25	Section 1. Section 903, act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177,
26	No.175), known as "The Administrative Code of 1929," is amended

27 by adding a subsection to read:

Section 903. Litigation.--The Department of Justice shall
 have the power, and its duty shall be:

3 (a) To collect, by suit or otherwise, all debts, taxes, and
4 accounts, due the Commonwealth, which shall be placed with the
5 department for collection by any department, board or
6 commission. The department shall keep a proper docket or
7 dockets, duly indexed, in which it shall make and preserve
8 memoranda of all such claims, showing whether they are in
9 litigation and their nature and condition;

10 (b) To represent the Commonwealth, or any department, other 11 than the Department of the Auditor General, board, commission, 12 or officer thereof, in any litigation to which the Commonwealth 13 or such department, board, commission, or officer, may be a 14 party, or in which the Commonwealth or such department, board, 15 commission, or officer, is permitted or required by law to 16 intervene or interplead.

17 (c) Notwithstanding the provisions of this section or 18 section 709(f), the Commonwealth shall not pay or reimburse any present or former State official or employe for attorneys fees 19 20 or attendant expenses resulting from any criminal case after the 21 official or employe has been indicted by a grand jury or 22 proceeded against by information by a district attorney, 23 including such criminal cases arising from acts or omissions of 24 the present or former State official or employe while in the 25 service of the Commonwealth within the scope of his employment 26 or official duties, except as provided in 51 Pa. C.S. § 4107

28 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
