, storm doors, shower
- 4 doors, or tub enclosures whether or not the glazing in such
- 5 doors, panels or enclosures are transparent.
- 6 (3) "Installer" includes those persons or concerns who
- 7 install glazing materials, or build structures containing
- 8 glazing materials, in hazardous locations: Provided, however,
- 9 That it shall not include any glazier who installs glazing
- 10 material on a job site as an employe of a contractor or
- 11 subcontractor responsible for the installation.
- 12 (4) "Manufacturer" means a person or company which
- 13 manufactures safety glazing material.
- 14 (5) "Fabricator" means a person or company which fabricates,
- 15 assembles, or glazes from component parts such structures or
- 16 products commonly known as sliding glass doors, entrance doors,
- 17 adjacent fixed glazed panels, storm doors, shower doors, bath
- 18 tub enclosures, panels to be fixed glazed, entrance doors, or
- 19 other structures to be glazed, to be used or installed in
- 20 hazardous locations.
- 21 Section 2. Labeling. -- Each light of safety glazing material
- 22 manufactured, distributed, imported, sold or installed within
- 23 the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania shall be permanently labeled in
- 24 accordance with the requirements of USA Standard Z-97.1-1966 or
- 25 by such additional methods as may be permitted by the
- 26 Pennsylvania Department of Labor and Industry. The label shall
- 27 be visible after glazing. The use of such labeling or
- 28 identification on other than safety glazing materials shall be a
- 29 violation of this act.
- 30 Section 3. Posting, Painting or Marking.--Transparent glass

- 1 or plastic doors in commercial or public places in buildings
- 2 open to the public, must in addition to use of safety glazing
- 3 materials, be posted, painted, or otherwise marked in such a
- 4 manner as to alert the public as to their presence in accordance
- 5 with standards, rules and regulations of the Pennsylvania
- 6 Department of Labor and Industry. Such posting, painting, or
- 7 marking shall also be required in those places previously glazed
- 8 with non-safety glazing materials, prior to the effective date
- 9 of this act.
- 10 Section 4. Unlawful Acts.--It shall be unlawful, for use in
- 11 the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, to knowingly sell, fabricate,
- 12 assemble, glaze, include in specifications, install or consent
- 13 to be installed any product commonly known as a sliding glass
- 14 door, entrance door, fixed glazed panel adjacent to an entrance
- 15 door which may be mistaken for means of ingress or egress, storm
- 16 door, shower door, tub enclosure or any other glazed structure
- 17 for use in any hazardous locations, where said product, glazing
- 18 material or glazed structure contains any glass or glazing
- 19 product other than safety glazing material.
- 20 Section 5. Penalty.--Whoever violates the provisions of this
- 21 act shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction
- 22 thereof, shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than five
- 23 hundred dollars (\$500) nor more than one thousand dollars
- 24 (\$1,000), or to undergo imprisonment for not less than one nor
- 25 more than two years, or both.
- 26 Section 6. Enforcement. -- The Pennsylvania Department of
- 27 Labor and Industry shall enforce those provisions of this act
- 28 which pertain to commercial and public buildings.
- Section 7. Repeal.--The act of December 6, 1965 (P.L.1028),
- 30 entitled "An act requiring that transparent glass doors in

- 1 commercial and public places in buildings open to the public be
- 2 provided with safety glazing materials or be posted, painted or
- 3 otherwise marked for the protection of the public; requiring
- 4 safety glass in certain cases; imposing powers and duties on the
- 5 Department of Labor and Industry to promulgate standards, rules
- 6 and regulations; and providing penalties, " is repealed
- 7 absolutely.
- 8 Section 8. Effective Date. -- This act shall take effect March
- 9 1, 1971, but shall not apply to any contract awarded pursuant to
- 10 an invitation for bids issued on or before the date it takes
- 11 effect.
