2	have the option of computing the instructional time on an hourly
3	basis, rather than a daily basis, of nine hundred (900) hours
4	for elementary and nine hundred ninety (990) hours for secondary
5	schools. No public or approved private kindergarten, elementary
6	or secondary school, vocational-technical school, or
7	intermediate unit program of instruction which was closed
8	because of the Weather Emergency and which makes a good faith
9	effort as determined by the Secretary of Education to keep open
10	for at least one hundred seventy-seven (177) days or the
11	optional hourly basis of instruction for pupils shall receive
