AN ACT

Authorizing the Department of Property and Supplies to acquire, on behalf of the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission for use of the Valley Forge Park Commission, six tracts of land in Tredyffrin Township, Chester County, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and making an appropriation. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. The Department of Property and Supplies is hereby authorized to acquire, on behalf of the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission for use of the Valley Forge Park Commission, the following tracts of land in Tredyffrin Township, Chester County, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, described as follows:

Tract No. 1. Beginning at a spike forming the intersection of the northwesterly side of Pennsylvania Turnpike and the title line in the bed of Mill Road (33 feet wide) thence extending from said point of beginning north 29 degrees 21 minutes 40 seconds west along the title line through the bed of Mill Road 346.43 feet to a spike forming the intersection of the said
title line in the bed of Mill Road with the title line in the bed of Yellow Springs Road (33 feet wide); thence extending north 69 degrees 24 minutes 30 seconds east along the title line through the bed of Yellow Springs Road 1,010.02 feet to a nail; thence extending south 29 degrees 33 minutes 30 seconds east partly crossing Yellow Springs Road 10.10 feet to another nail; thence extending north 68 degrees 56 minutes 30 seconds east along the title line through the bed of Yellow Springs Road 500.32 feet to a spike a corner of land now or late of Robert C. Ligget (trs); thence extending along the last mentioned land south 27 degrees 08 minutes 30 seconds east crossing a 16.51 feet wide right-of-way for Bell Telephone underground cable 632.58 feet to an iron pipe on the northwesterly side of Pennsylvania Turnpike aforesaid; thence extending south 80 degrees 12 minutes 10 seconds west along the said side of Pennsylvania Turnpike crossing the northeasterly side of Mill Road 1,558.85 feet to the first mentioned spike, the point of intersection and place of beginning. Containing 16.75354 acres, more or less, of land.

Tract No. 2. Beginning at a nail set at the point forming the intersection of the southeasterly side of Pennsylvania Turnpike and the title line in the bed of Mill Road (33 feet wide) said point being at the distance of 286.13 feet measured on a bearing of south 29 degrees 21 minutes 40 seconds east along the title line through the bed of Mill Road from a spike forming the intersection of the said title line in the bed of Mill Road and the northwesterly side of Pennsylvania Turnpike; thence extending from the said point of beginning along the southeasterly side of Pennsylvania Turnpike and along the northwesterly side of a 33 feet wide perpetual easement the
three following courses and distances: (1) north 59 degrees 20 minutes 40 seconds east crossing the northeasterly side of Mill Road 99.51 feet to a point of curve in the same; (2) northeastwardly on the arc of a circle curving to the right having a radius of 521.51 feet the arc distance of 189.85 feet to a point of tangent in the same; (3) north 80 degrees 12 minutes 10 seconds east $1,246.82$ feet to an existing iron pin in line of land now or late of Henry L. O'Neill; thence extending along the last mentioned land the two following courses and distances: (1) south 27 degrees 08 minutes 30 seconds east crossing the aforesaid 33 feet wide perpetual easement 272.89 feet to an old stone; (2) north 63 degrees 26 minutes 20 seconds east crossing a marble stone at the distance of 132.53 feet from the last mentioned old stone a total distance of 903.03 feet to an iron pin on the southeasterly side of Pennsylvania Turnpike; thence extending north 80 degrees 12 minutes 10 seconds east along the southeasterly side of Pennsylvania Turnpike 1,676.45 feet to an iron pin in line of land now or late of University of Pennsylvania (trs); thence extending along the last mentioned land south 29 degrees 37 minutes 40 seconds east 873.66 feet to an iron pin a corner of Tract "C"; thence extending along Tract "C" and along a hedge row the nine following courses and distances: (1) south 60 degrees 25 minutes 50 seconds west 1,172.05 feet to an iron pin; (2) south 47 degrees 12 minutes 30 seconds west 319.31 feet to an iron pin; (3) south 53 degrees 41 minutes 20 seconds west 141.85 feet to an iron pin; (4) south 09 degrees 01 minute west 153.69 feet to an iron pin; (5) south 42 degrees 04 minutes 40 seconds west 76.54 feet to an iron pin; (6) south 44 degrees 53 minutes 50 seconds west 71.29 feet to an iron pin; (7) south 60 degrees 39 minutes 30 seconds west 954.43
feet to an iron pin; (8) south 68 degrees 45 minutes 50 seconds west 323.93 feet to an iron pin; (9) south 44 degrees 20 minutes 40 seconds west recrossing the northeasterly side of Mill Road 834.28 feet to a point on the title line in the bed of Mill Road, aforesaid; thence extending north 29 degrees 21 minutes 40 seconds west recrossing the aforesaid easement $2,644.81$ feet to the first mentioned nail, the point of intersection and place of beginning. Containing 154.20948 acres, more or less, of land.

Tract No. 3. Beginning at a point on the title line in the bed of Mill Road (33 feet wide) at the distance of $2,930.93$ feet measured on a bearing of south 29 degrees 21 minutes 40 seconds east along the said title line in the bed of Mill Road from a spike forming the intersection of the said title line in the bed of Mill Road with the northwesterly side of Pennsylvania Turnpike; thence extending from said point of beginning along Tract "B" and along a hedge row the nine following courses and distances: (1) north 44 degrees 20 minutes 40 seconds east crossing the northeasterly side of Mill Road 834.28 feet to an iron pin; (2) north 68 degrees 45 minutes 50 seconds east 323.93 feet to an iron pin; (3) north 60 degrees 39 minutes 30 seconds east 954.43 feet to an iron pin; (4) north 44 degrees 53 minutes 50 seconds east 71.29 feet to an iron pin; (5) north 42 degrees 04 minutes 40 seconds east 76.54 feet to an iron pin; (6) north 09 degrees 01 minute east 153.69 feet to an iron pin; (7) north 53 degrees 41 minutes 20 seconds east 141.85 feet to an iron pin; (8) north 47 degrees 12 minutes 30 seconds east 319.31 feet to an iron pin; (9) north 60 degrees 25 minutes 50 seconds east 1,172.05 feet to an iron pin in line of land now or late of University of Pennsylvania (trs); thence extending along the last mentioned land the three following courses and distances:
(1) south 29 degrees 37 minutes 40 seconds east crossing a granite stone at the distance of 08 feet from the last mentioned iron pin and crossing Valley Creek 242.35 feet to a stone; north 61 degrees 01 minute 10 seconds east 181.34 feet to a stone; (3) south 29 degrees 28 minutes 20 seconds east 1,724.56 feet to a stone a corner of land now or late of William W. and Winifield Wilson; thence extending along the last mentioned land south 29 degrees 33 minutes east crossing the northwesterly side of Route \#202 ( 80 feet wide) $2,405.81$ feet to an iron pin on the title line in the bed of Route \#202, in line of land now or late of Pearson Holding Company; thence extending partly along land now or late of Pearson Holding Company, partly along land now or late of George Blair and partly along land now or late of Conques Aquialante, south 61 degrees 09 minutes west partly along the title line through the bed of Route \#202 and crossing the bed of Route \#202 and crossing the bed of Chester Valley Branch-Reading Railroad, 1,479.04 feet to a Railroad Monument on the southeasterly side of Chester Valley Branch-Reading Railroad; thence extending along the southeasterly side of Chester Valley Branch-Reading Railroad and along land now or late of T. W. Stuart and Company, the three following courses and distances: (1) south 72 degrees 29 minutes west 392.85 feet to a Railroad Monument; (2) south 70 degrees 38 minutes west 300.04 feet to a point; (3) south 70 degrees 37 minutes west 494.33 feet to an iron pin; thence extending still along the last mentioned land south 27 degrees 57 minutes east crossing an iron pin set on the northwesterly side of Route \#202, a distance of 207.87 feet to a point on the deed line in the bed of Route \#202; thence extending along the deed line through the bed of Route \#202, south 61 degrees 09 minutes west 367.07 feet to a
point in line of land now or late of Warner Company; thence extending along the last mentioned land the four following courses and distances: (1) north 43 degrees 21 minutes west crossing a monument on the northwesterly side of Route \#202 and crossing a monument on the southeasterly side of Chester Valley Branch-Reading Railroad, 326.78 feet to an iron pin on the center line of Chester Valley Branch-Reading Railroad; (2) south 70 degrees 37 minutes west along the center line of Chester Valley Branch-Reading Railroad 274.49 feet to an iron pin; (3) north 32 degrees 59 minutes west crossing the northwesterly side of Chester Valley Branch-Reading Railroad 772.83 feet to a monument; (4) south 65 degrees 07 minutes 40 seconds west recrossing the northeasterly side of Mill Road 1,140.63 feet to a spike on the title line in the bed of Mill Road aforesaid; thence extending north 30 degrees 50 minutes 10 seconds west along the title line through the bed of Mill Road 312.07 feet to a spike; thence extending along land now or late of $W$. Ellis and Emma H. Johnson, the five following courses and distances: (1) south 67 degrees 51 minutes west along a fence line and along the face of a building crossing the southwesterly side of Mill Road 813.21 feet to an iron pin; (2) north 38 degrees 17 minutes 50 seconds west 279 feet to an iron pin; (3) north 32 degrees 53 minutes west crossing a stream leading into Valley Creek 720.33 feet to an iron pin; (4) north 14 degrees 02 minutes 50 seconds west along a tree line 345.51 feet to an iron pin; (5) south 70 degrees 02 minutes 10 seconds west 600 feet to an iron pin in line of land now or late of Elizabeth Perot Braken and further in the same direction a distance of 279.28 feet to a corner; thence extending along the last mentioned land the three following courses and distances: (1) north 31 degrees 24
minutes 50 seconds west 452.02 feet to a corner; (2) north 60 degrees 20 minutes 50 seconds east, distance of 707.61 feet to an existing iron pin; thence extending partly along land now or late of Henry Lea Hudson and partly along land now or late of $J$. H. Luther; north in the same direction crossing an existing iron pin at the distance of $1,099.06$ feet from the last previously described iron pin (being a corner common to land now or late of Henry Lea Hudson and land now or late of J. H. Luther) total distance of $1,410.87$ feet further to an old stone; thence extending still along the land now or late of J. H. Luther, north 29 degrees 21 minutes 40 seconds west again recrossing Valley Creek and recrossing the southwesterly side of Mill Road partly along title line in the bed of Mill Road 326.04 feet to first mentioned point and place of beginning. Containing 443.07167 acres, more or less, of land.

Tract Nos. 1, 2 and 3 being the same premises conveyed to Greenview Associates by deed of Lillian Cohen dated October 31, 1969 and recorded in Chester County Deed Book "C", Vol. 39, Page 130.

Tract No. 4. Beginning at a point in Valley Forge Road a corner of land of the David Wilson estate and in line of land of Henry N. Woolman, thence leaving the Road by said Wilson's land crossing over a stone at the distance of 20 feet south 70 degrees 46 minutes 15 seconds west $1,847.95$ feet to a stone in line of land of Edward B. Cassatt Estate; thence by same north 18 degrees 55 minutes west $1,725.49$ feet to a stone south 71 degrees 21 minutes west 180.83 feet to a stone and still by said Cassatt Estate land crossing Valley Creek north 19 degrees 03 minutes west $1,601.53$ feet to a stone in line of land of Robert C. Liggett et ux; thence by same and land of the Estate of

Philander C. Knox north 73 degrees 42 minutes 30 seconds east 2,347.16 feet to the center line of Valley Forge Road passing over a stone 20 feet therefrom; thence partly by said center line and line of land of Philander C. Knox south 17 degrees 18 minutes east 509.7 feet to a stone corner of Henry N. Woolman, thence by same south 73 degrees 15 minutes west 326.7 feet to a spike in the floor of a bridge over Valley Creek in the bed of Valley Forge Road and thence crossing Valley Creek partly along the bed of Valley Forge partly by land of Henry N. Woolman and again along the bed of Valley Forge Road south 19 degrees 31 minutes east 2,713.2 feet to the place of beginning. Containing 148.196 acres, more or less, of land.

Being the same premises conveyed to the Trustees of the University of Pennsylvania by deed of Henry N. Woolman and Mary S. C. Woolman, dated October 11, 1939 and recorded in Chester County Deed Book "Z", Vol. 19, Page 174.

Tract No. 5. Beginning at a spike in the middle line of Centerville Road, a corner of Philander C. Knox Estate and in line of land now or late of $F$. G. Thomson thence extending along the middle line of said Centerville Road by lands now or late of F. G. Thomson, A. H. Lanser, and A. Clements, south 19 degrees 42 minutes 30 seconds east $2,438.64$ feet to a spike, a corner of land of William Roberts estate; thence by same leaving the road and passing over a stone 20 feet from said spike south 70 degrees, 38 minutes, 30 seconds west $2,980.20$ feet to a spike in the middle line of Valley Forge Road, passing over a stone 20 feet therefrom; thence extending along the bed of Valley forge Road by lands of David Wilson Estate and Henry N. Woolman, north 19 degrees 31 minutes west $2,672.79$ feet to a point a corner of other land of Henry N. Woolman, of which this was a part, thence
by same and land of the Philander C. Knox Estate north 71 degrees 25 minutes east 1,542.99 feet to an old stone, and thence still by land of the Philander C. Knox Estate north 79 degrees, 05 minutes east 1,444.18 feet, passing over a marble stone, to the place of beginning. Containing 177.95 acres, more or less, of land.

Being the same premises conveyed to the Trustees of the University of Pennsylvania by deed of Henry N. Woolman and Mary S. C. Woolman, his wife, dated October 11, 1939 and recorded in Chester County Deed Book "G", Vol. 20, Page 278.

Tract No. 6. Beginning at a heap of stones by the Mount Joy Road in the line of Joseph Walker's land; thence north 26 degrees, west by said road 100 perches to a white oak tree; marked, standing in the line of William Currie's land; thence south 64 degrees west, 177 perches by other land of the said John Havard to a post in line of Samuel Havard's land; thence by said line south 26 degrees, east, 100 perches to a post by the Providence Road; thence north 64 degrees, east, by said road 177 perches to a heap of stones, the place of beginning. Containing 110 acres, 100 square perches, more or less, of land.

Being the same premises conveyed to John A. Yohn and Mae W. Yohn, his wife, by deed of Ralph M. Hunt and Mary L. Hunt, his wife, dated January 19, 1945 and recorded in Chester County Deed Book "Z", Vol. 21, Page 163.

Section 2. The land shall not be acquired until its title has been approved by the Department of Justice.

Section 3. The sum of
