- 1 Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, providing for maximum sentences for
- 3 certain felons.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 1103 of Title 18, act of November 25,
- 7 1970 (P.L.707, No.230), known as the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 8 Statutes, added December 6, 1972 (P.L.1482, No.334), is amended
- 9 to read:
- 10 § 1103. Sentence of imprisonment for felony.
- 11 (a) General rule. -- A person who has been convicted of a
- 12 felony may be sentenced to imprisonment as follows:
- 13 (1) In the case of a felony of the first degree, for a
- 14 term which shall be fixed by the court at not more than 20
- 15 years.
- 16 (2) In the case of a felony of the second degree, for a
- term which shall be fixed by the court at not more than ten
- 18 years.
- 19 (3) In the case of a felony of the third degree, for a

- 1 term which shall be fixed by the court at not more than seven
- 2 years.
- 3 (b) Subsequent offenses.--Whoever, after having been
- 4 <u>convicted of a second or subsequent felony, within or without</u>
- 5 this Commonwealth, within five years after the prior offense
- 6 shall be sentenced to imprisonment for the maximum term as
- 7 provided for in subsection (a).
- 8 (c) Computation of time. -- In computing the period of time
- 9 between convictions, as provided in subsection (b), any period
- 10 of servitude by a person in a penal institution, within or
- 11 without this Commonwealth, shall not be included in the
- 12 <u>computation of any of said five-year periods. The five-year</u>
- 13 periods shall run only during the time any such person shall be
- 14 at liberty.
- 15 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
