# HOUSE BILL No. 943 semen 1975 

INTRODUCED BY DOMBROWSKI, HOPKINS, KOLTER AND LAUDADIO, APRIL 8, 1975

REFERRED TO COMMITTEE ON LAW AND JUSTICE, APRIL 9, 1975

AN ACT

Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, authorizing the use in clubs of slot machines registered with the Department of Revenue and providing for their registration upon payment of an annual registration fee, such fees to be paid into the state Lottery Fund for the purpose of providing property tax relief for the elderly and local transit for the elderly.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 5513 of Title 18, act of November 25, 1970 (P.L.707, No.230), known as the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, added December 6, 1972 (P.L.1482, No.334), is amended by adding subsections to read: § 5513. Gambling devices, gambling, etc.

(c) Exception.--Subsections (a) and (b) shall not apply to slot machines which are registered in accordance with subsection (d) for use by clubs on premises occupied by such clubs.
(d) Registration of slot machines.--A slot machine may be registered with the Pennsylvania Department of Revenue upon
payment of an annual registration fee of $\$ 360$ the payment of which shall be evidenced by a registration stamp issued by the department and affixed to the slot machine. Registration shall be for a calendar year and fees for initial registration filed during a calendar year shall be reduced to an amount proportionate to the number of months remaining in the year. The department may adopt forms and procedures for application for registration and renewal thereof and for the issuance and affixing of registration stamps except that, in addition to other requirements of the department, the application for registration shall contain the name of the manufacturer and the name and address of the owner of the slot machine and the registration stamp shall contain the serial or other identification number of the slot machine and the registration expiration date. The fees collected by the Department of Revenue shall be paid into the State Lottery Fund shall be allocated for the purpose of providing property tax relief for the elderly pursuant to the provisions of the act of March 11, 1971 (P.L.104, No.3), known as the "Senior Citizen Property Tax Assistance Act," and for the purpose of providing local transit for the elderly pursuant to the act of January 22, 1968 (P.L.42, No.8), known as the "Pennsylvania Urban Mass Transportation Assistance Law of 1967."
(e) Definitions.--As used in subsections (c) and (d) the following words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection:
"Club." A nonprofit corporation, association, society, organization or other nonprofit group of individuals associated together for legitimate purposes of mutual benefits, entertainment, fellowship, pleasure, recreation or lawful
convenience having some primary interest and activity to which the use of slot machines shall be secondary and which regularly occupies, as owner or lessee, a clubhouse or quarters for the use of its members.
"Slot machine." Any machine, apparatus or device that is adapted, or may readily be converted into one that is adapted, for use in such a way that, as a result of the insertion of any piece of money or coin or other object, or by any other means, such machine or device is caused to operate or may be operated, and by reason of any element of hazard or chance or of other outcome of such operation unpredictable by him, the user may receive or become entitled to receive any piece of money, credit, allowance or thing of value or additional chance or right to use such slot machine or device, or any check, slug, token or memorandum, whether of value or otherwise, which may be exchanged for any money, credit, allowance or thing of value or which may be given in trade, irrespective of whether it may, apart from any element of hazard or chance or unpredictable outcome of such operation, also sell, deliver or present some merchandise, indication of weight, entertainment or other thing of value.

Section 2. All acts and parts of acts, general, local and special, are repealed in so far as they prohibit the use of slot machines in clubs when such slot machines are registered in accordance with the provisions of section 5515 of the "Crimes Code."

Section 3. This act shall take effect January 1, 1976.
