## AN ACT

- Amending the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1225, No.316), entitled 2 "An act concerning game and other wild birds and wild animals; and amending, revising, consolidating, and changing 4 the law relating thereto, " adding the term "resident" and specifying the meaning of the term for the purpose of the 6 act. 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 9 Section 1. Section 101, act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1225, 10 No.316), known as "The Game Law," is amended by adding a 11 definition to read: 12 Section 101. Definitions. -- \* \* \* 13 The term "resident" as used throughout this act shall mean 14 permanently domiciled within this Commonwealth, the place where 15 one has his permanent home and to which he has the intention of returning whenever he is absent, the fixed place of abode which 16

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is permanent rather than transitory. The place where any person

has voluntarily fixed the habitation of himself or herself and

19 his or her family, not for a mere special or limited purpose,

- 1 but with the express intention of making a permanent home and to
- 2 remain there until such time as an event occurs to induce him or
- 3 her to adopt some other permanent home. The place where one is
- 4 <u>legally obligated by law as a resident of the Commonwealth, to</u>
- 5 pay any income tax, wage tax, occupation tax, per capita tax or
- 6 personal tax, State or local, which may be imposed. The burden
- 7 of proof that he or she is a resident of this Commonwealth as
- 8 herein defined for any purpose of this act shall be the
- 9 responsibility of the person asserting the same.

- 11 Section 2. Section 301 of the act is amended to read:
- 12 Section 301. Residents of State. -- For the purpose of this
- 13 article any person who has been a [bonafide] resident of this
- 14 Commonwealth as defined in section 101 for a period of not less
- 15 <u>than</u> sixty days preceding his application <u>for a hunter's</u>
- 16 license, and was born in the United States of America, or was
- 17 fully naturalized under the laws of the United States, or who is
- 18 a citizen of the United States of America and regularly enrolled
- 19 in the United States Army, the United States Navy, or the United
- 20 States Marine Corps and officially stationed within the
- 21 Commonwealth thirty or more days next preceding his application,
- 22 shall be entitled to the license herein referred to as the
- 23 resident hunter's license, upon the further fulfillment of the
- 24 requirements of this article.
- 25 Section 3. The first paragraph of section 302 of the act,
- 26 amended June 27, 1973 (No.36), is amended to read:
- 27 Section 302. Resident License Fees.--Each such resident as
- 28 [provided in the preceding section] defined in sections 101 and
- 29 <u>301</u>, upon application made, in writing, to an agent authorized
- 30 to issue such licenses within the Commonwealth, [the] and upon

- 1 presentation of proof by the applicant that he or she is a
- 2 citizen of the United States and a [bonafide] resident of this
- 3 Commonwealth [under the requirements of this article] as
- 4 previously defined in this act, and the establishment of his or
- 5 her identity to the satisfaction of the authority issuing the
- 6 license, or to the satisfaction of the justice of the peace,
- 7 magistrate, or notary public, or any agent designated to receive
- 8 applications for licenses, when taking such applications as
- 9 hereinafter authorized, by producing a bank book, letters, lodge
- 10 cards, police cards, a motor vehicle driver's license, or some
- 11 other positive means of identification, and, in the case of
- 12 naturalized foreign-born applicants, the production of such
- 13 applicant's naturalization papers, unless any such person has
- 14 been disqualified for a license in the manner hereinafter
- 15 specified, and the payment to said agent or the commission of
- 16 eight dollars and twenty-five cents (\$8.25) except as
- 17 hereinafter provided for certain minors and older persons, shall
- 18 be entitled to a resident hunter's license and a tag with the
- 19 number of the license thereon, which shall entitle the holder to
- 20 hunt or trap for all wild birds and wild animals which may
- 21 legally be hunted or trapped in this Commonwealth. Residents
- 22 with the above qualifications, who are between the ages of
- 23 twelve and sixteen inclusive or who are sixty-five years of age
- 24 or more at the time of application, shall be entitled to a
- 25 resident hunter's license and tag upon payment to said agent or
- 26 the commission of, in the case of persons sixty-five years of
- 27 age or more, five dollars and twenty-five cents (\$5.25) and, in
- 28 the case of persons between the ages of twelve and sixteen, five
- 29 dollars and twenty-five cents (\$5.25). The application for the
- 30 issuance of a license in such cases shall, in addition to the

- 1 other information required, give the date of birth of the
- 2 applicant.

- 4 Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.
