AN ACT

1	Amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), entitled "An
2	act relating to alcoholic liquors, alcohol and malt and
3	brewed beverages; amending, revising, consolidating and
4	changing the laws relating thereto; regulating and
5	restricting the manufacture, purchase, sale, possession,
6	consumption, importation, transportation, furnishing, holding
7	in bond, holding in storage, traffic in and use of alcoholic
8	liquors, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages and the
9	persons engaged or employed therein; defining the powers and
10	duties of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board; providing
11	for the establishment and operation of State liquor stores,
12	for the payment of certain license fees to the respective
13	municipalities and townships, for the abatement of certain
14	nuisances and, in certain cases, for search and seizure
15	without warrant; prescribing penalties and forfeitures;
16	providing for local option, and repealing existing laws,"
17	permitting wine produced in Pennsylvania to be sold in
18	grocery stores.
19	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
20	hereby enacts as follows:
21	Section 1. The act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), known
22	as the "Liquor Code," is amended by adding a section to read:
23	<u>Section 207.1. Sale of Pennsylvania Wines(a) Any retail</u>
24	store may offer for sale wines produced in the Commonwealth and
25	may display and advertise the same without a license.
26	(b) For the purpose of subsection (a) a "retail store" shall

- 1 mean a store whose principal business is the sale of food at
- 2 retail for consumption off the premises, or a department store.
- 3 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
