AN ACT

1 Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled  
2 "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the  
3 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the  
4 Executive Department thereof and the administrative  
5 departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof,  
6 including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or  
7 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or  
8 authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative  
9 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and  
10 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative  
11 officers, and of the several administrative departments,  
12 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the  
13 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive  
14 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of  
15 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and  
16 other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards,  
17 and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the  
18 number and compensation of the deputies and all other  
19 assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and  
20 commissions shall be determined," providing for the  
21 identification of certain State vehicles.

22 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania  
23 hereby enacts as follows:

24 Section 1. Section 515, act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177,  
25 No.175), known as "The Administrative Code of 1929," is amended

2 Section 515. Automobiles.--(a) All automobiles required for  
3 the proper conduct of the business of the several administrative  
4 departments, boards, and commissions, shall be purchased and  
5 maintained by or under the supervision of the Department of  
6 Property and Supplies, except that the Department of [Highways]  
7 Transportation may continue to maintain automobiles purchased  
8 for it by the Department of Property and Supplies as purchasing  
9 agency.

10 (b) All such automobiles shall display a decal of the State  
11 seal in a prominent place or places so that such automobile may  
12 be readily identified as an official State automobile. Any  
13 vehicle used primarily for undercover criminal investigation  
14 shall be exempt from the provisions of this subsection.
