AN ACT

1 Amending the act of February 1, 1966 (1965 P.L.1656, No.581),
2 entitled "An act concerning boroughs, and revising, amending
3 and consolidating the law relating to boroughs," permitting
4 advertisement of the titles and summarizations in lieu of the
5 entire text of proposed ordinances.

6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
7 hereby enacts as follows:

8 Section 1. Clause (4) of section 1006, act of February 1,
9 1966 (1965 P.L.1656, No.581), known as "The Borough Code," is
10 amended to read:

11 Section 1006. Duties of Council.--It shall be the duty of
12 the borough council:

13 * * *

14 (4) Except where otherwise in this act provided, to publish
15 every proposed ordinance or resolution of a legislative
16 character once in one newspaper of general circulation in the
17 borough not more than sixty days nor less than seven days prior
18 to passage. Publication of any proposed ordinance shall include
19 either the full text thereof or the title and a brief summary
20 prepared by the borough solicitor setting forth all the
21 provisions in reasonable detail and a reference to a place
22 within the borough where copies of the proposed ordinance may be
23 examined. If the full text is not included a copy thereof shall
24 be supplied to a newspaper of general circulation in the borough
25 at the time the public notice is published. If the full text is
26 not included an attested copy thereof shall be filed in the
27 county law library or other county office designated by the
28 county commissioners who may impose a fee no greater than that
29 necessary to cover the actual costs of storing said ordinances.
30 In the event substantial amendments are made in the proposed

1 ordinance or resolution, before voting upon enactment, council
2 shall within ten days readvertise in one newspaper of general
3 circulation in the borough, a brief summary setting forth all
4 the provisions in reasonable detail together with a summary of
5 the amendments.

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
