# HOUSE BILL No. 236 sem 1975 

INTRODUCED BY WHITTLESEY, SALVATORE AND RYAN, FEBRUARY 4, 1975

REFERRED TO COMMITTEE ON TRANSPORTATION, FEBRUARY 4, 1975

## AN ACT

Amending the act of April 29, 1959 (P.L.58, No.32), entitled "An act consolidating and revising the Vehicle Code, the Tractor Code, the Motor Vehicle Financial Responsibility Act and other acts relating to the ownership, possession and use of vehicles and tractors," further providing for the movement of traffic at intersections regulated by traffic signals.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
hereby enacts as follows:
Section 1. Subsection (b) of section 1028, act of April 29, 1959 (P.L.58, No.32), known as "The Vehicle Code," is amended to read:

Section 1028. Traffic Signal or Signs Interpretations.--

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(b) Whenever traffic at an intersection is alternately directed to stop and go, by the use of traffic signals, the colored lights shall indicate as follows, except as otherwise provided in this section:
(1) Green--Traffic facing the signal may proceed straight ahead, and make right or left turns, except where no such turns are permitted, when so indicated by official signs. Vehicular
traffic shall yield the right of way to pedestrians crossing or who have started to cross the roadway on the green signal and vehicles lawfully within a crosswalk or the intersection at the time such signal was exhibited.
(2) Yellow--When Shown Alone.--Traffic facing the signal shall stop before entering the nearest crosswalk at the intersection, but if such stop cannot be made in safety, a vehicle may be driven cautiously through the intersection.
(3) Red--Traffic facing the signal shall stop before entering the crosswalk on the near side of the intersection or if none, then before entering the intersection, and shall remain standing until a green indication is shown; however, the driver of a vehicle which is stopped as close as practicable at the entrance to the crosswalk on the near side of the intersection or, if none, then at the entrance of the intersection in obedience to a steady red signal may make a right turn, but shall yield the right-of-way to pedestrians and other traffic proceeding as directed by the signal at said intersection, except that municipal and State authorities may prohibit any such right turn against a steady red signal at any intersection, which prohibition shall be effective when a sign is erected at the intersection giving notice thereof. No movement or turns shall be lawful on red except as otherwise provided in this section.
(4) No "U" turns shall be made on a two-way street in a business or residence district, unless they shall be made back of the intersection on such signal, and at such times and places as may be indicated by official signs.

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Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
