AN ACT

1 Amending Title 71 (State Government) of the Pennsylvania
2 Consolidated Statutes, denying retirement benefits to certain
3 persons convicted of certain crimes.

4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5 hereby enacts as follows:

6 Section 1. Title 71, act of November 25, 1970 (P.L.707,
7 No.230), known as the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, is
8 amended by adding a section to read:

9 § 5312. Denial of certain benefits.

10 Any member who is convicted of any felony or any crime
11 involving moral turpitude in connection with his official duties
12 as an officer or employee of the State shall not receive any
13 retirement benefits. Said member only shall be entitled to
14 receive his salary deductions together with any statutory
15 interest thereon.

16 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
