In the House of Representatives, March 31, 1976 1 The enterprises of this Commonwealth consist largely of small 2 businesses and farms. We are in danger of losing these valuable 3 resources.

4 The number of independent small businesses in the United States has dropped thirty-three percent in less than thirty 5 years. Federal statistics indicate that the number of farms has б 7 declined by more than thirty percent in the last sixteen years. These losses fan the fires of inflation and increase the rate of 8 9 unemployment. Congressman H. John Heinz III has introduced a 10 bill in Congress known as the "Small Business Revitalization Act 11 of 1976" seeking to attack the problem by amending the Internal 12 Revenue Code to give farmers and small businessmen twenty-five 13 years to pay Federal estate taxes and to allow graduated 14 investment tax credits for income tax purposes. Such legislation 15 gives small businessmen and farmers the incentive to sell to small investors rather than to large corporations; therefore be 16 17 it

RESOLVED, That this House of Representatives urge the
