AN ACT

1 2 3	Authorizing the establishment of conservation commissions ENVIRONMENTAL ADVISORY COUNCILS by certain political subdivisions.	<— <—
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania	
5	hereby enacts as follows:	
6	Section 1. The governing body of any city, borough,	
7	township, or incorporated town, or group of two or more such	
8	political subdivisions, may by ordinance redesignate an existing	<
9	municipal park and/or recreation board as a Park, Recreation and	
10	Conservation Commission to exercise, in addition to powers	
11	already granted, the powers and authority granted in this act,	
12	or may establish an independent conservation commission for the	
13	promotion, conservation, protection and development of natural	
14	resources, including watershed resources, located within its or	
15	their territorial limits. The county conservation districts	

shall coordinate the activities of conservation commissions in 1 2 matters involving two or more conservation commissions within 3 the county ESTABLISH AN ENVIRONMENTAL ADVISORY COUNCIL TO ADVISE <-----4 OTHER LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED 5 TO, THE PLANNING COMMISSION, PARK AND RECREATION BOARDS AND ELECTED OFFICIALS, ON MATTERS DEALING WITH PROTECTION, 6 CONSERVATION, MANAGEMENT, PROMOTION AND USE OF NATURAL 7 RESOURCES, INCLUDING AIR, LAND AND WATER RESOURCES, LOCATED 8 9 WITHIN ITS OR THEIR TERRITORIAL LIMITS.

Section 2. A conservation commission AN ENVIRONMENTAL 10 <--11 ADVISORY COUNCIL shall be composed of no less than three nor more than seven residents of the political subdivision 12 13 establishing the commission COUNCIL, who shall be appointed and <-14 all vacancies filled by the governing body of the political 15 subdivision. Where two or more political subdivisions jointly 16 establish a conservation commission AN ENVIRONMENTAL ADVISORY <----COUNCIL the members shall be appointed in the same manner, by 17 18 each of the respective political subdivisions establishing the 19 commission COUNCIL, each constituent political subdivision to 20 have equal membership on the joint commission COUNCIL. Duly <-----21 appointed commission COUNCIL members shall serve for a term of <----22 three years except that initial appointments shall be so 23 staggered that the terms of approximately one-third of the 24 membership will SHALL expire each year, the terms of their <----25 successors to be of three years each. Members shall receive no 26 compensation for their services, but shall be reimbursed for the 27 expenses actually and necessarily incurred by them in the 28 performance of their duties. The appointing authority shall 29 designate the chairman of the commission COUNCIL except that in <---joint commissions COUNCILS the chairman will SHALL be elected by 30 <-----19730H0197B1957 - 2 -

the duly selected members. Whenever possible, one member shall
 also be a member of the municipal planning board.

3 If an existing park and/or recreation board is redesignated <-----4 as the Park, Recreation and Conservation Commission, the 5 membership may be increased to not more than eleven. Section 3. A conservation commission AN ENVIRONMENTAL 6 <-----7 ADVISORY COUNCIL organized under this act shall have power to develop IDENTIFY ENVIRONMENTAL PROBLEMS AND RECOMMEND plans and 8 programs TO THE APPROPRIATE AGENCIES for the promotion and 9 <-----10 conservation of the natural resources and for the protection and 11 improvement of the quality of the environment within its territorial limits; to conduct research into the use and MAKE 12 <----13 RECOMMENDATIONS AS TO THE possible use of the open land areas of <-----14 the political subdivision or political subdivisions within its <-----15 territorial limits; to coordinate the activities of unofficial <-----16 bodies organized for similar purposes; to advertise, prepare, 17 print and distribute books, maps, charts, plans and pamphlets as 18 necessary for its purposes; TO PROMOTE A COMMUNITY ENVIRONMENTAL <----19 PROGRAM; to keep an index of all open areas, publicly or 20 privately owned, including open marshlands, swamps and other <----21 wetlands and waters, BUT NOT LIMITED TO FLOOD-PRONE AREAS, <-----22 SWAMPS, AND OTHER UNIQUE NATURAL AREAS, for the purpose of 23 obtaining information on the proper use of such areas; and to 24 recommend from time to time to the planning commission or, if <-----25 none, to the chief executive officer or officers, or to the 26 governing body or bodies plans and programs for the 27 implementation of such purposes.

Subject to the approval of the governing body or bodies
within its territorial limits, a conservation commission may
acquire property, both real and personal, in the name of the
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political subdivision or political subdivisions, by gift, 1 2 purchase, grant, bequest, easement devise or lease for any of 3 its purposes and shall administer the same for such purposes 4 subject to the terms of the conveyance, gift or lease. ADVISE THE APPROPRIATE LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES, INCLUDING BUT NOT 5 6 LIMITED TO, THE PLANNING COMMISSION AND RECREATION AND PARK 7 BOARD OR, IF NONE, TO THE ELECTED GOVERNING BODY OR BODIES 8 WITHIN ITS TERRITORIAL LIMITS IN THE ACQUISITION OF PROPERTY, 9 BOTH REAL AND PERSONAL, BY GIFT, PURCHASE, GRANT, BEQUEST, 10 EASEMENT, DEVISE OR LEASE IN MATTERS DEALING WITH THE PURPOSES 11 OF THIS ACT.

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12 A conservation commission AN ENVIRONMENTAL ADVISORY COUNCIL 13 shall not exercise any powers or perform any duties which by law 14 are conferred or imposed upon a State agency.

15 Section 4. A conservation commission AN ENVIRONMENTAL 16 ADVISORY COUNCIL shall keep records of its meetings and 17 activities and shall make an annual report which shall be 18 printed in the annual municipal report or, if none, otherwise 19 made known and available.

20 Section 5. The governing body of any political subdivision establishing a conservation commission AN ENVIRONMENTAL ADVISORY 21 <-----22 COUNCIL may appropriate funds for the expenses incurred by the 23 conservation commission ENVIRONMENTAL ADVISORY COUNCIL. <---24 Appropriations may be expended for such administrative, 25 clerical, PRINTING and legal services as may from time to time <-----26 be required and as shall be within the limit of funds 27 appropriated to the conservation commission ENVIRONMENTAL <-28 ADVISORY COUNCIL. The whole or any part of any funds so 29 appropriated in any year may be placed in a conservation fund, 30 allowed to accumulate from year to year, or be expended in any 19730H0197B1957 - 4 -

1 year.

Section 6. Nothing in this act shall be construed to require 2 3 a political subdivision which has heretofore constituted a shade <-----4 tree commission or its counterpart to abolish such commission, 5 and any such commission heretofore established may continue to operate as originally established. TO ABOLISH ANY EXISTING 6 <-----COMMISSIONS WITH A RELATED RESPONSIBILITY OR TO PREVENT ITS 7 8 ESTABLISHMENT.

9 Section 7. The Secretary of the Department of Environmental <-----10 Resources, in cooperation with the Secretary of the Department 11 of Community Affairs, shall establish a program of assistance to conservation commissions with and through county conservation 12 13 districts in acquiring land and in planning for its protection, 14 management use and development. Such a program shall include, 15 but shall not be limited to educational services, exchange of 16 information, assignment of technical personnel for natural 17 resource planning assistance, and the coordination of State and 18 local conservation activities. THE STATE CONSERVATION COMMISSION <-----19 IN THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCES SHALL ESTABLISH A 20 PROGRAM OF ASSISTANCE TO ENVIRONMENTAL ADVISORY COUNCILS THAT MAY INCLUDE EDUCATIONAL SERVICES, EXCHANGE OF INFORMATION, 21 22 ASSIGNMENT OF TECHNICAL PERSONNEL FOR NATURAL RESOURCES PLANNING 23 ASSISTANCE, AND THE COORDINATION OF STATE AND LOCAL CONSERVATION 24 ACTIVITIES.

25 SECTION 8. THE SECRETARY OF COMMUNITY AFFAIRS SHALL
26 ESTABLISH A PROGRAM OF ASSISTANCE TO ENVIRONMENTAL ADVISORY
27 COUNCILS IN PLANNING FOR THE MANAGEMENT, USE AND DEVELOPMENT OF
28 OPEN SPACE AND RECREATION AREAS.

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29 Section 8. 9. This act shall take effect immediately.

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
