AN ACT

Amending the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1225, No.316), entitled 2 "An act concerning game and other wild birds and wild 3 animals; and amending, revising, consolidating, and changing the law relating thereto," further restricting the use of 5 spotlights, headlights or other artificial lights and 6 changing the penalty. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 9 Section 1. Subsection (b) of section 704, act of June 3, 10 1937 (P.L.1225, No.316), known as "The Game Law," amended June 7, 1968 (P.L.148, No.83) and March 1, 1974 (P.L.87, No.22), is 11 12 amended to read: Section 704. Unlawful Methods of Hunting .-- * * * 13 14 (b) Unlawful Manner of Hunting Big Game 15 Except as otherwise provided in this act it is unlawful to kill, or attempt to kill, any big game except through the use of 16 17 a gun propelling one all-lead or lead alloy or soft-nosed or expanding bullet or ball, other than one fired from a .25 18 calibre or less rim-fire cartridge, at a single discharge, or 19 20 through the use of a bow and arrow, or to take an elk in any

- 1 manner except through the method known as still hunting.
- 2 It is unlawful for any person, or one or more of a group of
- 3 persons together, to throw or cast the rays of a spotlight,
- 4 headlight, or other artificial light on any highway or in any
- 5 field, woodland, or forest between midnight and sunrise, unless
- 6 otherwise excepted, or at any time [upon any big game] while
- 7 having in his or their possession or under their control a
- 8 firearm or other <u>weapon or</u> implement whereby any big game could
- 9 be killed, even though such animal be not shot at, injured or
- 10 killed. The provisions of this paragraph shall not apply if it
- 11 shall be proven that the headlights of a motor vehicle operated
- 12 by the defendant or defendants, while traveling on a highway in
- 13 the usual way, cast a light upon such animal on or adjacent to
- 14 such highway, and there was no attempt or intent to locate such
- 15 animal.

- 17 Section 2. Clause (t) of section 731 of the act, added June
- 18 7, 1968 (P.L.148, No.83), is amended to read:
- 19 Section 731. Penalties. -- Any person violating any of the
- 20 provisions of the sections of this article shall, upon
- 21 conviction, be sentenced to pay the following fines and costs of
- 22 prosecution for each offense.

- 24 (t) Whoever in an attempt to locate any big game, casts the
- 25 rays of a spotlight, headlight, or other artificial light upon
- 26 any field, woodland, forest, building, barn or other
- 27 outbuilding, between the hours of midnight and sunrise or at any
- 28 time while having in his or their possession or under their
- 29 control a firearm or other weapon or implement whereby any big
- 30 game could be killed, shall be guilty of an unlawful act and

- upon conviction thereof in a summary proceeding shall be 1
- 2 sentenced to pay a fine of [ten dollars (\$10)] <u>twenty-five</u>
- 3 <u>dollars (\$25)</u>, or in default thereof, to undergo imprisonment
- for a period of five days. 4

- Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days. 6
