AS REPORTED FROM COMMITTEE ON APPROPRIATIONS, HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, AS AMENDED, JUNE 7, 1977

## A SUPPLEMENT

- To the act of April 1, 1863 (P.L.213, No.227), entitled "An act to accept the grant of Public Lands, by the United States, to the several states, for the endowment of Agricultural Colleges," making appropriations for carrying the same into effect, providing for a basis for payments of such appropriations and providing a method of accounting for the funds appropriated.
- 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 9 hereby enacts as follows:
- 10 Section 1. In order to carry into effect the act of
- 11 Congress, approved July 2, 1862, granting public land to the
- 12 several states for educational purposes, and subsequent acts of
- 13 Congress related thereto, and the act of the General Assembly of
- 14 Pennsylvania accepting the provisions and conditions of said
- 15 acts of Congress and pledging the faith of the State to carry
- 16 the same into effect, the following sums or as much thereof as
- 17 may be necessary are hereby specifically appropriated to the
- 18 Trustees of the Pennsylvania State University for the fiscal
- 19 year July 1, 1977 to June 30, 1978, for the purposes and in the
- 20 amounts as shown:

12	Section 2. Payments to Pennsylvania State University on	
13	account of the appropriations for all items as provided in	
14	section 1 except for instruction - Doctor of Medicine shall be	
15	made on the basis of costs during the fiscal year.	
16	Payments for instruction - Doctor of Medicine shall be made	
17	on the basis of full-time students enrollment at the rate of	
18	\$7,465 per student.	
19	Section 3. If necessary, the Pennsylvania State University	
20	may transfer funds among the appropriations listed in section 1,	
21	clauses (1), (2), (3) and (4): Provided, That the aggregate	
22	amount transferred into or out of each appropriation during the	
23	fiscal year shall not exceed 5% of the amount specifically	
24	appropriated for that purpose.	
25	Section 4. Payments to the Pennsylvania State University of	
26	the appropriations herein provided shall be made monthly during	
27	the fiscal year.	
28	Such monthly payments shall be made in accordance with the	
29	provisions of sections 2 and 3, on the basis of estimated costs	
30	and full-time students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine	

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- 1 program. The estimate of costs shall be submitted by the
- 2 Pennsylvania State University to the Secretary of Education, the
- 3 General Assembly and to the State Treasurer not later than 30
- 4 days prior to the date on which such payment is to be made.
- 5 Section 5. The Pennsylvania State University shall apply the
- 6 moneys appropriated by this act only for such purposes as are
- 7 permitted in this act and shall at all times maintain proper
- 8 records showing the application of such moneys. Not later than
- 9 120 days after the close of the fiscal year to which this act
- 10 relates, the Pennsylvania State University shall file with the
- 11 Secretary of Education, the General Assembly, and with the
- 12 Auditor General of the Commonwealth, a statement setting forth
- 13 the amounts and purposes of all expenditures made from moneys
- 14 appropriated by this act and other university accounts during
- 15 said fiscal year, the number of full-time students enrolled in
- 16 the Doctor of Medicine program and costs, as provided in
- 17 sections 2 and 3, used as a basis for receipt of any
- 18 appropriation during said fiscal year.
- 19 Such statement of expenditures and number of full-time
- 20 students enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and costs
- 21 shall be reviewed by the Auditor General of the Commonwealth,
- 22 and he shall have the right, in respect to the moneys
- 23 appropriated by this act, to audit and disallow expenditures
- 24 made for purposes not permitted by this act and to cause such
- 25 sums to be recovered and paid by the Pennsylvania State
- 26 University to the Treasurer of the Commonwealth. The Auditor
- 27 General shall also make a determination of full-time students
- 28 enrolled in the Doctor of Medicine program and costs and make a
- 29 certification as to their correctness. In respect to
- 30 expenditures made by the university from moneys other than those

- 1 appropriated by this act, the Auditor General shall have the
- 2 right to review only and he shall file annually with the General
- 3 Assembly such information concerning such expenditures as the
- 4 General Assembly or any of its committees may require.
- 5 Section 6. A report shall be submitted to the Governor, the
- 6 Secretary of Education and the Appropriations and Education
- 7 Committees of the Senate and House of Representatives and shall
- 8 include data for all programs of the university except the
- 9 Doctor of Medicine program. The report, to be submitted prior to
- 10 October 1, 1977, shall cover the twelve-month period beginning
- 11 July 1, 1976 and ending June 30, 1977. The report shall
- 12 include:
- 13 (1) For each term during the period, the following counts
- 14 and distributions:
- 15 (i) The definitions and numbers of full-time faculty
- 16 members, of part-time faculty members, of full-time graduate
- 17 students, of part-time graduate students, of full-time
- 18 undergraduate students, and of part-time undergraduate students.
- 19 (ii) A distribution of part-time faculty members by the
- 20 percentage of full-time employment.
- 21 (iii) Definitions of course levels of instruction and the
- 22 number of different courses scheduled by course level,
- 23 distributed by the number of sections scheduled in each course
- 24 and the sections distributed by the number of students enrolled
- 25 in each section.
- 26 (iv) Number of terms scheduled and the dates thereof.
- 27 (2) For the twelve-month period, the following, distributed
- 28 by student level: lower division undergraduate, upper division
- 29 undergraduate, graduate, and first professional (excluding
- 30 Doctor of Medicine) within HEGIS discipline division (as defined

- 1 by "A Taxonomy of Instructional Programs in Higher Education,"
- 2 U. S. Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Office of
- 3 Education, 1970):
- 4 (i) The number of equivalent full-time students (EFTS)
- 5 taught.
- 6 (A) EFTS taught by HEGIS discipline will be determined from
- 7 production student credit hours (student credit hours produced
- 8 by an academic department, regardless of the student majors
- 9 taking the courses).
- 10 (B) EFTS taught by student level within HEGIS discipline
- 11 divisions will be determined by the level of the students taking
- 12 the courses, regardless of the course level of instruction of
- 13 the courses being taken.
- 14 (ii) Teaching salaries per equivalent full-time student.
- 15 (A) Teaching salaries will be distributed by student level
- 16 based on course credits taught, with equal weight given to all
- 17 course levels of instruction.
- 18 (B) In distributing teaching salaries, each thirty student
- 19 credit hours of thesis or dissertation work equals one three-
- 20 credit section.
- 21 (C) In distributing teaching salaries, all students engaged
- 22 in independent study who are assigned to one faculty member will
- 23 be considered one three-credit section.
- 24 (D) Teaching salaries will be distributed by student level
- 25 only for those individuals budgeted for instruction as reflected
- 26 in Part III, "Instruction and Departmental Research,"
- 27 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Budget Instructions for State-
- 28 Related Universities, Phase I, Fiscal Year 1978-1979.
- 29 (iii) Total costs per equivalent full-time student.
- 30 (A) Direct costs other than teaching salaries will be

- 1 allocated by student level within HEGIS discipline division
- 2 based on institutional records.
- 3 (B) Indirect costs of instruction will be prorated to each
- 4 student level within HEGIS discipline division as a percentage
- 5 of direct costs. An exception will be major organized activities
- 6 (e.g., university farm operations, dental clinics). These
- 7 activities will be allocated directly to the related HEGIS
- 8 discipline group.
- 9 (iv) Costs to the Commonwealth per equivalent full-time
- 10 student.
- 11 (A) Total costs will be offset by income for instruction to
- 12 determine costs to the Commonwealth.
- 13 (B) Income for instruction derived from student tuition will
- 14 be allocated by HEGIS discipline and by student level based on
- 15 the number of equivalent full-time students and the specific
- 16 tuition rates for that level.
- 17 (C) Income for instruction derived from other sources and
- 18 related to a specific HEGIS discipline group will be allocated
- 19 directly to that group.
- 20 (D) Income for instruction derived from other sources and
- 21 not related to a specific HEGIS discipline group will be
- 22 allocated as a percentage of student tuition income.
- 23 (v) Totals by student level for all HEGIS discipline
- 24 divisions combined for:
- 25 (A) The number of equivalent full-time students taught.
- 26 (B) Teaching salaries per equivalent full-time student.
- 27 (C) Total costs per equivalent full-time student.
- 28 (D) Costs to the Commonwealth per equivalent full-time
- 29 student.
- 30 These totals must agree with the corresponding totals in Part

- 1 III, "Instruction and Departmental Research," Commonwealth of
- 2 Pennsylvania Budget Instructions for State-Related Universities,
- 3 <u>Phase I, Fiscal year 1978-1979.</u>
- 4 (vi) All program data will be compiled from institutional
- 5 records. Program data are required for each HEGIS discipline in
- 6 which the institution offers instructional programs (excluding
- 7 Doctor of Medicine Program). Unless otherwise specifically
- 8 stated, the conventions and procedures will be the same as those
- 9 specified in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Budget
- 10 <u>Instructions for State-Related Universities, Phase I, Fiscal</u>
- 11 Year 1978-1979.
- 12 Section 7. In addition to the requirements of section 6, the
- 13 report covering the twelve-month period beginning July 1, 1976
- 14 and ending June 30, 1977, shall include for all programs of the
- 15 university, except the Doctor of Medicine program:
- 16 (1) Minimum number of credits required for a baccalaureate
- 17 degree, and for a master's degree.
- 18 (2) Number of associate degrees, baccalaureate degrees,
- 19 master's degrees, first-professional degrees, and doctoral
- 20 degrees awarded by HEGIS discipline divisions, for 1975-1976,
- 21 1976-1977 and projected for 1977-1978.
- 22 (3) A listing of the academic departments and instructional
- 23 subject matter in each of the HEGIS discipline divisions
- 24 included in the report specified in section 6.
- 25 Section 8. The university shall provide such information and
- 26 in such form and manner as the Department of Education may
- 27 prescribe.
- 28 Section 9. The Pennsylvania State University shall report
- 29 its revenues and expenditures and present its financial
- 30 statements required under the provisions of this act in

- 1 accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and
- 2 procedures for educational institutions as set forth in "Higher
- 3 Education Finance Manual" United States Department of Health,
- 4 Education and Welfare (1975) with the exceptions set forth in
- 5 the <u>Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Budget Instructions for State</u>
- 6 Related Universities, Phase I, Fiscal Year 1977-1978. Credits
- 7 granted for non-traditional programs such as CLEP, lifelong
- 8 learning etc., including all related costs and revenues thereof
- 9 shall be excluded from the function of "Instruction" and
- 10 included under "Public Service."
- 11 Section 10. This act shall take effect July 1, 1977.
