21	Section 1. Section 505.2, act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90,
22	No.21), known as the "Liquor Code," amended March 27, 1972
23	(P.L.153, NO.57), is amended to read:
24	Section 505.2. Limited WineriesHolders of a limited
25	winery license may:
26	(1) Produce wines only from fruits grown in Pennsylvania in

an amount not to exceed one hundred thousand (100,000) gallons
 per year.

3 (2) Sell wine produced by the limited winery on the licensed 4 premises, under such conditions and regulations as the board may 5 enforce, to the Liquor Control Board, to individuals and to 6 hotel, restaurant, club and public service liquor licensees.

7 (3) Package and sell wine in containers ranging in size up
8 to and including five (5) gallon capacity.

9 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
