## AN ACT

Amending the act of June 1, 1956 (P.L.1959, No.657), entitled, 2 as amended, "An act fixing the salaries and compensation of 3 the Chief Justice and judges of the Supreme Court, the President Judge and judges of the Superior Court, the judges of the courts of common pleas, the judges of the orphans' 5 courts, the judges of the County Court of Philadelphia and 7 the judges of the County Court and Juvenile Court of 8 Allegheny County, certain associate judges not learned in the 9 law, certain state officers, and the salary and expenses of 10 the members of the General Assembly, and repealing certain inconsistent acts," changing the authority of the commission 11 12 and provisions relating to establishment of salaries. FURTHER 13 PROVIDING FOR THE ADOPTION OF THE REPORTS OF THE COMMISSION.

- 14 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 15 hereby enacts as follows:
- 16 Section 1. Subsection (b) of section 14.2, act of June 1,
- 17 1956 (P.L.1959, No.657), entitled, as amended, "An act fixing
- 18 the salaries and compensation of the Chief Justice and judges of
- 19 the Supreme Court, the President Judge and judges of the
- 20 Superior Court, the judges of the courts of common pleas, the

- 1 judges of the orphans' courts, the judges of the County Court of
- 2 Philadelphia and the judges of the County Court and Juvenile
- 3 Court of Allegheny County, certain associate judges not learned
- 4 in the law, certain state officers, and the salary and expenses
- 5 of the members of the General Assembly, and repealing certain
- 6 inconsistent acts," added June 29, 1976 (No.111), is amended to
- 7 read:
- 8 Section 14.2. \* \* \*
- 9 (b) The commission shall make an exhaustive study of the
- 10 salaries, emoluments, mileage, per diem, travel and other
- 11 expense allowances and reimbursements of the Governor, the
- 12 Lieutenant Governor, the cabinet officers, the Auditor General
- 13 and the State Treasurer, the justices and judges of the Supreme
- 14 Court, the Superior Court, the Commonwealth Court, the courts of
- 15 common pleas, the Municipal Court of Philadelphia and the
- 16 Traffic Court of Philadelphia, and the officers and members of
- 17 the General Assembly. As soon as is practicable after the
- 18 effective date of this act for the initial report, and
- 19 thereafter for subsequent reports no later than 31 days before
- 20 the commencement of each term of the members of the General
- 21 Assembly, the commission shall submit to the Governor, the Chief
- 22 Justice, the President pro tempore of the Senate and the Speaker
- 23 of the House of Representatives its report [establishing]
- 24 <u>recommending</u> such salaries, emoluments, mileage, per diem,
- 25 travel and other expense allowances.
- 26 [The initial report shall take effect immediately, unless,
- 27 within 30 days following the date of submission thereof the
- 28 General Assembly shall, by concurrent resolution reject the
- 29 report, in whole or part, or enacts legislation as hereinafter
- 30 provided in this section. Reports submitted subsequent to the

- 1 initial report shall take effect and have the force and effect
- 2 of law at the beginning of the first pay period of the
- 3 subsequent term of the General Assembly or the date of
- 4 assumption of office of persons affected thereby after such
- 5 date, unless within 30 days following the date of submission
- 6 thereof, the General Assembly shall, by concurrent resolution,
- 7 reject the said report, in whole or in part, or unless within
- 8 said period the General Assembly shall enact legislation which
- 9 establishes a rate of pay or allowance differing from that
- 10 recommended by said report in whole or in part. That portion of
- 11 the report which is not inconsistent with the resolution or
- 12 legislation so adopted shall have the force and effect of law as
- 13 herein provided.]
- 14 The reports of the commission shall have only the effect of
- 15 recommending salaries, EMOLUMENTS, MILEAGE, PER DIEM, TRAVEL AND <

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- 16 OTHER EXPENSE ALLOWANCES to the General Assembly. The General
- 17 Assembly may accept or reject the report of the commission in
- 18 whole or in part as it deems necessary. In order for any
- 19 salaries to be changed it shall be necessary for the General
- 20 Assembly to establish such changes by concurrent resolution
- 21 <u>within 30 days following the date of submission of the report of</u>
- 22 the commission.
- 23 UPON RECEIPT, SUCH REPORTS SHALL BE PROPOSED TO EACH HOUSE OF <-
- 24 THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY AS A RESOLUTION OR RESOLUTIONS, SHALL BE
- 25 PLACED ON THE CALENDAR OF EACH HOUSE FOR THE NEXT LEGISLATIVE
- 26 DAY FOLLOWING THEIR RECEIPT, AND SHALL BE CONSIDERED BY EACH
- 27 HOUSE WITHIN 15 LEGISLATIVE DAYS BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.
- 28 SUCH RESOLUTIONS SHALL TAKE EFFECT IF THEY ARE APPROVED BY A
- 29 MAJORITY VOTE OF THE DULY ELECTED MEMBERS OF EACH HOUSE DURING
- 30 SUCH 15-DAY PERIOD, OR MAY BE DISAPPROVED BY EITHER HOUSE DURING

- 1 THAT PERIOD BY A MAJORITY VOTE OF THE DULY ELECTED MEMBERSHIP OF
- 2 <u>EACH HOUSE</u>.
- 3 SUCH RESOLUTIONS SHALL BE CALLED UP FOR A VOTE ON FINAL
- 4 PASSAGE AND A ROLL CALL VOTE SHALL BE TAKEN ON FINAL PASSAGE
- 5 <u>DURING SUCH 15-DAY PERIOD.</u>
- 6 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
